Researchers Charged with Visa Fraud After Lying About Their Work for China's People's Liberation Army

China's San Francisco Consulate Harboring Known Fugitive from Justice

Four individuals have recently been charged with visa fraud in connection with a scheme to lie about their status as members of the People's Republic of China's military forces, the People's Liberation Army (PLA), while in the United States conducting research. Three of these individuals have been arrested

and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) is seeking the fourth who is a fugitive from justice currently being harbored at the Chinese Consulate in San Francisco.

In addition to these arrests, the FBI has recently conducted additional interviews of visa holders suspected of having undeclared affil-

iation with the Chinese military in more than 25 American cities.

"These members of China's People Liberation Army applied for research visas while hiding their true affiliation with the PLA," said Assistant Attorney General for National Security John C. De-

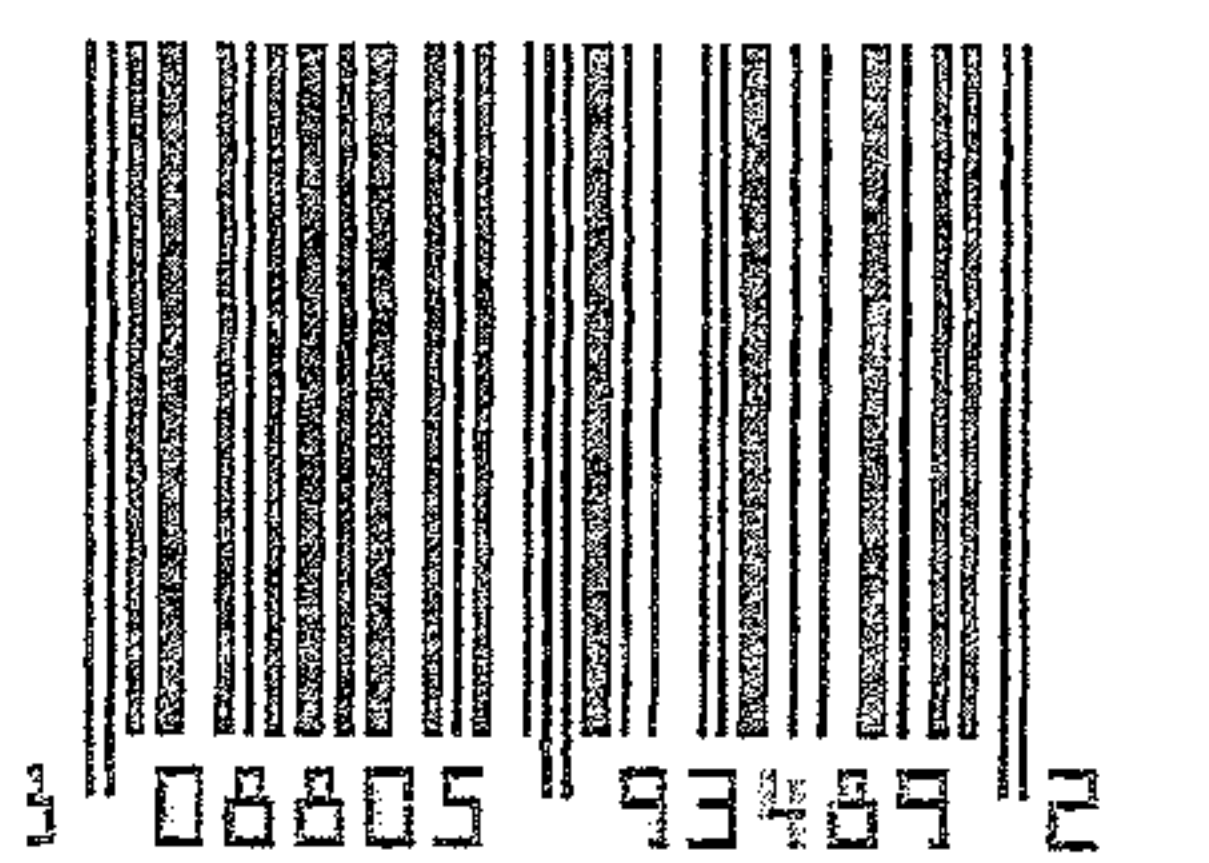

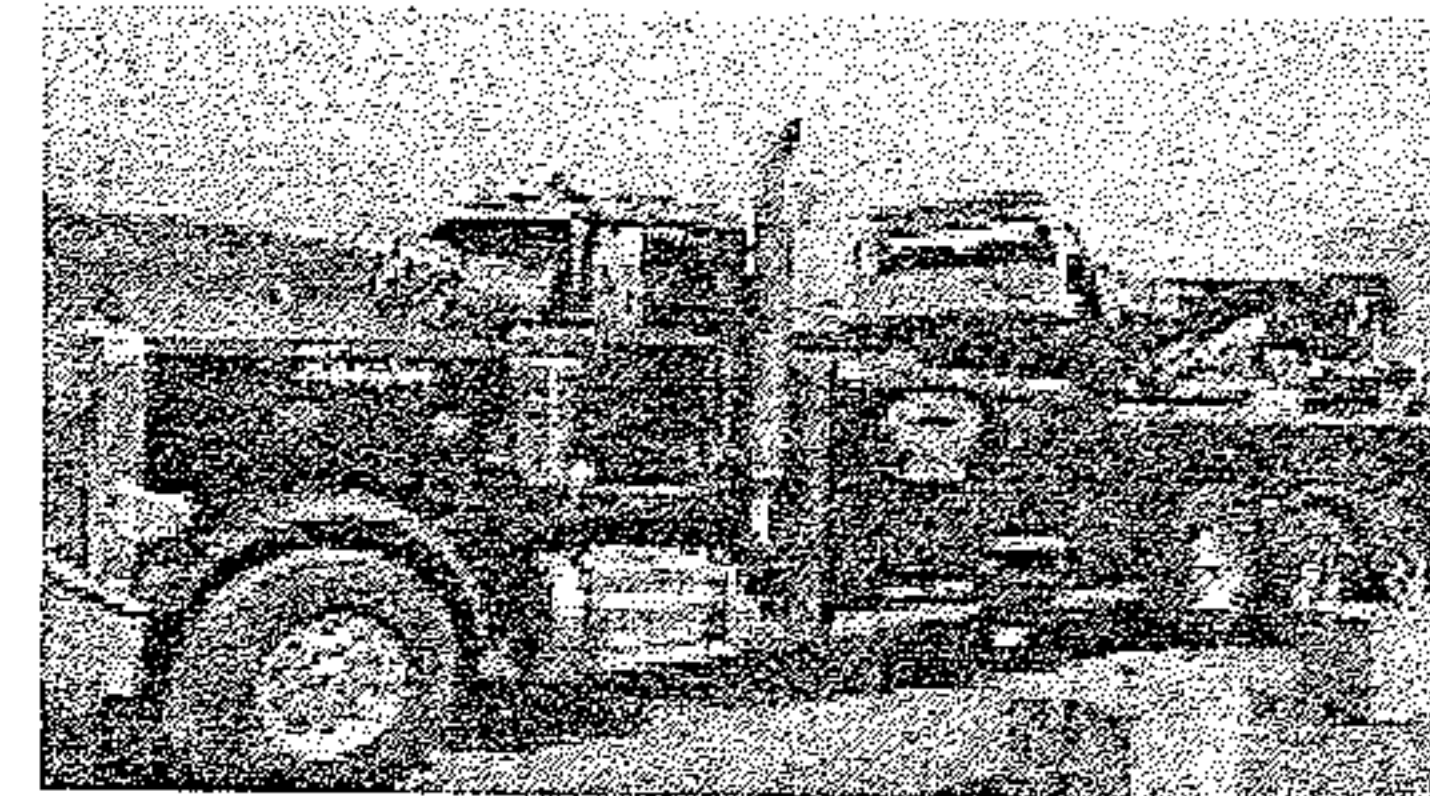

Glenn Feezell, 21, Ferry Street, was charged with Theft of Property, and Disorderly Conduct.

Amber Cox, 19, Ferry Street Loudon, was charged with Theft of Property.

Deputy Bengel 941, responded to Hwy 11 W (Walt Williams Car lot) in reference to an unwanted guest. Deputy arrived on scene and made contact with the Complainant. Deputy briefly spoke to Lindsey and attempted to make contact with the offenders on scene. Deputy pulled up to a female getting into her black Chrysler and activated his blue lights. The female refused to stop the car and attempted to turn around in the parking lot. Deputy approached the female, still inside the car, and ordered her out. The female, Amber Cox, was not cooperative and was detained. Deputy made contact with another Offender, Glenn Feezell, sitting inside a red Dodge pick-up. Deputy told Feezell to step out of the truck and he refused. Feezell was told multiple times to get out of the car and he refused to comply. The window was open about a 3rd of the way, Deputy reached in, unlocked the door and opened it. Feezell was removed from the vehicle and detained. Deputy again spoke

