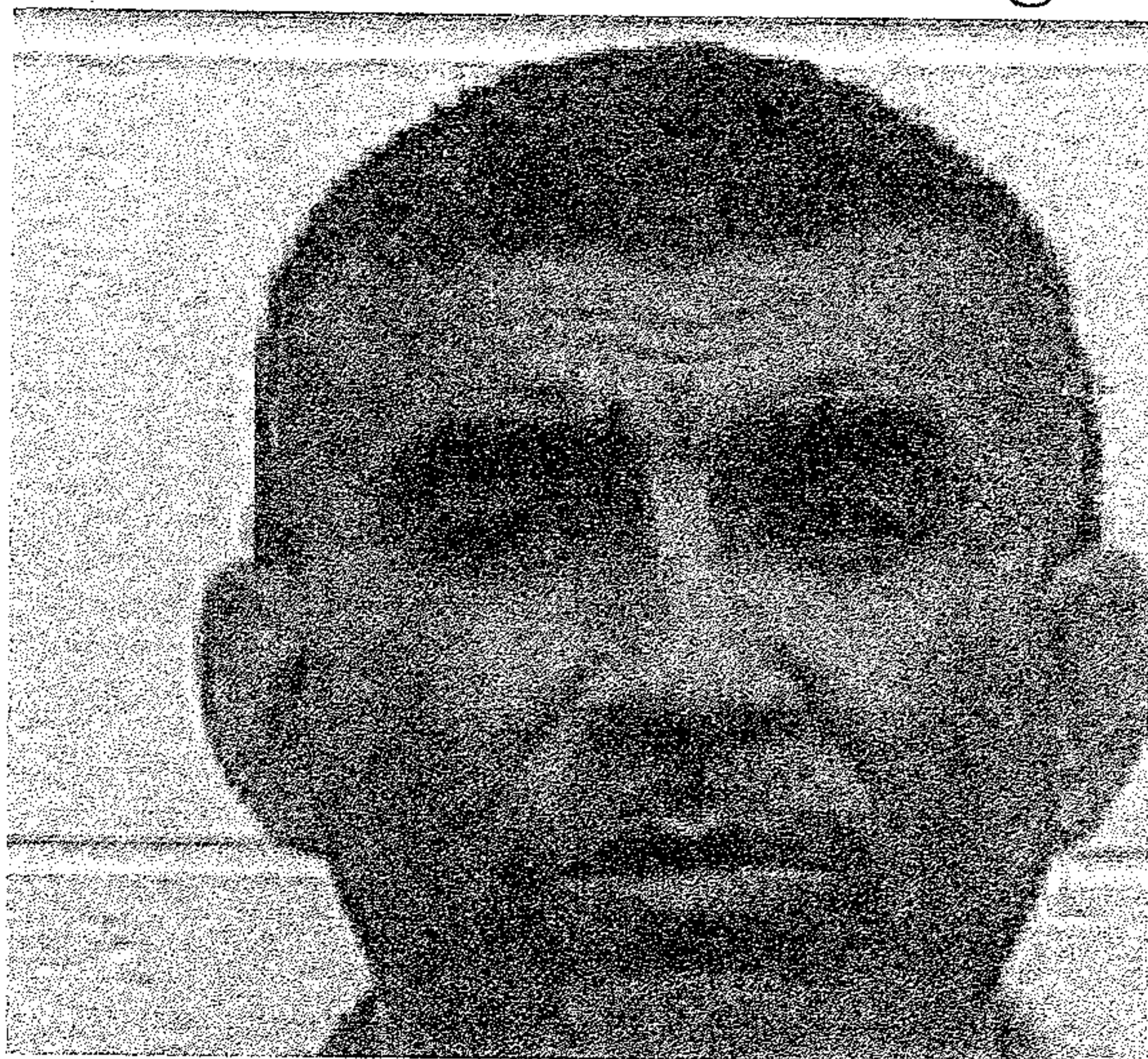

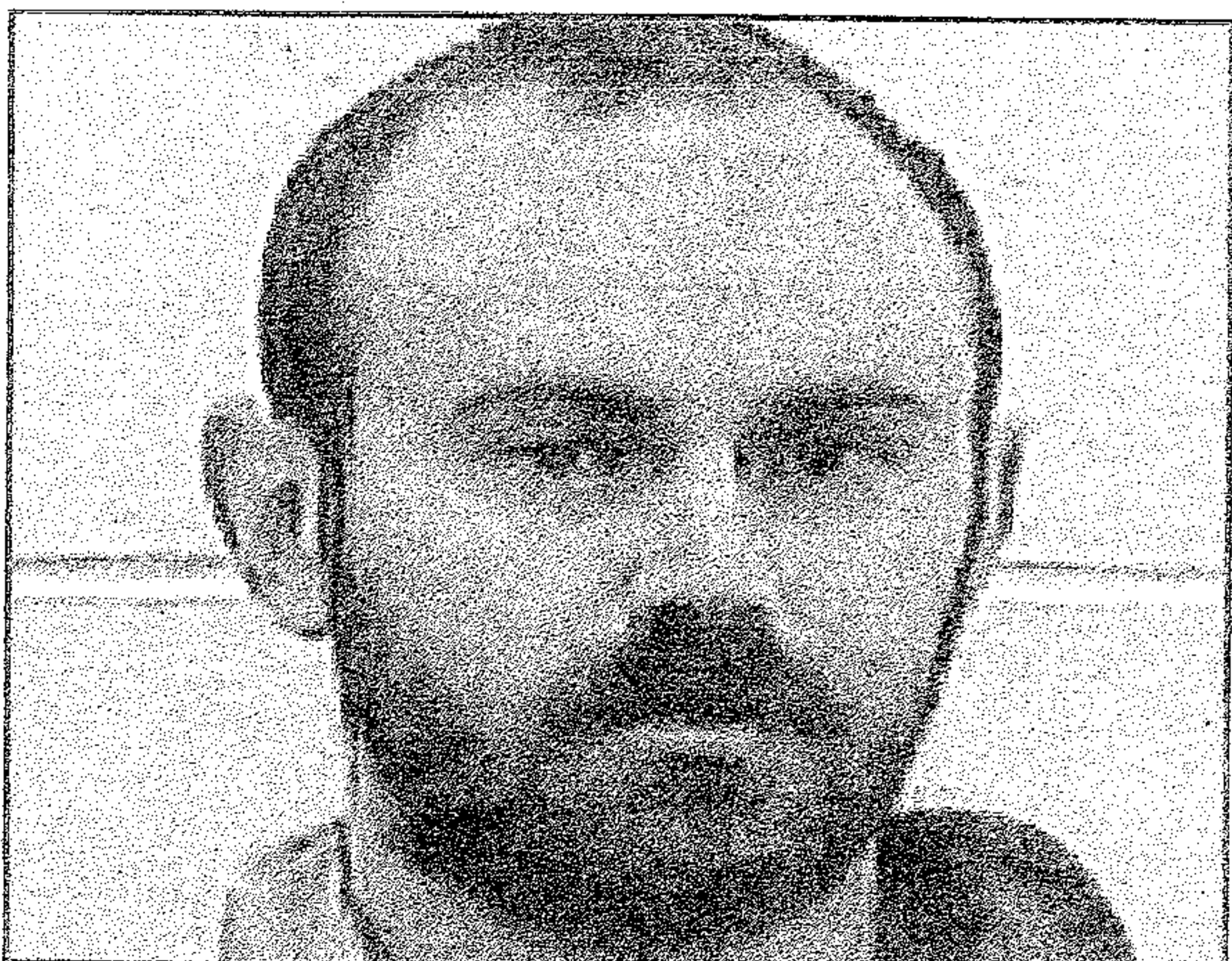

50.6 Million U.S. Adults Currently Use Tobacco Products

Cigarettes remain most used tobacco product in 2019

Findings from a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report released today show that approximately 1 in 5 U.S. adults reported currently using a tobacco product in 2019, with about 80% of those adults reporting that they use combustible

products such as cigarettes.

To assess recent national estimates of tobacco product use among U.S. adults 18 years or older, CDC analyzed data from the 2019 National Health Interview Survey. The survey measured use of five tobacco products: cigarettes, cigars (cigars, cigarillos, or

filtered little cigars), pipes (regular pipes, water pipes, or hookahs), e-cigarettes, and smokeless tobacco (chewing tobacco, snuff, dip, snus, or dissolvable tobacco).

