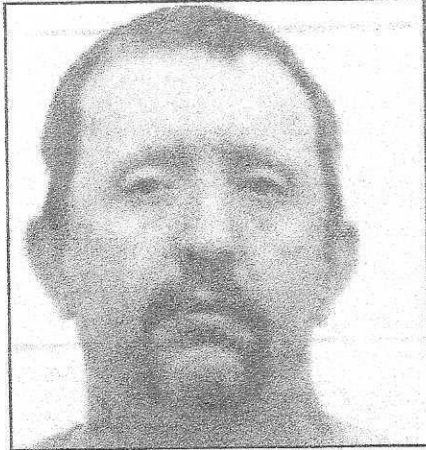

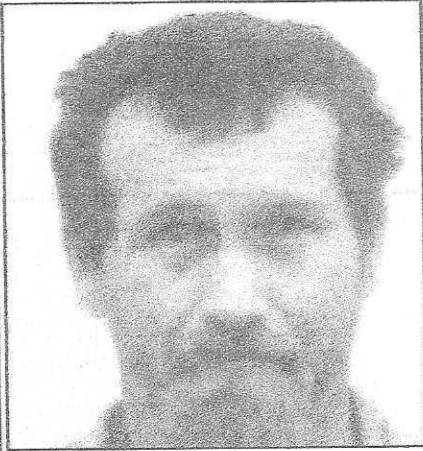

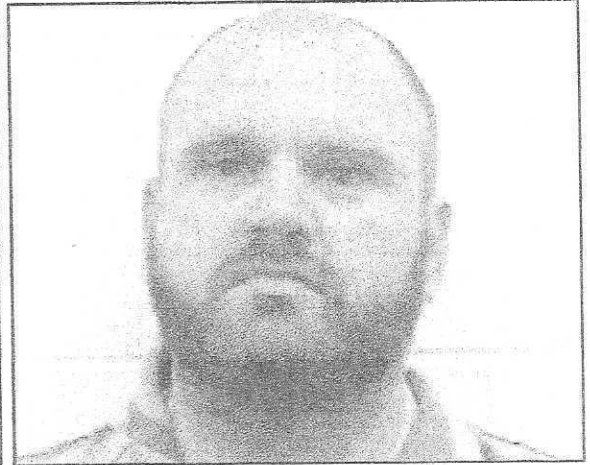

Elder Fraud, in Focus

Elder fraud reports to FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center rose by 14% in 2023

The FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center (or IC3) released the 2023 edition of its annual Elder Fraud Report on April 30, 2024.

Elder fraud complaints to the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center (or IC3) increased by 14% in 2023, and associated losses increased by about 11%, according to IC3's 2023 Elder Fraud Report,

released April 30.

This annual publication provides statistics about incidents of elder fraud—or fraud that explicitly targets older Americans' money or cryptocurrency—that are reported to IC3. The report aims to raise the public's awareness of this issue and to prevent future and repeat incidents.

“Combating the financial exploitation of those over 60 years of

age continues to be a priority of the FBI,” wrote FBI Assistant Director Michael D. Nordwall, who leads the Bureau's Criminal Investigative Division, in the report. “Along with our partners, we continually work to aid victims and to identify and investigate the individuals and criminal or-

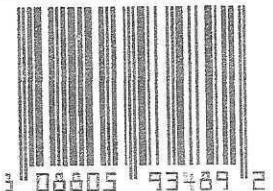

Allen Fritts, 44, Fair Street North Sweetwater, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth.

Douglas Sewell, 40 Oakland Road Sweetwater, was charged with Driving while in Possession of Meth, and Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth.

Deputy Watson LCSO, observed a White Kia Forte (TN Reg:BGJ6683) traveling South Bound on I-75 near MM 74. Deputy Watson observed this vehicle in violation of Slow Poke Law and initiated a traffic stop. Deputy Watson made contact with the driver, Doug Sewell, and the Passenger, Allen Fritts, and requested both occupants to exit the vehicle. Upon speaking with Mr. Fritts, he advised there were syringes located inside of the vehicle. Investigator Gray and Green responded

to the traffic stop to assist. Upon conducting a probable cause search of the vehicle Investigator Gray observed a loose panel on the passenger side of the center console. Inv. Gray lifted the panel and observed several individual baggies containing a clear crystal-like substance believed to be Methamphetamine. A total of 4 baggies were removed from the natural void near the center console, weighing approximately 107g combined, nearly an ounce each. The suspected narcotics were well within reach of both subjects but both subjects denied any knowledge of the substance. Both subjects were taken into custody and transported to Loudon County Jail without incident. Both subjects cellular devices were seized by the Narcotics unit for further investigation. The substance was tested using the TruNarc device which

resulted in a positive test for Methamphetamine. Mr. Sewell is being charged with Driving while in possession of Meth and Manufacture, Sell, Delivery of

Methamphetamine. Mr. Fritts is being charged with Manufacture, Sell, Delivery of Methamphetamine. All the above did occur in Loudon County, TN.

