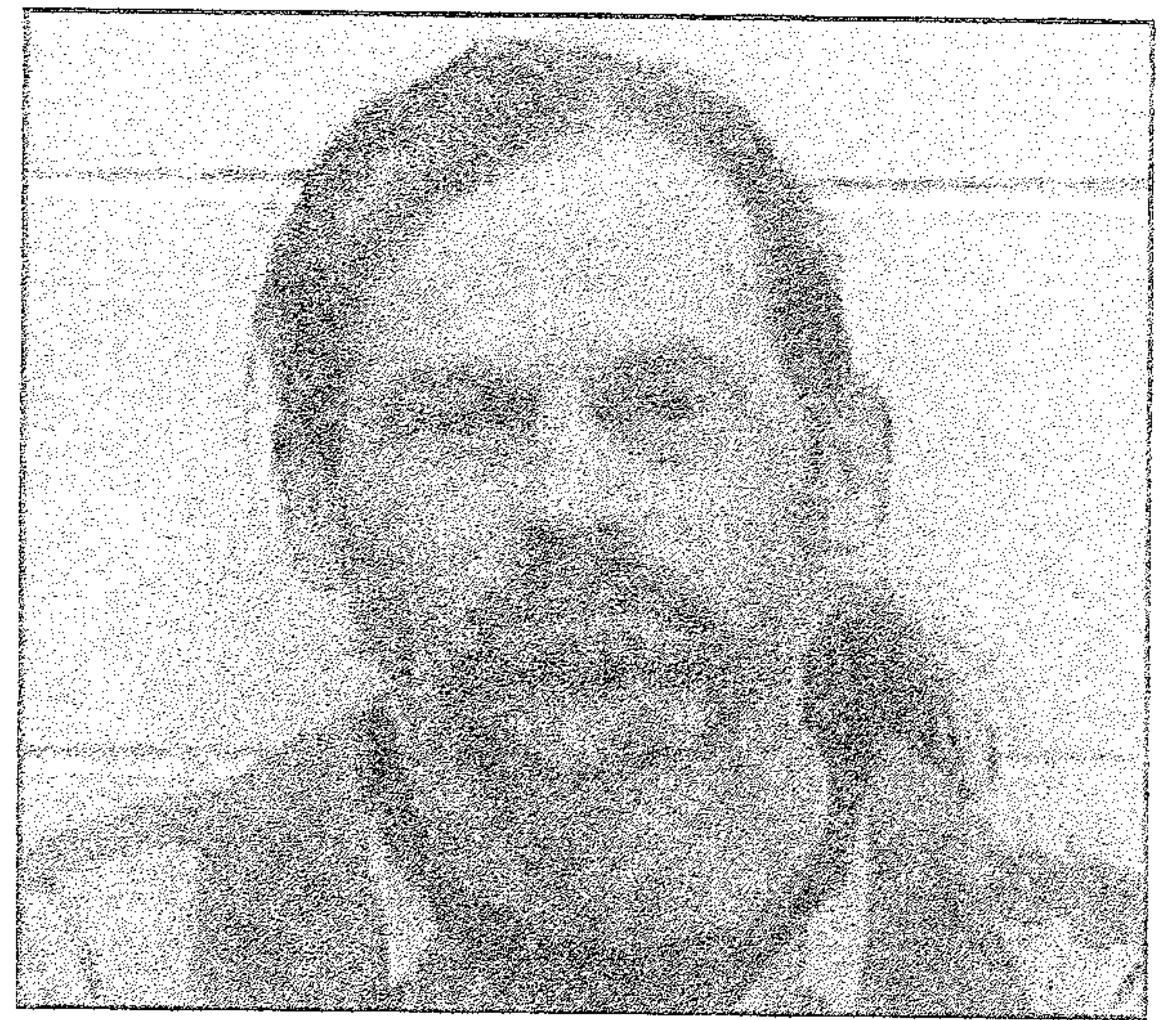

Comptroller's Office Studies Outcomes-Based Funding Formula

The Tennessee Comptroller's Office of Research and Education Accountability (OREA) has released a suite of publications examining the outcomes-based funding formula (OBF). The formula generated \$1.1 billion for public colleges and universities for the 2020-21 school year. The

formula uses a point system, in which a variety of measures within three main components (weighted outcomes of performance, fixed costs, and quality assurance) are used to determine each institution's point total. The proportion of state funding that will be appropriated to each

institution is then calculated using the point totals.

