

17, 2020 during which, Chief Justice Jeffrey S. Bivens urged judges across the state to reduce the jail populations in an effort to prevent the introduction and spread of COVID19 virus into our local jails. Afterward, the judges of the 9th Judicial District and the child support magistrate began to take steps to minimize the

jail populations. In a period of five business days, they were able to reduce the number of nonviolent offenders from the overall population in the district from 452 inmates down to 359 inmates. This represents a 21% reduction in the jail population. In doing so, they either reduced bonds or utilized release on own recognizance bonds from some nonviolent

misdemeanors and felony offenders, technical violations of probation, contempt of court for child support, and defendants with pre-existing medical conditions. All

defendants being held on contempt charges for child support were released from custody and sentences for some defendants serving time on misdemeanors and



violations of probation were suspended.

The judges of the 9th Judicial District plan to continue to ensure that nonviolent offender jail population of in our respective four counties are reduced in an effort to prevent the introduction and spread of the COVID19 virus into our local jails. Currently, there are 12 confirmed cases of COVID19 in our district (Loudon 8, Meigs 1, Morgan 1 and Roane 2) and these numbers have only slightly increased over the past week. Hopefully, we can do our part in preventing the virus from spreading into our local jails. At this time, due to the cooperation and efforts of our judges, there is no need to institute sweeping reforms and mandates. As such, all judges in the district will continue to utilize the following procedures, when possible, in order to balance the interests of justice with the interests of public health:

1. All judges in the district will continue to be responsible for setting bonds for wields. bonds for violations of probation

and any other warrant they approve through their respective courts. All judicial magistrates/commissioners shall continue to be responsible for setting bonds for any warrants they approve. In doing so, the objective should be to reduce the number of nonviolent offenders from the jail population, if possible.

2. For guidance, non violent offenders will include, but not be limited to, anyone who is not charged with an offense that is against the person as set forth in TCA 39-13-101 and 39-13-533, and those against children as set forth in TCA 39-15-401, 402, aggravated burglary, and all forms of domestic assault.

3. All judges in the district, relative to nonviolent offenders, should consider lowering the customary bond amounts, release on own recognizance bonds, bond reductions or eliminations, deferred sentences, and suspended sentences.

4. All judicial magistrates/commissioners in the district, relative to nonviolent offenders, should con-

sider lowering the customary bond amounts and if applicable, release on own recognizance bonds.

5. All judges should consider reviewing the daily jail inmate reports or rosters from their respective counties. All judges in the district should consider seeking input from their local Sheriff's department and defense counsel to determine if any nonviolent offenders incarcerated who are elderly or have preexisting conditions that make them more vulnerable to the COVID19 virus can be relesed on a medical furlough.

6. The terms of this plan shall remain in effect during the pendency of the Tennessee Supreme Court.