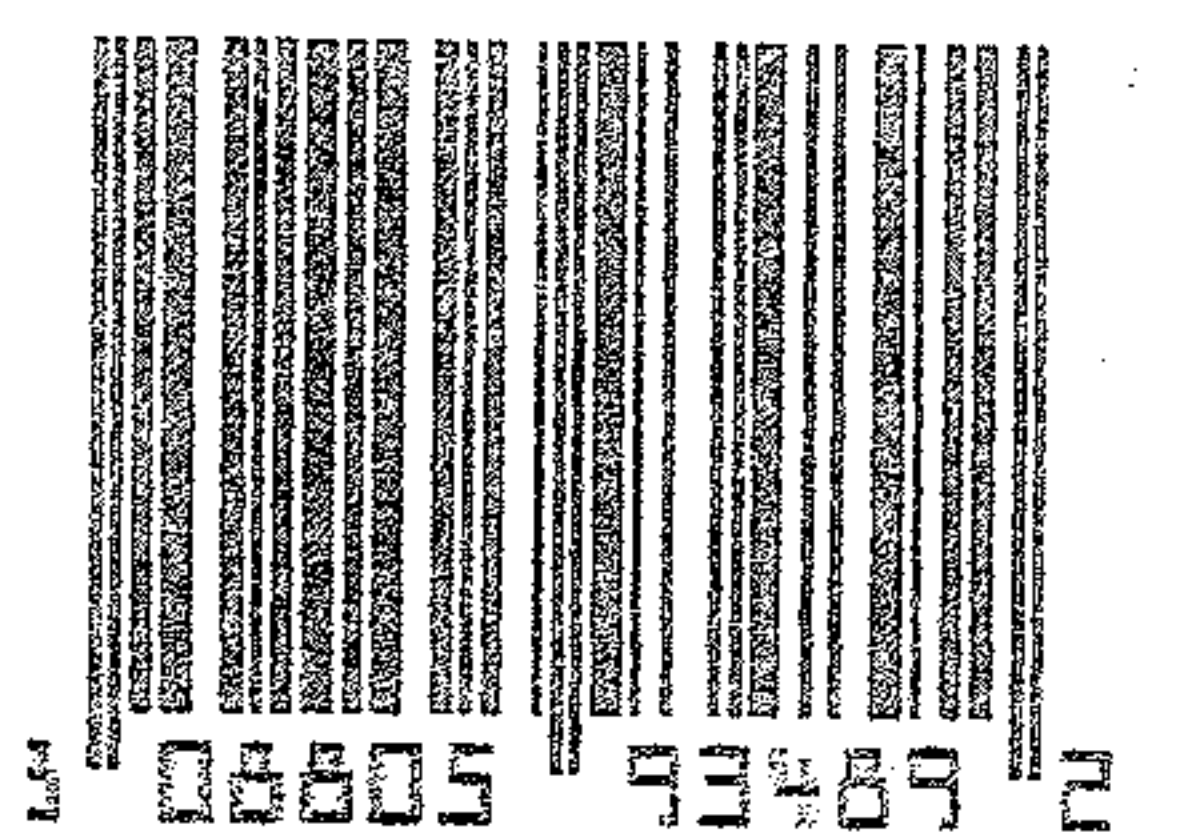

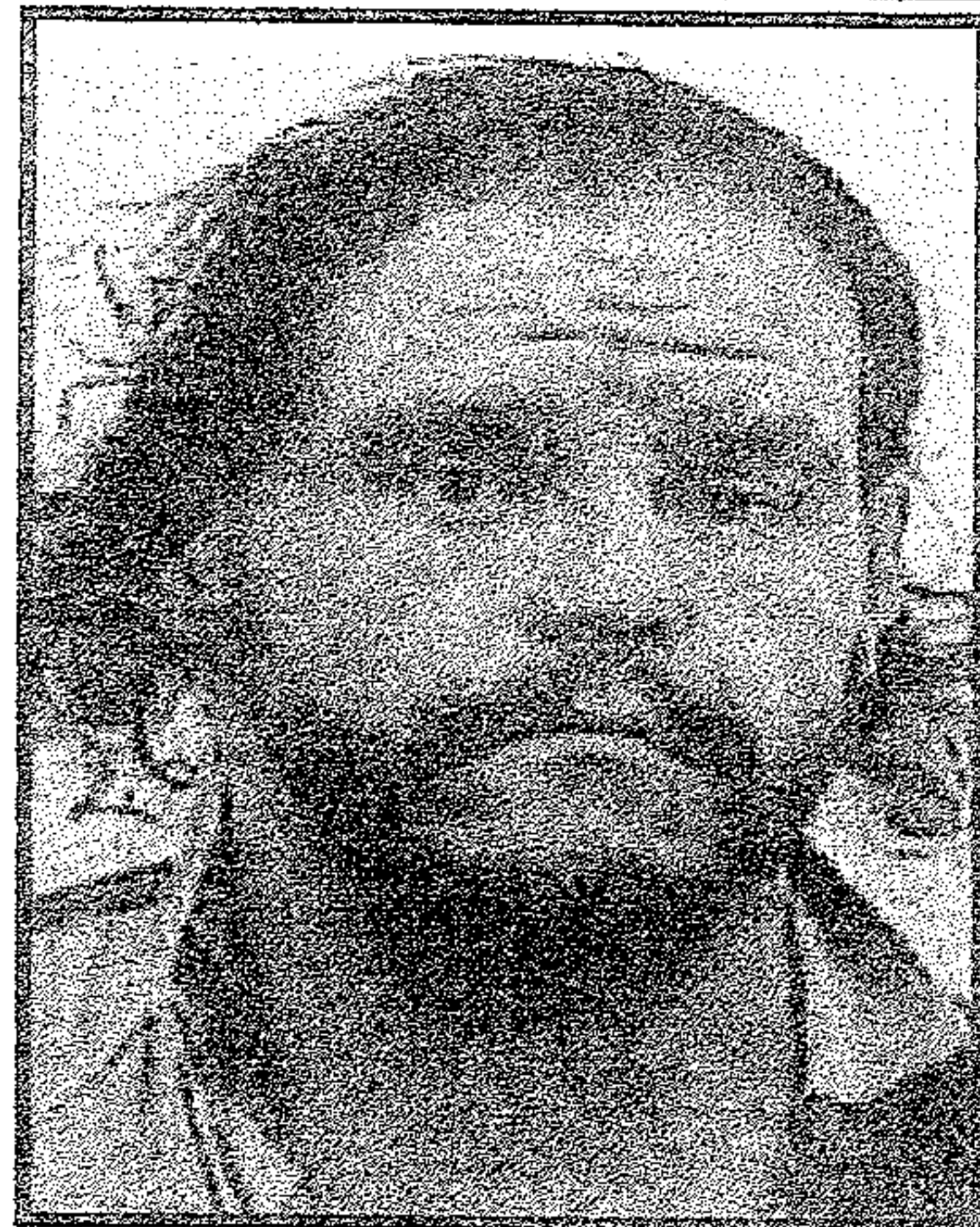

Upon doing a search, Deputy Gray found .08g of a white powdered substance believed to be cocaine in a folded up dollar bill and a hi-point 9mm c9 serial #P1334851, inside of Ms. Carmen Mora-Regalado purse. Officer Andrew Lee LCPD, found 8.1g of suspected cocaine in a bag and a German revolver with possible serial # FS-RLF8X6DFHW in the trunk of vehicle between the backseat and speaker next to the backseat passenger Mr. Ted Millsaps, in which the backseat had an open entrance to the trunk. All three suspects were taken into custody. Two other folded dollar bills with a white powdered substance were located on Ms. Carmen Mora-Regalado upon her arrival at the Loudon County Jail.