OREA found OBF points earned by all institutions have increased by 7 percent since 2016-17. There was variation in performance between different types of in-

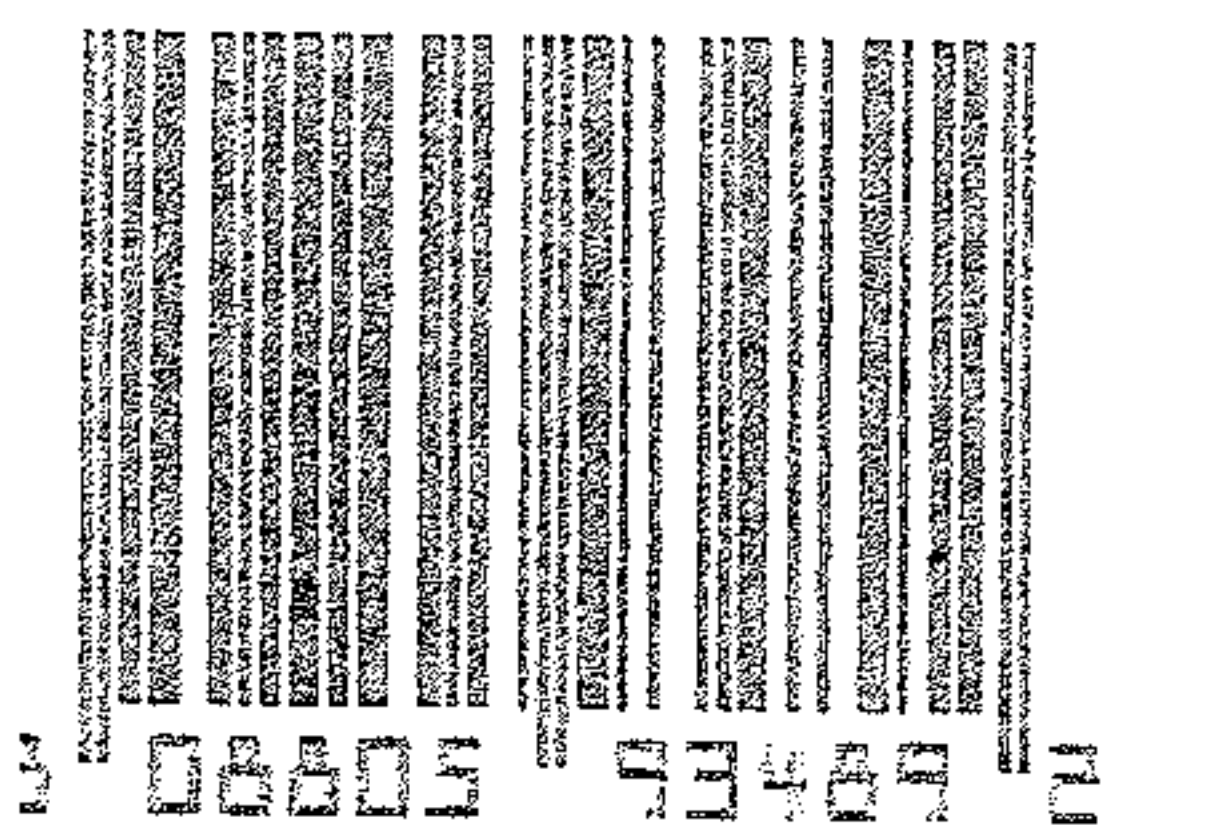
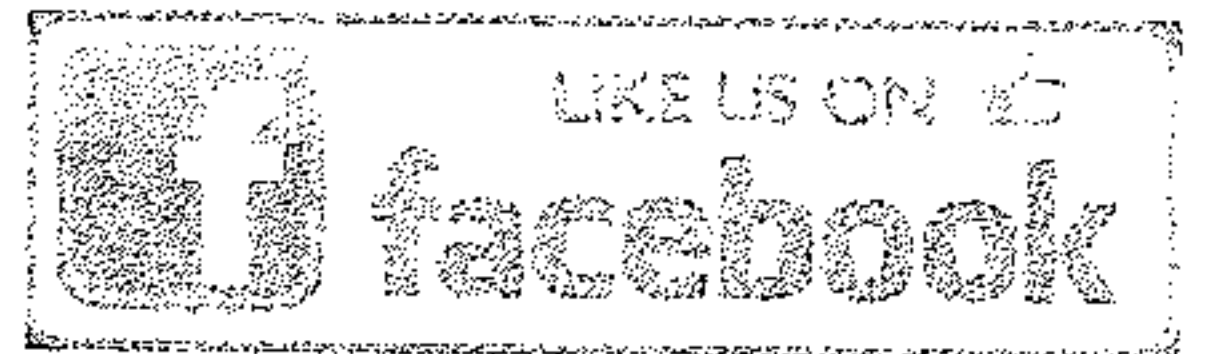