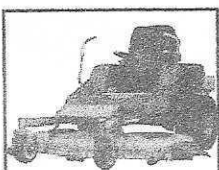
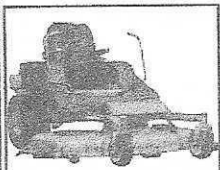

Dylan Black, 31, Browder School Road Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Deputy Watson LCSO, responded to W Broadway in reference to a domestic. Upon arrival, the deputy spoke with the (Victim), who stated the following summarized statements:

The victim boyfriend Dylan Black (offender) had been drinking alcohol at their residence Browder School Rd. Mr. Black confronted the victim about his dog attacking her cat. Things began getting physical when Mr. Black

pushed the victim against the kitchen counter and attempted to grab her by the arm. The victim stated that she was in fear of being hurt by Mr. Black due to his violent behavior and exited the residence without any other physical altercations. While in the driveway, Mr. Black stated that he was going to shoot the victim if she ran over his dog while leaving the residence. The victim stated that during the altercation there was an AR-15 style rifle laying on the floor of the residence. The victim then left the residence and drove to her friend's house.

Deputies advised against the victim returning to the residence due Mr. Black's violent behavior and intoxication level.

The victim stated that she would be staying at her friends house the rest of the day until deputies could make contact with Mr. Black. Charges are being placed on file for domestic assault.

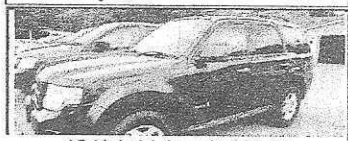

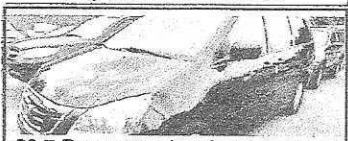

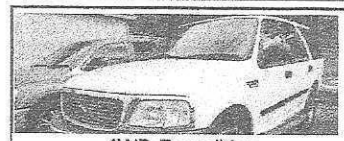

cluded victims' ages.

Here are five key take-aways from the 2023 report:

1. Elder fraud is an expensive crime. Scams targeting individuals aged 60 and older caused over \$3.4 billion in losses in 2023—an increase of approximately 11% from the year prior. The average victim of elder fraud lost \$33,915 due to these crimes in 2023.

2. Older Americans seem to be disproportionately im-

pacted by scams and fraud. Over 101,000 victims aged 60 and over reported this kind of crime to IC3 in 2023. On the flip side, victims under the age of 20 years old seemed to be the least-impacted demographic, with about 18,000 victims in this demographic reporting suspected scams or frauds to IC3 last year.

3. Tech support scams were the most widely reported kind of elder fraud in 2023. Nearly 18,000 victims aged

60 and over reported such scams to IC3. Personal data breaches, confidence and romance scams, non-payment or non-delivery scams, and investment scams rounded out the top five most common types of elder fraud reported to IC3 last year.

4. Investment scams were the costliest kind of elder fraud in 2023. These


schemes cost victims more than \$1.2 billion in losses last year. And tech support scams, business email compromise scams, confidence and romance scams, government impersonation scams, and personal data breaches all respectively cost victims hundreds of millions of dollars in 2023.

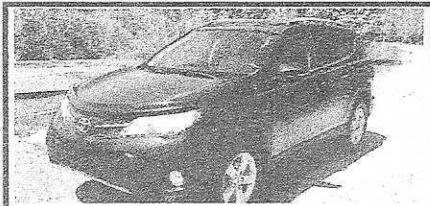

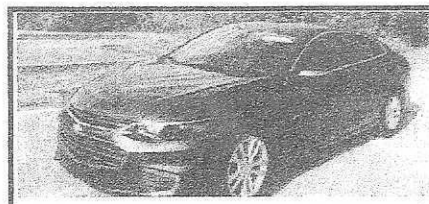

5. Scammers are coming for people's cryptocurrency. More than 12,000 victims aged 60 and over indicated that cryptocurrency was "a medium or tool used to facilitate" the scam or fraud that targeted them when reporting it to IC3.

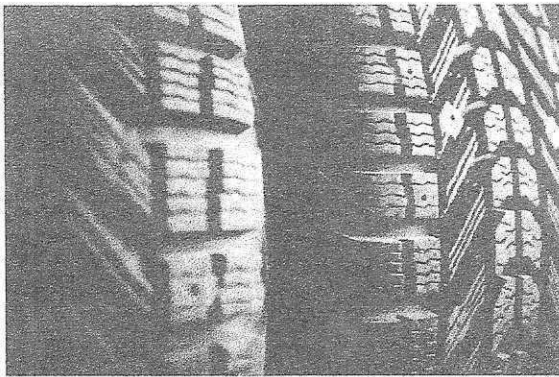
