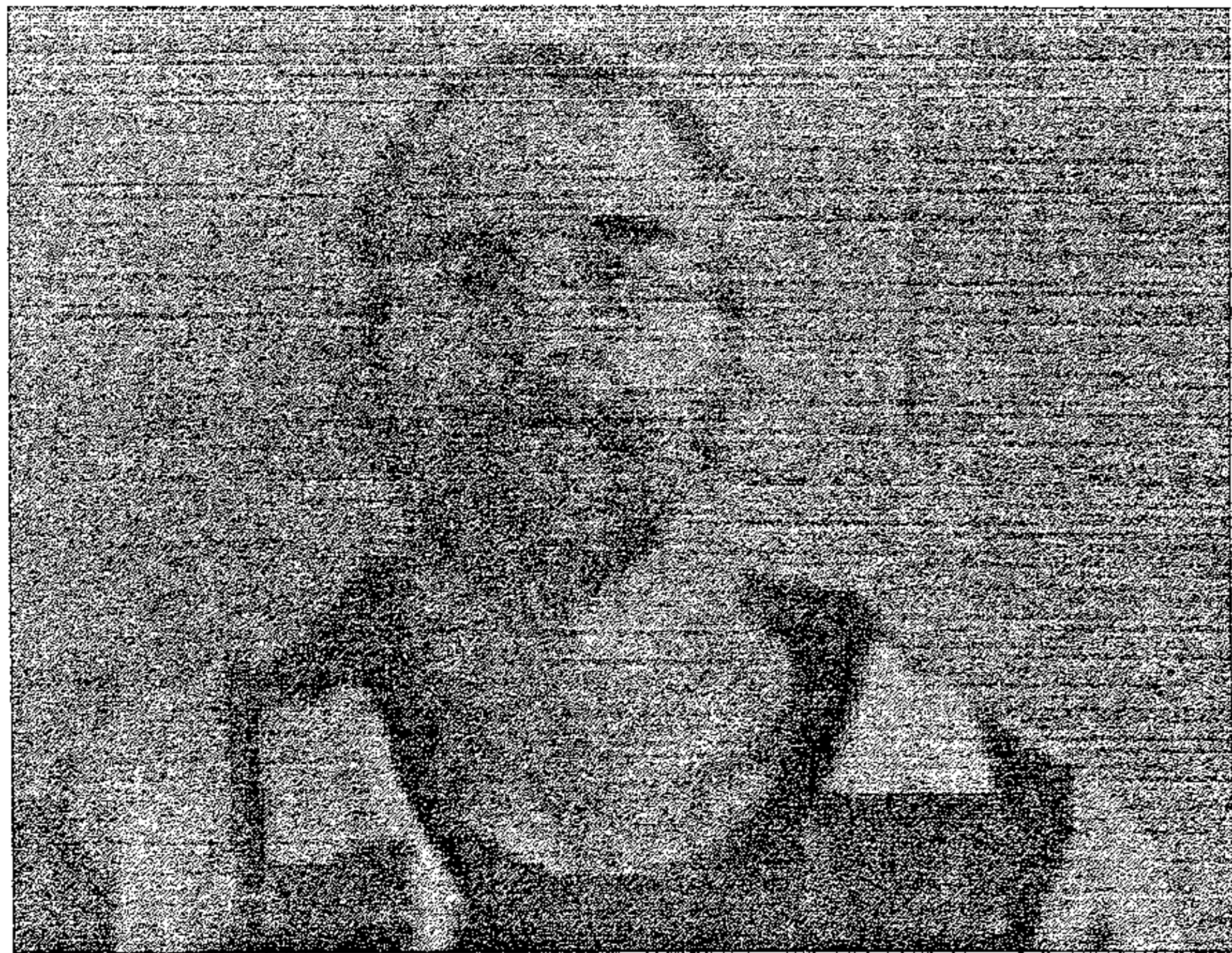

CDC Outbreak Investigations: New Salmonella Outbreak Linked to Bagged Peaches; Updates on Outbreak Linked to Onions

CDC has posted a new food safety alert for a Salmonella illness outbreak linked to bagged peaches, and updated recall information and case counts for a Salmonella outbreak linked to onions.