residence of Ricky Wayne Malone located at Martel Road, Lenoir City, TN. Nine and one half (9.5) 40mg oxymorphone pills (a Schedule II Narcotic) were located on the person of Malone. Nine (9) 15mg oxymorphone (a Schedule II Narcotic), nineteen (19) 15mg oxycodone (a Schedule II Narcotic), fifty eight (58) 8mg suboxone (a Schedule III Narcotic), and two (2) 0.5mg clonazepam (a Schedule IV Narcotic) were located in a kitchen drawer. During the investigation, Narcotics Investigators requested a patient profile from the Tennessee Controlled Substance Monitoring Database for Malone's prescription data. According to the report, Malone is not prescribed 40mg oxymorphone, suboxone or clonazepam. Investigators have also conducted several controlled buys from Malone for 40mg and 15mg oxymorphone. Ricky Malone is charged with three counts of Possession of Schedule II for Resale, one count of Possession of Schedule III for Resale and one count of Simple Possession of Schedule IV.

Michael Greenwell, 24, Caldwell Road Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault. Dep. L. Hawkins LCSO, was dispatched to Caldwell Road in reference to a domestic. The Loudon County Dispatched advised Deputy this was a third-party call and the caller, stated she was on the phone with her friend and could hear yelling. When Deputy arrived on the scene he spoke with the victim, she stated her and her husband, Michael Greenwell, were watching American Horror Story when they began to argue. Mr. Greenwell paused the show to talk about the Tsar Bomb. While he was they were talking, she began to compare that event to the Chernobyl event. Mr. Greenwell took offense to this and believed she was

trying to "undermine" him, he said. He began to yell in her face and she asked him to stop. He continued to yell aggressively and get closer to her face. She then grabbed her phone to call the complainant and he struck her hand to make her drop the phone. Victim did drop the phone and she picked it back up, he then again struck her hand and made her drop it. At that time she stated she was in fear that Mr. Greenwell was going to harm her so she grabbed the Canik 9MM pistol out of a drawer in the kitchen for self-defense. He continued to yell at her, she managed to locate her phone and called the complainant, putting the phone out of Mr. Greenwell's visual. Victim did not fire the weapon, she unloaded it and set it on the counter. While Deputy was

speaking with her, she was shaking and clearly was in fear. Cpl. Z. Frye spoke with Mr. Greenwell, he confirmed her story and did admit to striking her hand to make her drop the phone. Both subjects were extremely intoxicated and had been drinking. Based on victim/witness statements, Michael Greenwell was found to be the primary aggressor. He

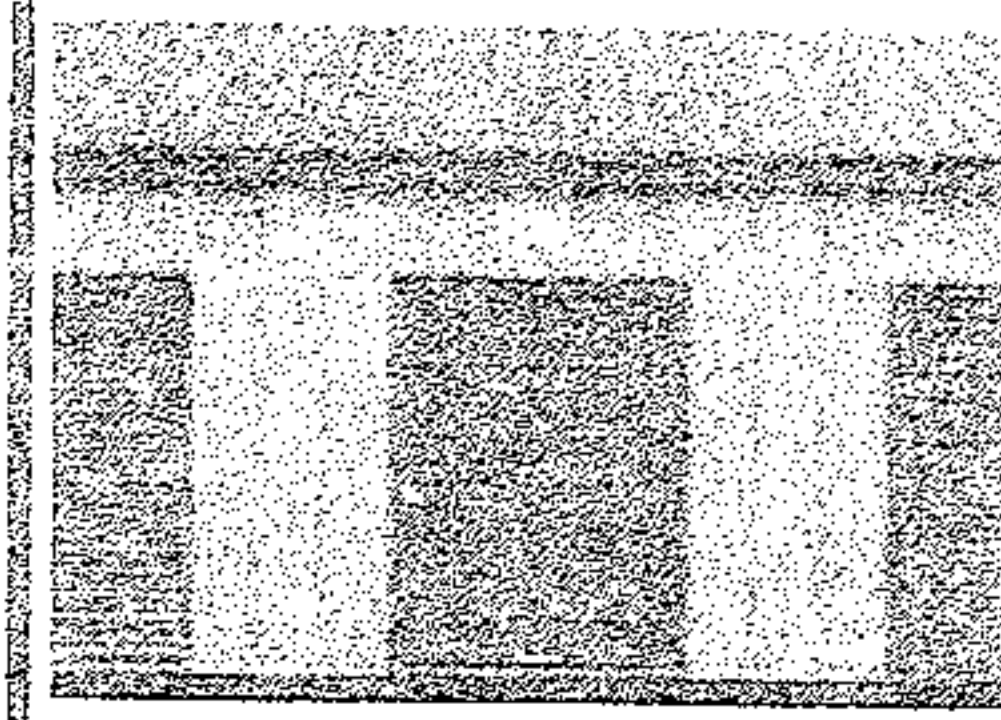
was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

