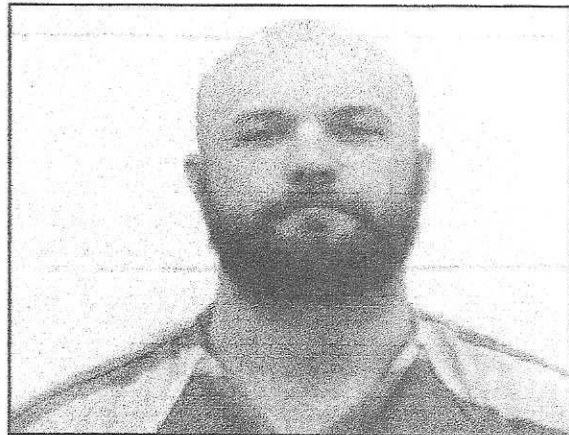

Arguing Couple Jumped by Roommate

DeShawn Whited Sentenced To 546 Months In Prison For Multiple Hobbs Act Robberies And Carjacking

DeShawn Whited, 26, of Knoxville, was sentenced to 546 months imprisonment by the Honorable Katherine A. Crytzer, United States District Court Judge for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Knoxville. Following his incarceration, he will be on five years of supervised release.

On January 18, 2023, Whited was found guilty of four

counts of Hobbs Act Robbery and one count of Attempted Hobbs Act Robbery, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1951, one count of carjacking, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2119, four counts of brandishing a firearm in furtherance of a crime of violence, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 924(c)(1) (A), and one count of felon in possession of a firearm, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 922(g)

(1). According to evidence present at trial, Whited, a previously convicted felon, committed a series of armed robberies and an armed carjacking in the Knoxville community in January 2021.

The evidence presented at trial demonstrated that in January of 2021, Whited, disguised in a hoodie and

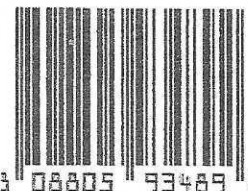

Margarita Ozuna, 63, Homeless Loudon, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, Tampering/Fabricating with Evidence, Simple Possession, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was in the area of Broadway near Pike Street in Lenoir City, TN. While in the area the officer observed a white in color KIA minivan which displayed an expired North Carolina temporary registration on the rear traveling west on Broadway Street. A traffic stop on the KIA was initiated in the

parking lot of the Lenoir City School's Central Office parking lot. Upon the traffic stop the officer made contact with the driver, front seat passenger, and rear seat passenger Margarita Ozuna. During the roadside investigation the three occupants inside of the vehicle appeared visually nervous. The officer had the driver of the vehicle step out to speak with him further about a citation, during that time the officer observed a canister of narcan in the driver's side door pocket. While conducting his business in regards to the traffic stop the officer requested a K9 unit from the Loudon Coun-

ty Sheriff's Office to respond to his location. K9 Deputy D. Harrison responded to my location within a reasonable amount of time and conducted an open-air sniff of the KIA with his K9 partner Draco.

Deputy D. Harrison advised that his K9 alerted to an odor of narcotics coming from the vehicle. A probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted. During the subsequent search of the vehicle a crystal-like substance which tested positive for methamphetamine using the Tru Narc

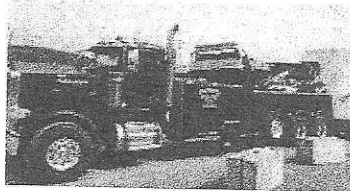
drug analyzer was located in a purse located in the back seat of the van where MARGARITA was sitting. MARGARITA was placed under arrest. Prior to placing MARGARITA under arrest, she attempted to pass her son, the passenger, a small bag containing brown/blue rock like substance believed to be fentanyl which fell to the ground of his feet.

The approximate weight of the brown/blue rock like substance including the bag was (0.38 grams)

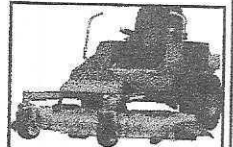
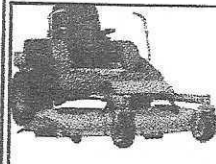

Amanda Roach, 20, Bon Street Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault x2, and Resisting Arrest.