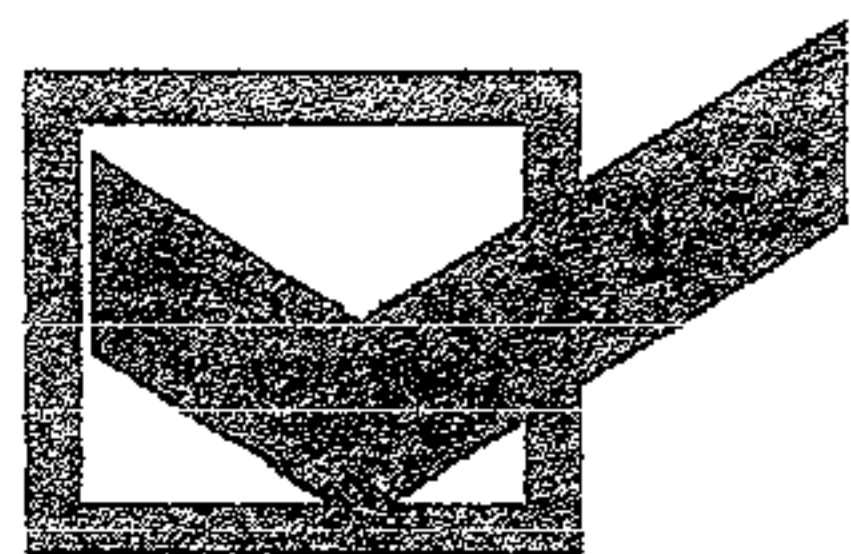
Deputy Rogers LCSO, observed a dark colored sedan traveling partially in his lane pass by while on Ford Rd. After turning around on the vehicle Deputy observed it to have a driver's side brake light out and traveling at approximately 75mph in a 35mph zone while on Town Creek Rd. Upon traffic stop Deputy immediately smelled an odor of an alcoholic beverage on the driver/offender and observed multiple opened alcoholic beverages in the back seat. While speaking with the offender Deputy observed him to have nystagmus in his left eye consistent with alcohol impairment.

