Dominique Trent, 30, Barthman Avenue Ohio, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II x2.

Officer Valletto LPD, was dispatched to Loves Truck Stop around 0300 hours for a report of a possible theft that occurred. Once Officer Valletto arrived on scene he could see the car described to him as the suspects vehicle and the officer then asked if any of the people inside of the vehicle had stolen any item from inside of the store and they told him no. The officer then spoke to the manager so he could specifically

identify who the person was who had possibly committed the theft. Once the officer identified who the manager saw the officer went outside and spoke to him and he was identified as Dominique Trent, Officer Valletto once again asked if Mr. Trent had taken any items from the store and he told him he had not and would show the officer where the item was. Once the officer and Mr. Trent went inside he explained to the officer where he was standing and that he picked the object up and put it back, At that point the officer and Mr. Trent went back out to the car and the officer re-

quested consent to search the vehicle and the owner of the vehicle gave him consent. The officer then immediately located a small plastic bag of a green leafy substance presumed to be marijuana weighing 13.73 grams near the passenger floor board, Officer Valletto then located a large bag of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana weighing 83.17 grams in the center console of the vehicle. At this point the officer asked who the substances belonged to and Aaron Leslie a passenger claimed that the be-

lieved marijuana was his. Mr. Trent was asked if any other illegal substances were in the vehicle and he provided the officer with a 16 fluid ounce bottle of Promethazine. Subsequently both individuals were placed into custody and searched then transported to the Loudon County Jail. Officer Valletto was clear from the Jail then made aware that a Loudon County Corrections Deputy Located a bag of pills on Mr. Trent in his underwear during a more thorough search, Officer Michael Flynn then transported the pills into the officer possession, where Officer Valletto used a pill identifying website to identify the 15 pills as 7 Oxycodone Hydrochloride and 8 Morphine Sulfate. These actions did occur in the City of Loudon.

Jasin Davis, 19, Par-due Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession and Poss. of Drug Para.

Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was conducting traffic enforcement in the area of Highway 321 near Abbie Drive in Lenoir City, TN. During his enforcement duties the officer observed a red in color Honda sedan traveling south on Highway 321. While observing the vehicle the officer noticed that the driver who was operating the vehicle was not wearing a seatbelt while the vehicle was in motion on a public roadway. A traffic stop on the Honda sedan was then initiated in the parking lot of Home Depot in Lenoir City, TN. Upon the traffic stop the officer made contact with the driver, Jasin Davis. While speaking with DAVIS officer noticed a strong odor of marijuana emitting from inside of the vehicle. DAVIS was then asked to step out of the vehicle, at which time he did

so. Once outside of the vehicle the officer asked DAVIS about the odor of marijuana, and he stated that he does smoke marijuana and stated that it was possible that there could be "crumbles of marijuana in between the seats of the vehicle". A probable cause search of the vehicle was then conducted. During the subsequent search of the vehicle, the officer located a black digital scale which had a crystal-like residue contained on it and it was found in the front passenger's seat floorboard. Officer also located a small bag which contained a white powder like substance which tested positive for (Cocaine) using the Tru Narc drug analyzer. The bag containing the white powder like substance was located in the floorboard behind the front passenger's seat. The white powder like sub: along with the bag i contained inside of we approximately (1.00 g) DAVIS was placed arrest and transported Loudon County Jail.

Lisa Clark, 53, Simpson Road Loudon, was charged with DUI, and Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. IV.

Officer Valletto LPD, was Patrolling the area of Hwy 72 around the hours of 0300. While on patrol the officer observed a vehicle that was failing to maintain the lane of travel crossing over the solid line on the right hand shoulder of Hwy 72. Upon

conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle the officer identified the driver as Ms. Lisa Clark, While talking to Ms. Clark the officer could hear slurred and slowed speech and see that her eyes showed signs of impairment (Glassy eyes and bloodshot). Guilty with each other. When the cash register was opened by the teller where Johnson was located, Johnson told Raby to fire the gun that Raby had taken in for this purpose. Raby fired eight times into the air. Customers and employees, including the Wal-Mart employee at the cash register where Johnson was standing, immediately fled the store. Johnson went to the open cash register and removed \$2,200 in cash.

Both Johnson and Raby left the store and fled to Louisiana where they were later apprehended. They had been identified using store video and other law enforcement techniques and methods. They were both charged with armed robbery. The clothing that they wore during the armed robbery was discovered in their camper. A gun

was found in their car which ballistics testing by TBI determined to be the same gun shot in the Lenoir City Wal-Mart.

On Friday, March 15th Fredricka Johnson pleaded guilty as charged to the aggravated robbery charge, a Class B felony that carries a sentence range of 8 to 12 years. She is set for sentencing on May 21st.

Joshua Raby has a court date on April 15th.