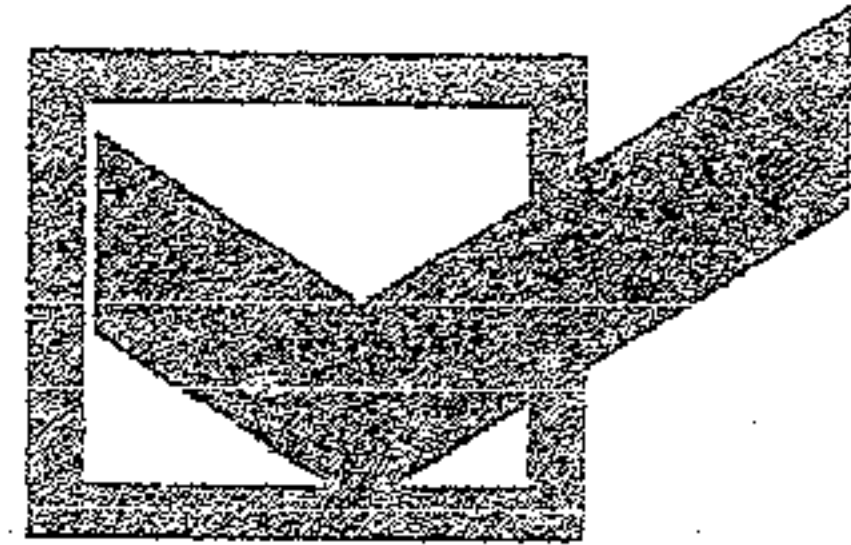

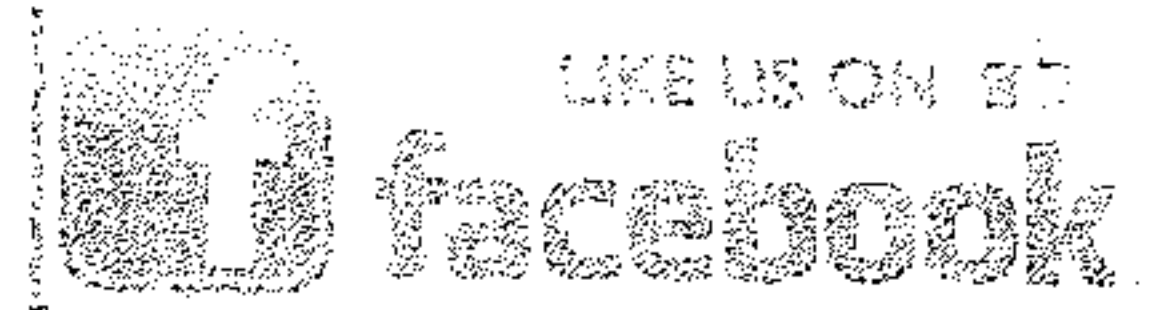

stitutions, with the community college sector earning the largest increase, at 9 percent. The General Assembly has increased the state OBF appropriation each year since 2016-17. In total, there has been a 25 percent increase in the state OBF appropriation since 2016-17, driven by increased outcomes, inflation, salary and insurance increases, and other changing costs.

In An Explanation of the Outcomes-Based Funding Formula (2015-2020), OREA explains each step of the formula – from data collection and processing to final funding recommendations – by defining key terms and using real-world examples. The Outcomes-Based Funding Formula: Profiles of Tennessee’s Public Universities and Community Colleges outlines

how each community college and university has performed under the formula during the 2015-2020 cycle, exploring OBF components such as:

- yearly appropriations;
- points earned for weighted outcomes, fixed costs, and quality assurance;

- a comparison of each institution’s change in points to that of other institutions; and
- changes in appropriation shares.