New Outbreak: Salmonella infections linked to bagged peaches (<https://www.cdc.gov/salmonella/enteritidis-08-20/index.html>)

CDC, FDA, and public health and regulatory officials in several states are investigating an outbreak of Salmonella infections that has sickened 68 people in nine states.

Many of the ill people report buying bagged peaches sold at ALDI grocery stores. Epidemiologic evidence indicates that bagged peaches are a likely source of this outbreak.

Do not eat, serve, or sell any recalled pdf iconexternal icon Wawona-brand bagged peaches purchased from ALDI locations in multiple states.

Throw the peaches away, even if some of them were eaten and no one has gotten sick.

An area that is known
Happy Hollow Road has
been known for criminal
activity over the years has
again made the news. This
time a meth dealer has been
charged.

Randy Eubanks, 53, Hap-
py Hollow Road Lenoir City,
was charged with Man/Del/
Sale or Poss. of Meth, Driv-
ing on Revoked/Suspended
License, Poss. Of Sch. IV,
&II, & VI, Violation of Pro-
bation, and Contraband in a
Penal Institution.

According to the report,
Dep. A. Parton LCSO, ob-
served a black Chevy Cav-
alier traveling on Hotchkiss
Valley Road East with a li-
cense plate that belonged
on a red Buick. Deputy
observed the vehicle then
pulled off the road at Happy
Hollow Road. Deputy then
turned around and spoke to
the driver now identified
as Randy Eubanks and the
passenger a female. Ran-
dy Eubanks handed Deputy
a Tennessee Identification
card and stated that he did
not have a drivers license.
Deputy then asked the fe-
male if she had a drivers
license and she stated that
she did. Upon checking both
subjects through Loudon
County Dispatch, Depu-
ty was advised that the fe-
male had a warrant out of
Hawkins County for theft.
Deputy then asked Randy
Eubanks if he had anything
on his person and he stated
that he did not. Deputy then
asked him if he would care
to empty out his pockets
and he stated that he didn't

mind. He then pulled out a
pill container and Deputy
asked him if what was in it.
He stated that he had some
Suboxone and some other
pills inside.

Deputy asked him if he
could look inside and he
stated that he could. Deputy
located two Suboxone pills,
fifteen and a half Xanax
pills, and one unidentified
purple pill. Randy Eubanks

then stated that he had a joint
inside of his cigarette pack.
Deputy then placed Ran-
dy Eubanks in custody and
transported them to Loudon
County Jail. Once inside it
was discovered that Ran-
dy Eubanks had 2.32 grams
of methamphetamine in his
coin pocket. Hawkins Coun-
ty picked the female up at the
jail. This did occur in Loudon
County, Tennessee.

Charged

Daniel Carver, 39, Circle Drive Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault.

According to the report, Deputy Marshall Lynn LCSO, was notified, via Loudon County E911 dispatchers, of an altercation between a male and female, at the intersection of Circle Drive and Steekee Road. Deputy arrived on scene and made contact with the victim, who stated she and her husband, suspect Daniel Carver, were involved in a verbal argument, which became physical when she attempted to leave.

Victim further stated Daniel Carver picked her up "like a sack of potatoes" and threw her over his shoulder to prevent her from leaving, grabbed her and pulled her by the hair, in attempt to prevent her from making contact with a neighbor, and hung on to her hair, through