Officers with LCPD, responded to Bon Street to investigate a harassment complaint. Upon arrival Officer Arden encountered the complainant/offender Amanda J. Roach who stated that her room mates victim 1 and 2 were arguing and preventing her from sleeping. Officer then spoke to victim 1 who explained that he and his Fiance victim 2 were having a disagreement in the bathroom when they heard Amanda screaming at them to shut up and stop talking about her. Victim 1 stated that he opened the bathroom door and observed Amanda sitting in the hallway floor. Victim 1 explained that as he shut the door, Amanda jumped up, rushed toward the door and kicked it hard

enough for the door to strike his head. Victim 1 explained that he became fearful for the safety of him and victim 2 and Amanda continued to kick the door breaking the wood near the knob. Officer Arden then spoke to victim 2 and she described the incident with little difference from victim 1 statement. Zackary Taylor, 29, Strange Road Lenoir City, was charged with False Report/Statement.

Cpl. Brandon Dishner LCSO, located a wrecked Dodge Ram pick up truck off of Highway 11. Deputy Watson, responded to assist Cpl. Dishner in his investigation. Upon arrival, Deputy observed a red Dodge Ram off of the roadway that did not have an occupant inside. 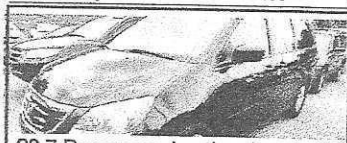

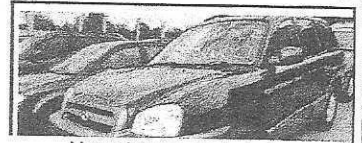

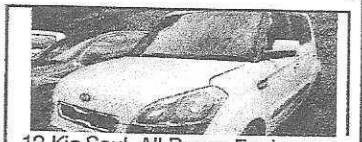

bandana, robbed at gunpoint employees of EZ Stop at 8605 Walbrook Drive, Waffle House at 6230 Papermill Drive, Pilot Food Mart at 410 Merchants Drive, Wendy's at 4407 Western Avenue, and Pilot Travel Center at 314 Lovell Road, all located in Knoxville. Whited also committed an armed carjacking near downtown Knoxville during the same timeframe. Victims from each of the incidents testified at the trial and the evidence included surveillance footage and cellphone location tracking information.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III, of the Eastern District of Tennessee, and Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Special Agent Joseph E. Carrico, made the announcement.

The investigation was led

by the FBI, Knoxville Division, the Knoxville Police Department, and the Knox County Sheriff's Office.

Assistant U.S. Attorneys Alan S. Kirk and Brent N. Jones represented the United States.

This case is part of Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN), a program bringing together all levels of law enforcement and the communities they serve to reduce violent crime and gun violence, and to make our neighborhoods safer for everyone. On May 26, 2021, the department launched a violent crime reduction strategy strengthening PSN based on these core principles: fostering trust and legitimacy in our communities, supporting community-based organizations that help prevent violence from occurring in the first place, setting focused and strategic

enforcement priorities, and measuring the results.

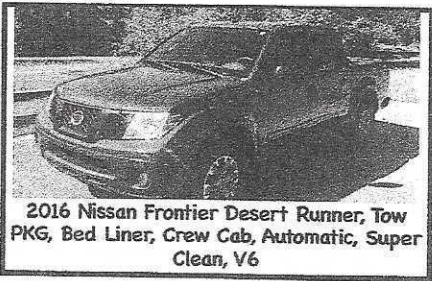
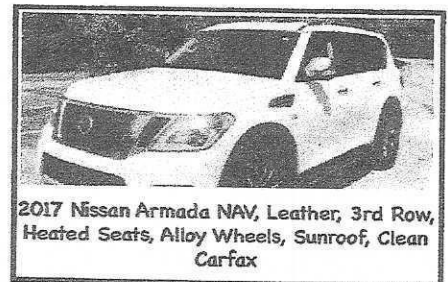
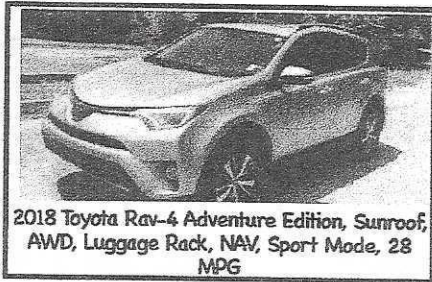