OREA has also produced interactive OBF dashboards for the state’s public universities and community colleges. The dashboards display institutional outcomes and state appropriations under the OBF. Users may select an institution to view its specific makeup of formula components and performance data, including outcome data, mission weights, point totals, appropriation

share and point growth, and more. When no institution is selected, the dashboards serve as a comparison tool showing all institutions’ performance. OREA has also prepared a video tutorial providing context to the dashboard reports and explaining how to navigate them.

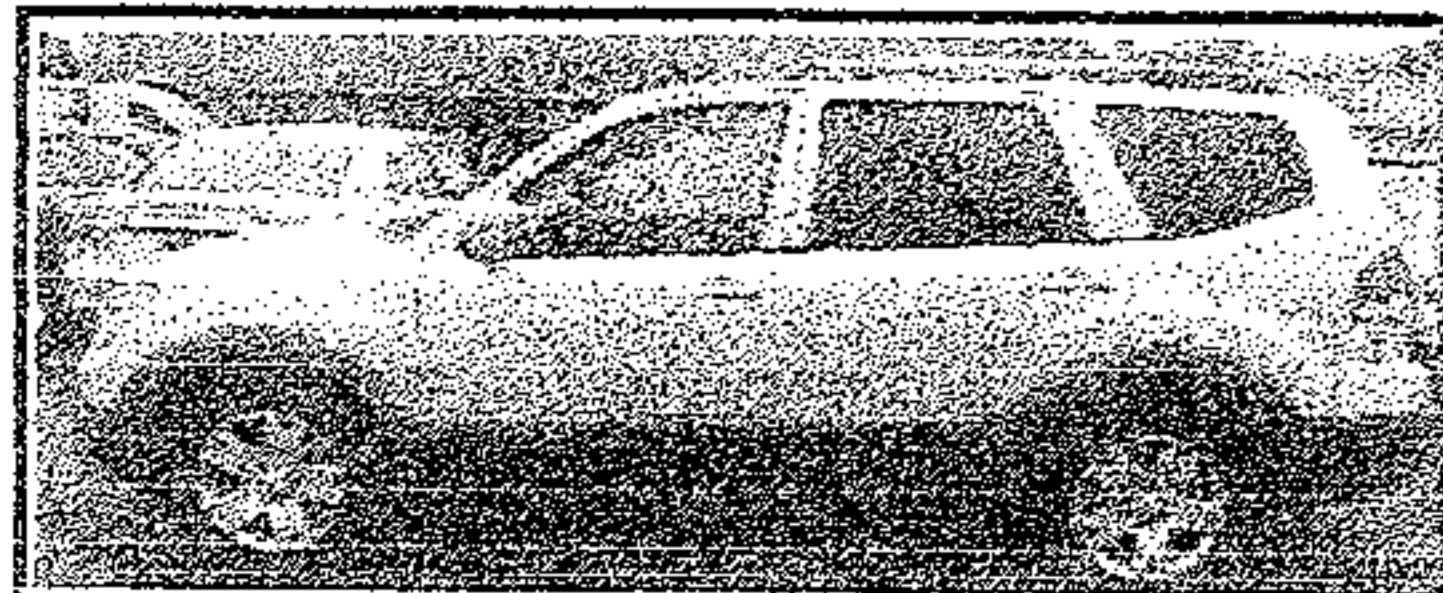

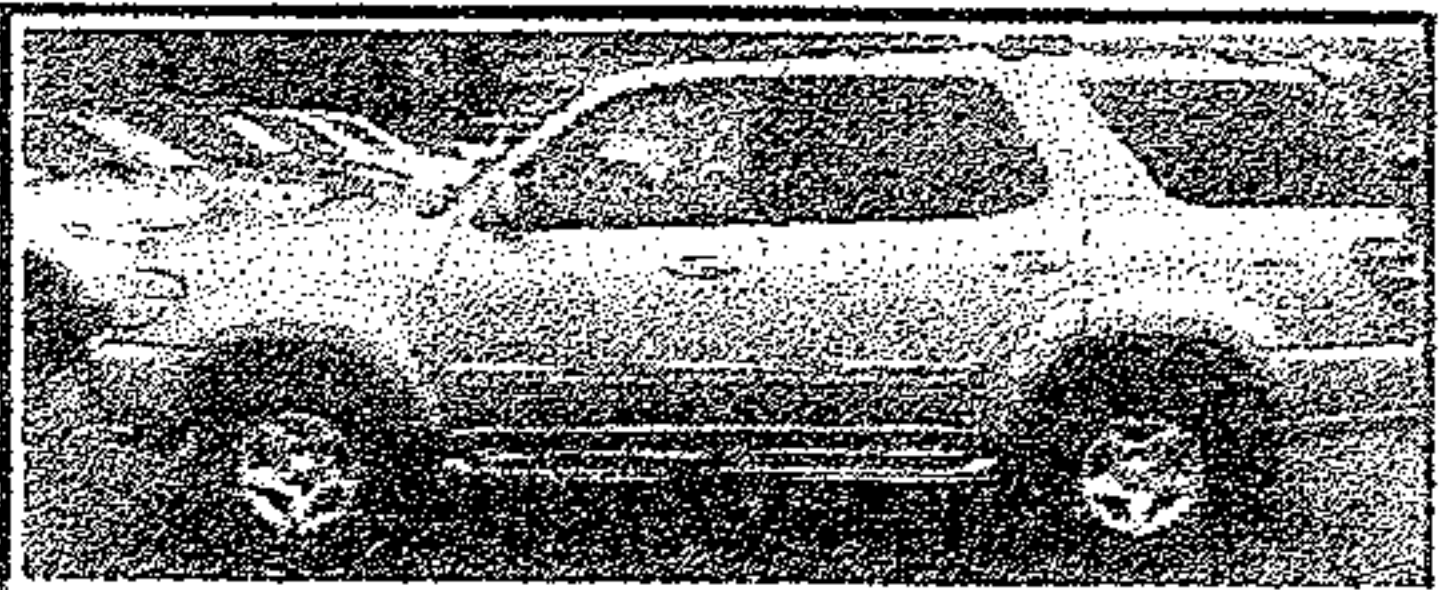

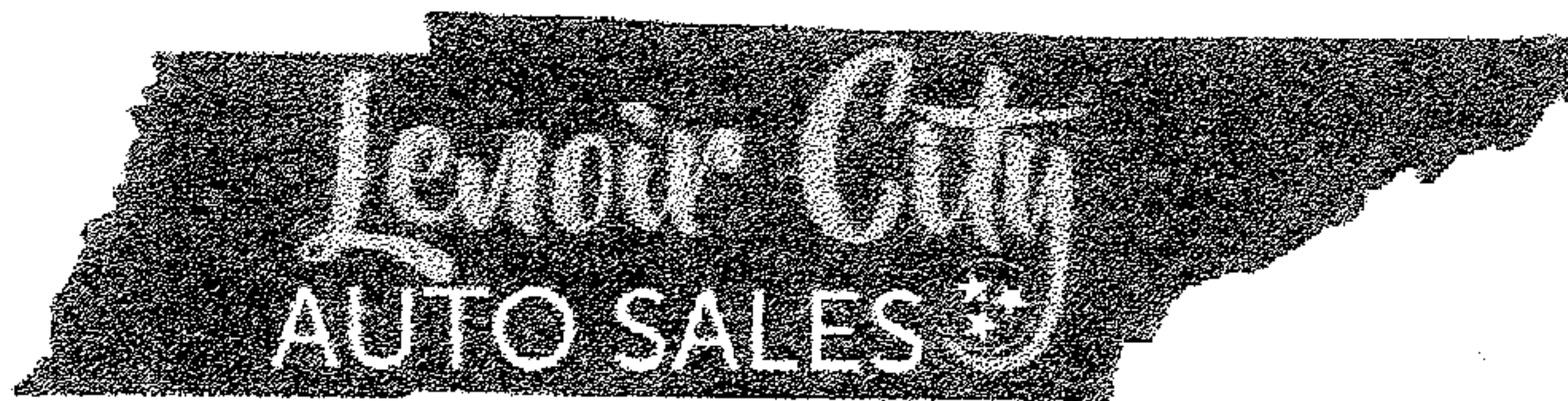

Heroin

Timothy Mabry, 48, Washington Pike Knoxville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. I, Simple Possession x2, and Poss. Of Drug Para. Officer Miller was dispatched to the area of Highway 321 near Bimbos (Gas Station) in reference to a reckless driver. Complainant advised dispatch that there was a black in color Chevy Silverado all over the roadway running vehicles off the road, and had almost hit several mailboxes. Officers were able to locate the black truck at Bimbos. Upon contact with the vehicle, Officer Miller had the driver step out of the vehicle so that he could talk/ check to see if he was possibly intoxicated. Officer Ketner had the passenger step out of the vehicle so that he could speak with him. Officer Ketner spoke with