ADAs Bob Edwards and Jed Bassett prosecuted this case with the assistance of Victim Witness Coordinator Lori Beaty for Russell Johnson's District Attorney Generals Office. Lenoir City Police Department responded to and investigated this case with the assistance of the 9th District Violent Crimes Task Force and Loudon County Sheriffs Office.

JOSHUA AIKENS WAS FOUND GUILTY OF FIRST-DEGREE MURDER IN THE DEATH OF ROBERT QUENTON MCCULLOUGH

On Friday (March 8, 2024) Joshua Aikens was convicted of first-degree murder for his role in the death of Robert Quenton McCullough in the fall of 2020.

McCullough was last seen on October 7, 2020, and was reported missing by his mother on October 17th. After a lengthy missing person investigation by multiple agencies, Quenton McCullough's body was discovered in an abandoned trailer in Oakdale, Tennessee on December 2, 2020, by the Roane County Sheriff's Office after a tip led them to the trailer.

Three individuals: Joshua Aikens, Shane Parks, and Nicholas Holloway, were charged with the murder of McCullough. Joshua Aikens, Shane Parks and Nich-

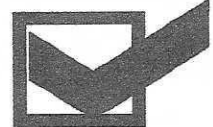
olas Holloway have all been in custody since their arrest. Parks and Holloway are awaiting trial.

Joshua Aikens was sentenced to life in prison with the possibility of parole. Under current Tennessee sentencing law, a life sentence with the possibility of parole is 60 years. If Aikens, while in prison, conforms his behavior accordingly, then he will be eligible for up to 15% 'good behavior' credit, meaning that he could be released as early as 51 years from the date of his initial arrest. ens will receive credit toward his 60 years sentence for the time he has already served in jail since his arrest. Aikens is 39 years old and will turn 40 years old in May.

The murder of Quenton McCullough was investigated by the Roane County Sheriff's Office with the assistance of the Rockwood Police Department and the Morgan County Sheriff's Department. The multi-agency cooperation, along with the assistance of the Knox County Regional Forensic Center and the Forensic Anthropology Team on this case, was instrumental in the successful prosecution of Joshua Aikens.

The case was prosecuted

for District Attorney General Russell Johnson's Office by ADA Bob Edwards and ADA Jonathan Edwards. They were assisted by Victim Witness Coordinator Tami Bailey. Aikens was defended by Attorney Tracey Williams.

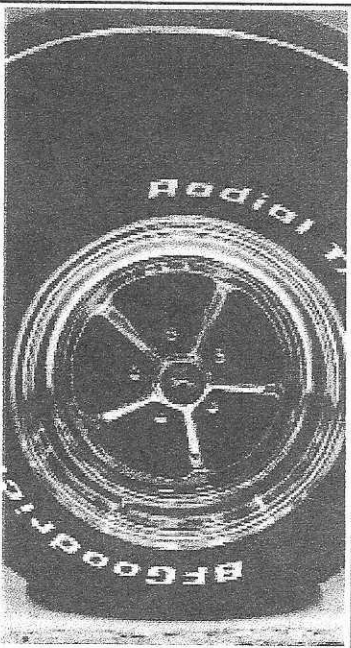

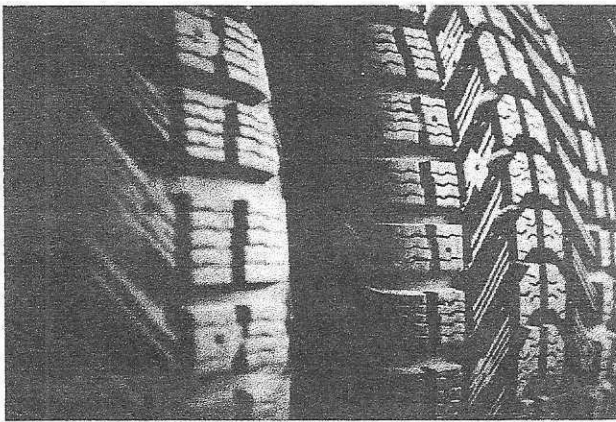

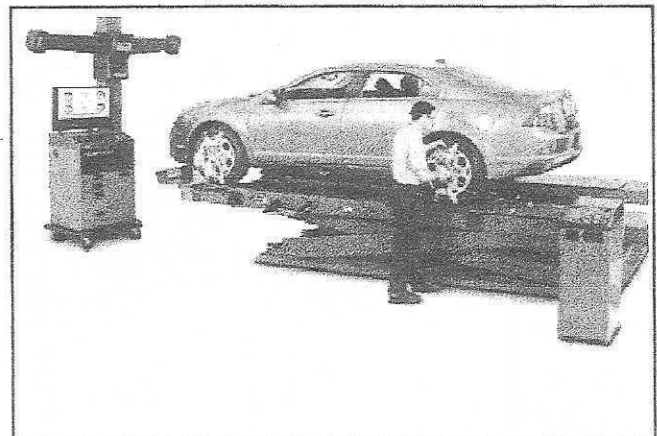