with complainant who stated that Feezell showed up at his business and attempted to steal a Red Dodge pick-up. The truck was previously repossessed from Feezell earlier and he was allowed to get his belongings from it while it was on the car lot. Law Enforcement was on scene and escorted Feezell off of the property and advised him that he would have to go to court to get his truck back. Feezell showed back up with a female, Amber Cox, and attempted to steal the repossessed Dodge pick-up. A male, later showed up with a female in a white Mazda pick-up to assist Feezell. Female recorded most of the incident on her cell phone. Complainant told all 4 subjects to leave the property to which they refused. The male could be heard on the video, that female recorded, saying that he would cut complainant throat. Feezell was taken into custody for Attempted Theft over \$2500 and Disorderly Conduct. Cox was taken into custody for Attempted Theft over \$2500. Female phone was seized for evidence. All 4 subjects were criminally trespassed from the property. Deputy called and spoke to Lt. Detective Cosner and made him aware of the incident. Deputy Mills transported both Cox and Holden to the Loudon County Jail. This did occur in Loudon County,

mers. "This is another part of the Chinese Communist Party's plan to take advantage of our open society and exploit academic institutions. We will continue to conduct this investigation together with the FBI."

"The United States welcomes students, academics, and researchers from across the globe. Today's announcement shows the extreme lengths to which the Chinese government has gone to infiltrate and exploit America's benevolence," said John Brown, Executive Assistant Director of the FBI's National Security Branch. "In interviews with members of the Chinese People's Liberation Army in over 25 cities across the U.S., the FBI uncovered a concerted effort to hide their true affiliation to take advantage of the United States and the American people."

Each defendant has been charged with visa fraud, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1546(a). If convicted, each faces a maximum statutory penalty of 10 years in prison and a fine of \$250,000. The alle-

gations against each are as follows:

Xin WANG

According to a complaint that was unsealed in the Northern District of California, on June 8, 2020 and court documents filed June 11, Wang entered the United States on March 26, 2019, after receiving a J1 non-immigrant visa in December of 2018. Wang's visa application stated that the purpose of his visit was to conduct scientific research at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF). Wang is alleged to have made fraudulent statements on this visa application. Specifically, Wang stated that

he had served as an Associate Professor in Medicine in the People's Liberation Army (PLA), from September 1, 2002 through September 1, 2016.

In reality, when interviewed by officers of Customs and Border Protection (CBP) at LAX on June 7, Wang provided information that he was, in fact, still currently a "Level 9" technician in the PLA, employed by a military university lab. CBP officers also obtained information that this roughly corresponded with the rank of Major. According to court documents, Wang was still employed

Melinda Black, 62, Spring Road Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, and Implied Consent. Officer Jordan Samuels LCPD, was dispatched to the US Cellular on Hwy 321 in reference to a suspicious person. Upon arrival Officer made contact with the female later identified as Melinda Black who was sitting in her vehicle with the engine running. While speaking with Black Officer noticed that she was lethargic, unsteady on her feet, and had very slow movement. Agent Fritts DTF, began speaking with Black, and noticed there was a powder residue in her left nostril. Officer ask Black to perform sobriety test, which she did poorly on. Black consented to blood draw. Once at the ER Black refused the testing. Melinda Black was then transported to the Loudon County Jail.

by the PLA while he was studying in the United States, and he made false statements about his military service in his visa application in order to increase the likelihood that he would receive his J1 visa.

Also according to court documents, Wang provided information to CBP that he had been instructed by his supervisor, the director of his military university lab in the PRC, to observe the layout of the UCSF lab and bring back information on how to replicate it in China. Wang similarly told his supervising UCSF professor that he had duplicated some of the work of that professor at the lab in China. Some of the work of the UCSF lab was funded by grants from the United States Department of Health and Human Services, National Institutes of Health (NIH).

Wang was arrested on June 7, and had his initial appearance on June 8. A grand jury in the Northern District of California returned an indictment on June 22.

Juan TANG

According to court documents unsealed in the Eastern District of California on July 20, Tang, a researcher at the University of California at Da-

vis, applied for a non-immigrant J1 visa on or about Oct. 28, 2019. The visa was issued in November 2019, and Tang entered the United States on or about Dec. 27, 2019. Tang is alleged to have made fraudulent statements on her visa application. Specifically, to the question, "Have you ever served in the military," Tang responded "No."