Deputy M. Rodriguez also observed the offender's belligerent behavior and signs of impairment. The offender, Mr. Adam Houser, refused to exit the vehicle and had to be helped out; also refusing to answer any questions and continuously attempting to change the subject. Furthermore the offender refused to attempt S.F.S.T after being asked numerous times by Deputy Rodriguez and Rogers. Based on the totality of the circumstances Deputy

placed the offender under arrest for D.U.I and then read him TN. Implied Consent to which the offender refused to answer. While searching the vehicle Deputy also recovered 3 grams of marijuana and a bowl used to smoke the substance. The offender was also charged with Simple Possession, Drug Paraphernalia and cited with Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic, Light Law and Violation of Implied Consent.

United States are primarily caused by cigarettes and other combustible products. Yet, no form of tobacco product use is risk-free.

“The battle against tobacco use in this country is far from over,” said CDC Director Robert R. Redfield, MD. “Tobacco use remains the leading cause of preventable disease and death in the United States.”

Cigarettes still the most commonly used product; tobacco landscape continues to evolve

The study found that an estimated 50.6 million (20.8%) U.S. adults currently used a tobacco product in 2019. Most current tobacco product users (80.5%) reported using combustible products (cigarettes, cigars, or pipes), and cigarettes remained

the most commonly used tobacco product (14.0%), followed by e-cigarettes (4.5%). E-cigarette use was highest among adults 18-24 years old (9.3%), with more than half (56.0%) of these young adults reporting that they had never smoked cigarettes.

U.S. adults reported using various non-cigarette tobacco products, with e-cigarettes being the second most commonly used tobacco product (4.5%), followed by cigars (3.6%), smokeless tobacco (2.4%), and pipes (1.0%). Among adults who currently use tobacco products, 18.6% reported using two or more tobacco products.

Stephen Jenkins, 38, Brookfield Drive Clinton, was charged with Simple possession Sch. I x2, Sch. III, Sch. IV, Man/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Possession of Drug Para, and Window Tint

Officer Miller conducted a traffic stop on a white in color Dodge Magnum on the North bound get on Ramp of I-75 near Highway 321, for a window tint violation (14%).

Upon traffic stop Officer Miller made contact with the driver later identified as Mr. Stephen Jenkins. While speaking with Jenkins Officer Miller noticed what appeared to be some type of clear "dime bag" near the gear shifter inside of the vehicle.

the vehicle, Officer asked if he would empty his pockets at which time he did, and located was a orange needle cap. Officer Miller then received consent to search the vehicle.


A search of the vehicle revealed (0.5 Gram of a crystal like substance thought to be meth), (1.0 Gram of a brown substance Mr. Jenkins identified as Heroin), (7.8 Grams of Mushrooms "Shrooms"), (1 Buprenorphine "Suboxone" Pill), (15 Alprazolam "Xanax" Pills), (Three cut straws), (Two spoons), and (Several Needles).

All items were located in the center console of the vehicle. Also during the search of the vehicle a digital scale was located in the passengers seat.

The scale had white/brown residue on it. Mr. Jenkins was then placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

to persist," said Karen Hacker, MD, MPH, Director of CDC's National Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion. "There is still much more that needs to be done to protect everyone from the harmful effects of tobacco use."

