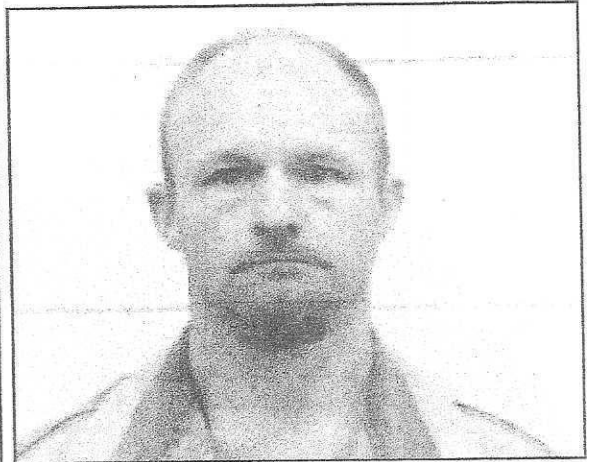

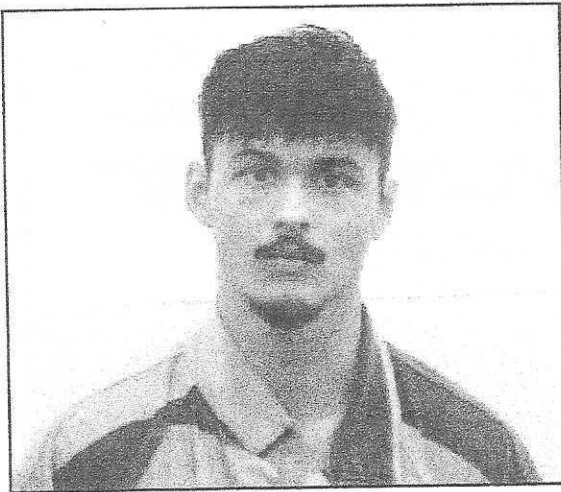

Former Henderson County Volunteer Fire Chief Indicted

Daylon McPeake led Department Station 7

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Daylon McPeake, the former fire chief of the Henderson County Volunteer Fire Department's Station 7.

Investigators determined that McPeake misappropriated

funds totaling at least \$19,077.41 between January 2021 and October 2023. The fire department's funds were stolen in three methods:

McPeake improperly cashed checks written to cash and himself totaling \$6,832.41. Investigators determined that much of this money (\$6,632.41) was deposited into McPeake's personal bank account.

McPeake made un-

authorized checking account withdrawals totaling \$11,300. McPeake admitted that a portion of the money was used toward the purchase of a personal vehicle.

McPeake improperly purchased three helmets totaling \$945 without authorization. The helmets were shipped to his personal address and are unac-

Jacob Pruitt, 30, Gillenwater Road Maryville, was charged with Aggravated Assault, Theft, Reckless Endangerment, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Rosa Greene, 31, Eauculier Drive Maryville, was charged with Poss of Drug Para.

Lenoir City officers were alerted by dispatch that an off duty Loudon County deputy was behind a stolen vehicle that had been involved in a pursuit with law enforcement earlier that day. While in route officers were informed that the vehicle was traveling southbound on U.S. Hwy 321 N passing Town Creek Pkwy. At approximately 1821, Of-

ficers Wilkes, Lyon, and McGinnis, made contact with the vehicle at the intersection of U.S. Hwy 321 N and Abbie Dr. Then vehicle was in the right hand lane at the red light. Officers then boxed the vehicle in, when the driver attempted to flee in the vehicle, purposely striking Officer Wilkes patrol unit head on, and stopping due to vehicle damage. Officers then performed a felony stop on the vehicle, assisting the occupants from the vehicle before placing them in hand restraints, and identifying them as Mr. Jacob D. Pruitt, and Ms. Rosa B. Greene. During the vehicle search, officers located multiple cut straws, pipes,

and torches, all with residue of what appeared to be methamphetamine on them. After being read and verbally understanding his miranda rights, Mr. Pruitt did admit to smoking Methamphetamine about 6-7 hours prior to this incident. Mr. Pruitt did agree to SFST at the Loudon County Jail, in which he did perform poorly on the HGN, Walk and Turn, and One Leg Stand. Mr. Pruitt did refuse to provide a blood sample for testing before entering the facility. All the above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, TN without further incident.

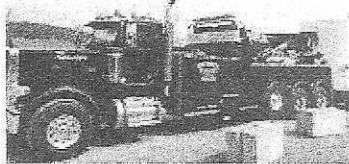

Roi Tester, 20, Loudon Ridge Road Lenoir City, was charged with Underage DUI, and Possession of a Handgun While Intoxicated.

Officer Law LCPD, was on routine patrol when he observed a blue Dodge Ram (TN Tag 248-BKJN) following a white sedan on Highway 321 so close that if the vehicle was to apply their brakes the Dodge would not be able to safety stop without hitting them. The officer then conducted a traffic stop at Highway 321 at City Park Drive and identified the male to be Roi Tester. While speaking to Mr. Tester the officer observed him to have blood shot watery eyes, and the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his persons. During his investigation, Mr. Tester stated he had not consumed any alcohol but later in the investigation stated he had consumed 1-2 beers prior to our encounter. Mr. Tester consented to

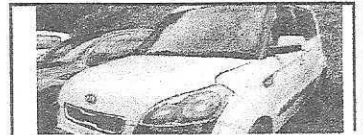

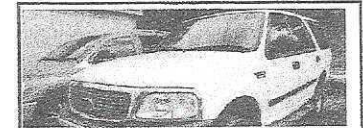

In an effort to conceal his misappropriation, McPeake verbally reported to members an inflated bank account balance. For example, in September and October 2023, he reported a balance of approximately \$29,500; however, the official bank account records revealed a balance of approximately \$14,000.

Investigators also found that McPeake created fabricated invoices and forged a signature on a station check to facilitate his scheme.

McPeake was removed from his position as fire chief on October 19, 2023.

Based upon this investigation, in April 2024, the Henderson County Grand Jury indicted Christopher Daylon McPeake on one count of theft over \$10,000, one count of evidence tampering or fabrication, and one count of forgery.

“Our investigators found a number of financial management deficiencies within this department,” said Comptroller Mumpower. “In addition to one person having exclusive control over the department’s bank accounts, the department also failed to reconcile and maintain its accounting records; it did not require prenumbered checks and dual signatures on checks; and it did not require receipts to be issued for all collections.”


