Man Charged After Preventing Victim from Leaving

JOHNSON CITY MAN SENTENCED TO TWO YEARS FOR AGGRAVATED IDENTITY THEFT RELATED TO DEFRAUDING COVID-19 ECONOMIC RELIEF PROGRAM

Ketan Ghutadaria, 53, of Johnson City, Tennessee was sentenced to 24 months in prison by the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer, United States District Judge, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Greeneville. Following his release from imprisonment, Ghutadaria will be on supervised release for

one year, and he will be required to pay restitution in the amount of \$100,300.

As part of a plea agreement filed with the court, Ghutadaria agreed to plead guilty to Aggravated Identity Theft, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1028A(a) (1), in connection with a scheme to defraud the Economic Injury Disaster Loan ("EIDL") program, a federal program authorized

to provide loans to small businesses experiencing substantial financial disruptions due to the COVID-19 pandemic as part of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security ("CARES") Act.

As set forth in the filed plea agreement, on March 31, 2020, Ghutadaria submitted an electronic applica-

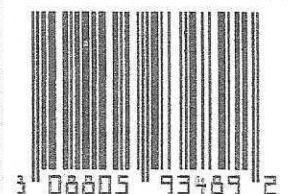

Brady Hatcher, 22, Wildwood Road Maryville, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Officer Arden LCPD, responded to Jim Hartsook Drive, apartment H-2 to investigate a domestic assault. Upon arrival officer seen a female crying through the front door and when she answered, officer identified her as the victim. The victim appeared very distraught and her clothing looked stretched and covered in various liquids. The victim stated that her boyfriend and father to her youngest daughter Brady Hatcher had become angry

and violent toward her and the property and he was upstairs. Officer did observed the living room and kitchen ransacked with broken electronics and cabinet doors. Officer encountered Mr. Hatcher in the upstairs bedroom where he had broken the door from the frame, ransacked the bedroom and cut the bed and pillows with a knife. Officer also observed the bathroom door broken from the frame and the bathroom was ransacked. SGT C. Espinoza escorted Mr. Hatcher outside while the officer spoke to the victim. The victim explained that around 02:30 am on this date, Mr. Hatcher broke the bedroom

door during an argument. Prior to officer arrival/dispatch, the officer explained that she was awakened this morning with Mr. Hatcher screaming and destroying the apartment before throwing and kicking her off the bed. The victim stated that Mr. Hatcher began pouring numerous liquids on her and pinned her to the bed by her throat while spitting on her causing her to become scared for her life and children. The victim advised that she was able to run to a neighbor to call 911. Based upon the

totality of the circumstance, Mr. Hatcher was determined to be the primary aggressor and was taken into custody for Aggravated Domestic Assault. Mr. Hatcher was transported to the Loudon County Jail. This incident did occur within Lenoir City, Loudon County, Tennessee.

 tion to the Small Business Administration ("SBA") requesting an EIDL on behalf of a local trucking company. Ghutadaria used the business owner's personal identification information to apply for the EIDL without the business owner's knowledge or authority. The SBA approved the EIDL application based on the fraudulent information provided by Ghutadaria. On June 16, 2020, the SBA transferred \$100,300 in EIDL funds into a bank account that Ghutadaria had access to. Between June 16, 2020, and September 2020, Ghutadaria spent approximately all the EIDL funds to pay off student loans, to pay off a motor vehicle loan, and on other personal items.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee and United States Secret Service ("USSS") Resident Agent in

Charge, Jason Brown, made the announcement.

The case was investigated by Special Agent Thomas Whitehead of the USSS.

Assistant United States Attorneys Mac Heavener and Ryan Blackwell represented the United States.

On May 17, 2021, the Attorney General established the COVID-19 Fraud Enforcement Task Force to marshal the resources of the Department of Justice in partnership with agencies

across the government to enhance efforts to combat and prevent pandemic-related fraud. The Task Force bolsters efforts to investigate and prosecute the most culpable domestic and international criminal actors and assists agencies tasked with administering relief programs to prevent fraud by, among other methods, augmenting and incorporating existing coor-
