





From the facebook community numerous fisherman stated they would like to be able to see if the lures they have lost over they years might be in the vehicle as well.





Robyn Roberts, 38, Laura Lane Friendsville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/ Resale Sch. I & II, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Domestic Violence.

According to the report, Deputy W. Jenkins LCSO, responded to Laura Ln. Greenback for a domestic. respect of the estate of Thomas Deputy made contact with G. Canan who died on the 30th the victim, and Robyn Roberts, offender. Roberts advised Deputy that she and the victim got into an argument and that she pushed her hand into the victims face.

> She also advised that her crack pipe was in the bathroom which was recovered

by Deputies. A metal spoon with residue on it was recovered from Roberts purse. Roberts stated that she uses the spoon to consume narcotics. Roberts was transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. Narcotics Deputy Marty Stanley weighed and tested the narcotics via TruNarc. The first bag weighed 0.9 grams and tested positive for a combination of Heroin, Fentanyl, and Cocaine. The rocks tested positive for cocaine and weighed in at 1.81 grams. A statement was collected from the victim. A DCS referral will be made do to a juvenile living in the house This did happen in Loudon County Tn.



Listening and acting quickly can save lives


Recognizing urgent maternal warning signs and getting an accurate and timely diagnosis can save lives during pregnancy and up to a year after delivery.

Makalia Robinson, 18, Ford Road Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession x2, Man/Sell/ Del/Resale Sch.!, Man/ Del/ Sale or Possession of Meth, Criminal Impersonation, and Poss.of Drug Para.

Cpl. Chris Jenkins LCSO, went to a dead-end road off of Hotchkiss Valley with no residences on the road. Cpl. observed a male and a female standing in front of the vehicle with the hood up and both at the engine compartment. Cpl. spoke with the female later identified as

Ms. Makalia Hope Robinson. Cpl. attempted to identify the male but he was being evasive about his identity. The male refused to look at Deputy and kept working under the hood of the vehicle. The male advised his name was Cody Allen and advised he did not know his Social Security Number. The male was later identified as Cody Allen Price. When other of-Point Road Vonore, was ficers arrived, Cpl.deployed K9 Deja to conduct a free air sniff of the vehicle. K9 Deja gave a positive indication of the odor of illegal narcotics coming from the vehicle. Approximately 0.66 grams of crystal methamphetamine, two baggies of Fentanyl weighing 2.32 grams and 1.92 grams, one baggy of Heroin with Fentanyl weighing 1.9 grams, one suboxone pills and a baggy of marijuana weighing 0.5 grams were found in a container under the hood of the vehicle. A baggy of marijuana weighing ap-




proximately 1.65 grams, two sets of digital scales, and additional baggies were found inside the vehicle. Neither subject claimed ownership of the narcotics. \$5,625 in US currency was found on Price's person which was subsequently seized. The drug items were tested using the TruNarc by Investigator Marty Stanley. This happened in Loudon County, TN. Both were transported to the Loudon County Jail.