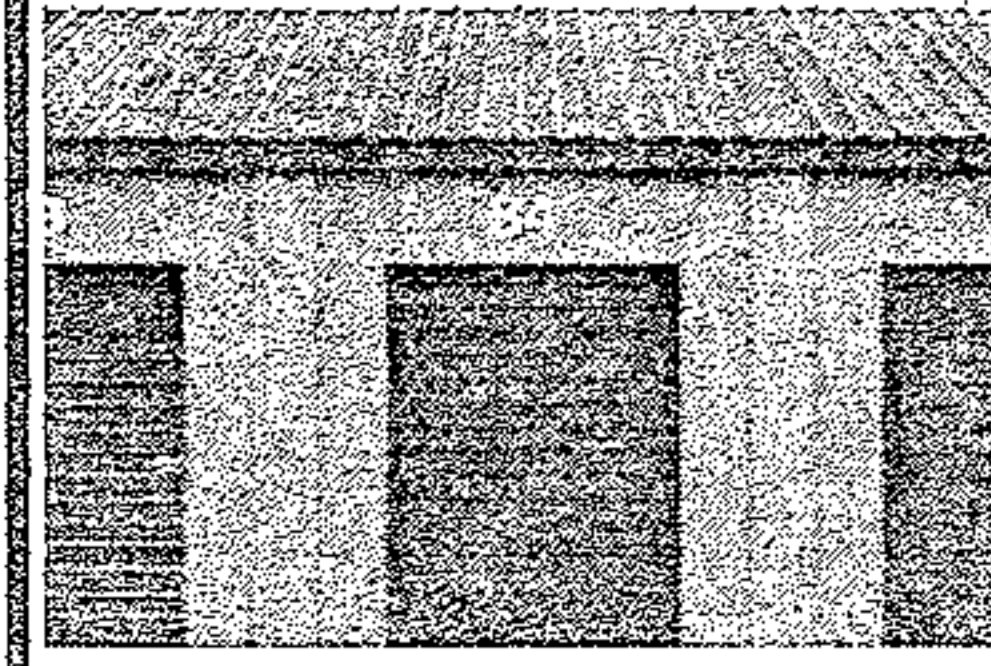
the window of a white Trailblazer, as she was attempting to drive away. Deputy made contact with Daniel Carver and observed blood on both of his upper arms, as well as blood on the driver's side door, of the white Trailblazer. Daniel Carver stated he was attempting to reach through a crack in the window and unlock the vehicle's door, as victim was leaving.

Daniel Carver also admitted to grabbing Katherine Lambert by the hair and added that he wrapped her up. Based on evidence at the scene, Daniel Carver was determined to be the primary aggressor, arrested, and transported to the Loudon County Justice Center for further processing. The items were also available for purchase through Instacart, a grocery delivery service.

Do not eat food made with these peaches.

Fourteen people have been hospitalized; no deaths have been reported.

This investigation is ongoing to determine if other products or retailers are linked to illness.

Update: Salmonella infections linked to onions (<https://www.cdc.gov/salmonella/newport-07-20/index.html>)

Since the last update on August 7, 2020, an additional 229 ill people have been reported in this outbreak, including from four new states: Arkansas, Hawaii, Rhode Island, and Texas.

A total of 869 ill people have been reported from 47 states, including 116 people who have been hospitalized. No deaths have been reported.

Do not eat, serve, or sell recalled onions from Thomson International, Inc., and

other companies, or foods made with recalled onions. Recalled onion types include red, white, yellow, and sweet yellow varieties.

Foods made with recalled onions such as cheese dips or spreads, salsas, and chicken salads have also been recalled. Foods were sold at multiple grocery store chains.

On August 12, cheese dips and spreads were recalled from the following stores: Kroger external icon, Kroger Mid-Atlantic external icon, Kroger Delta Division external icon, Fry's Food Stores external icon, Fred Meyer external icon, and Smith's external icon.

Epidemiologic and traceback information showed that red onions are a likely source of this outbreak. Due to the way onions are grown and harvested, other onion types, such as white, yellow, or sweet yellow, may also be contaminated.

This investigation is ongoing. CDC will provide more information as it becomes available.

About Salmonella:

Most people infected with Salmonella develop diarrhea, fever, and stomach cramps 12-72 hours after eating contaminated food.

The illness usually lasts 4 to 7 days, and most people

recover without treatment.

See your healthcare provider if you are concerned about symptoms, such as a high fever (temperature over 102°F), blood in your poop, diarrhea, or frequent vomiting that prevents keeping liquid down.