By subpopulation groups, current use of any tobacco product in 2019 was highest among:

Males (26.2%)

Adults 25-44 years old (25.3%)

Non-Hispanic American Indian/Alaska Natives (29.3%)

Lesbian, gay, or bisexual adults (29.9%)

Adults 25 years old or older with a General Educational Development certificate (GED) (43.7%)

Adults with an annual household income less than \$35,000 (27.0%)

Adults living in the Midwest (23.7%) or the South (22.9%)

Uninsured adults (30.2%) or those with Medicaid (30.0%)

Adults with a disability (26.9%)

Adults divorced, separated or widowed (23.5%), or adults who were single, never married, or not living with a partner (23.0%)

Adults with mild (30.4%), moderate (34.2%), or severe

generalized anxiety disorder (45.3%)

What more can be done?

The implementation of comprehensive, evidence-based, population-level interventions, in coordination with regulation of tobacco products, can reduce the burden of tobacco-related disease and death in the United States. These evidence-based, population-level strategies include implementation of tobacco price increases, comprehensive smoke-free policies, high-impact antitobacco media campaigns, and barrier-free cessation coverage. As part of a comprehensive approach, targeted interventions also are warranted to reach subpopulations with the greatest burden of use, which might vary by tobacco product type.

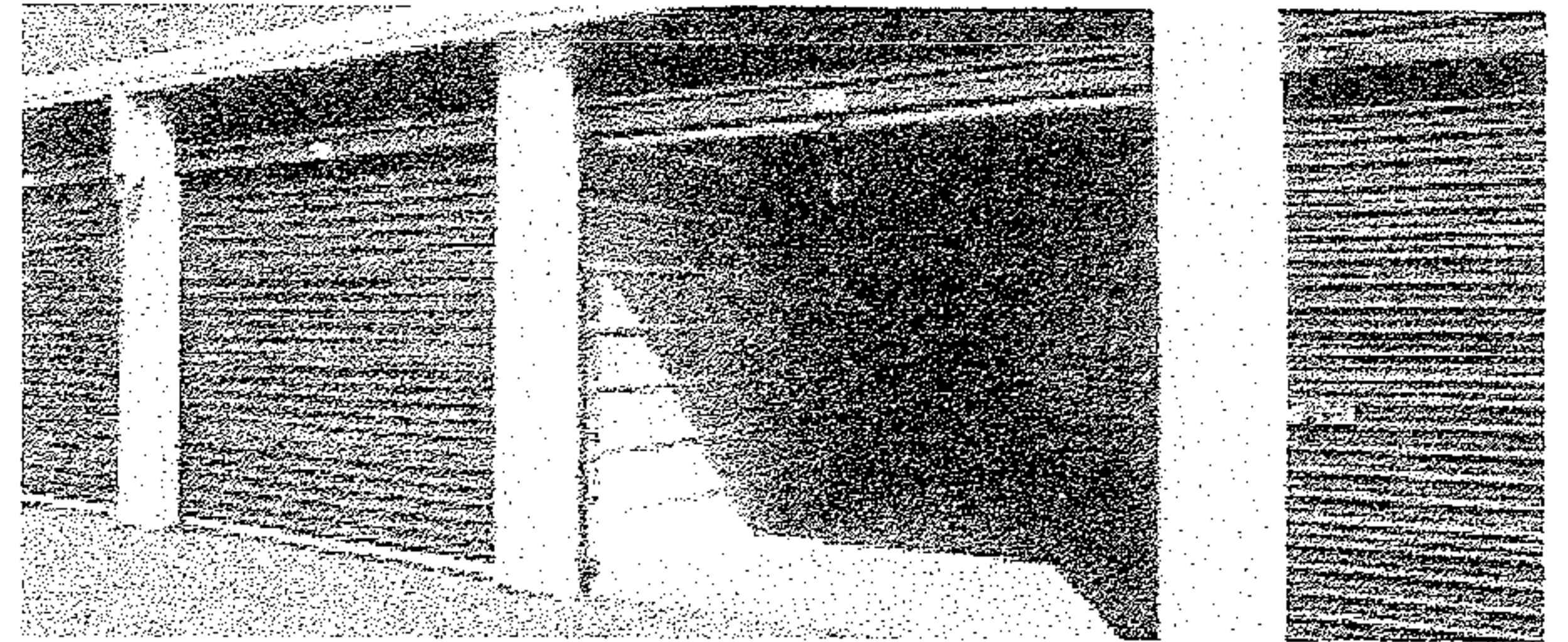