the passenger Mr. Timothy Mabry, while taking with Mr. Mabry Officer Ketner asked him if he would empty his pockets at which time he did. Located in Mr. Mabry's pockets was a "Juicy Fruit" container, that contained (4) four baggies of a brown substance thought to be Heroin 1.5 grams, along with (3) three white Gabapentin Pill(s), and (1) one blue Alprazolam pill (Xanax). Also located in Mr. Mabry's pockets was a glass pipe with brown residue, a white cut pen with white residue, and a red cut straw with white residue in it. Located inside of Mr. Mabry's wallet was a folded receipt that contained a brown powder substance thought to be Heroin. Mr. Mabry was then placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

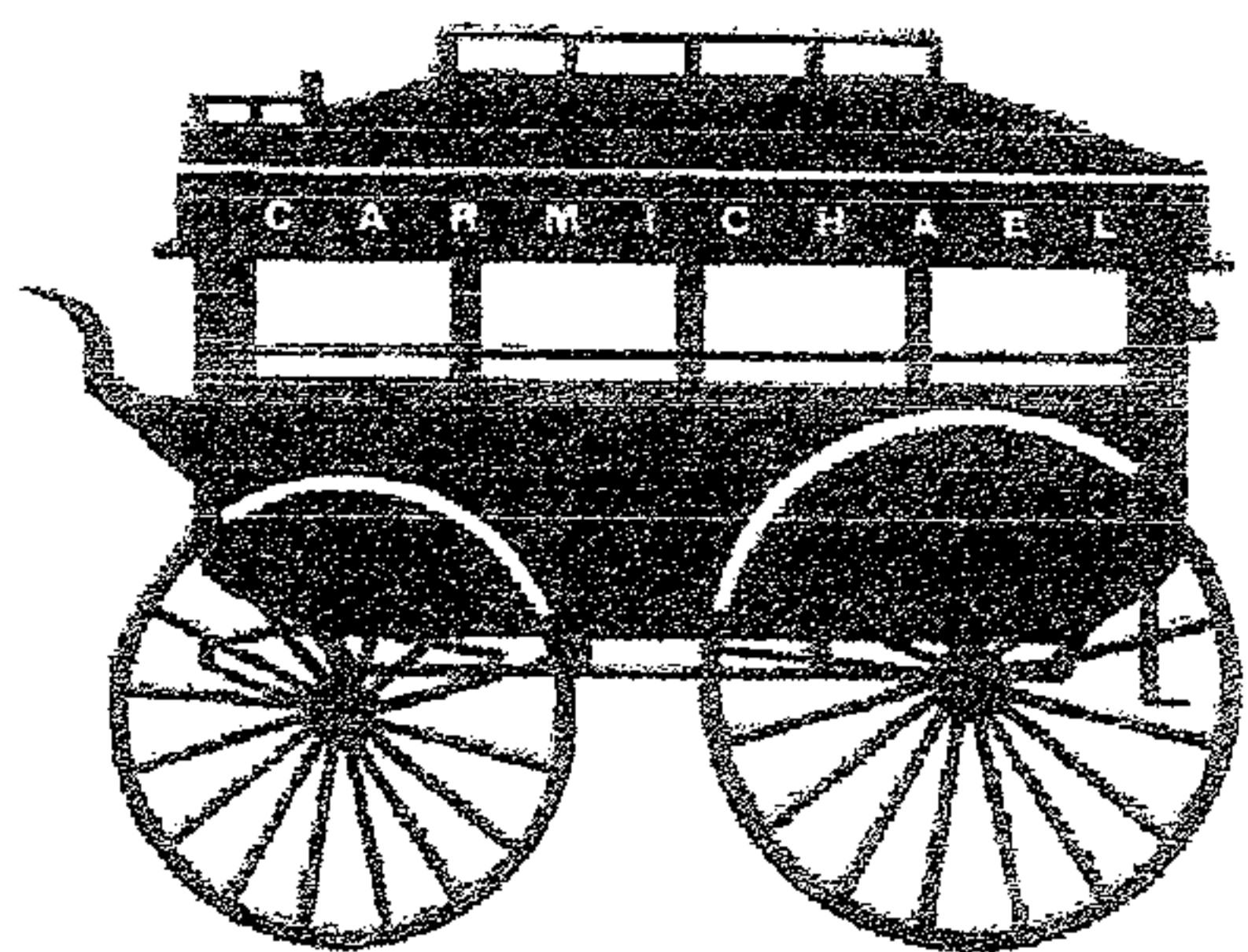

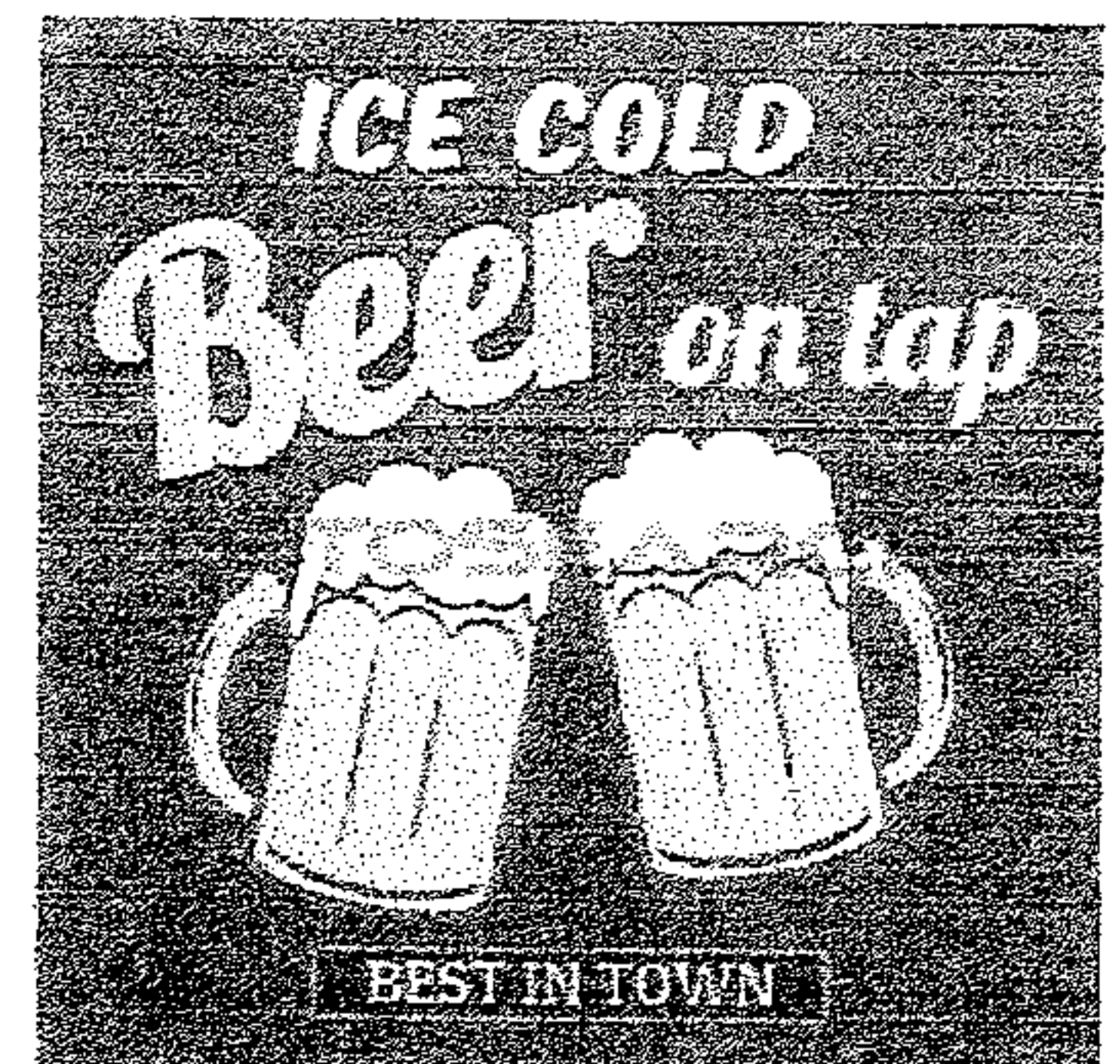
