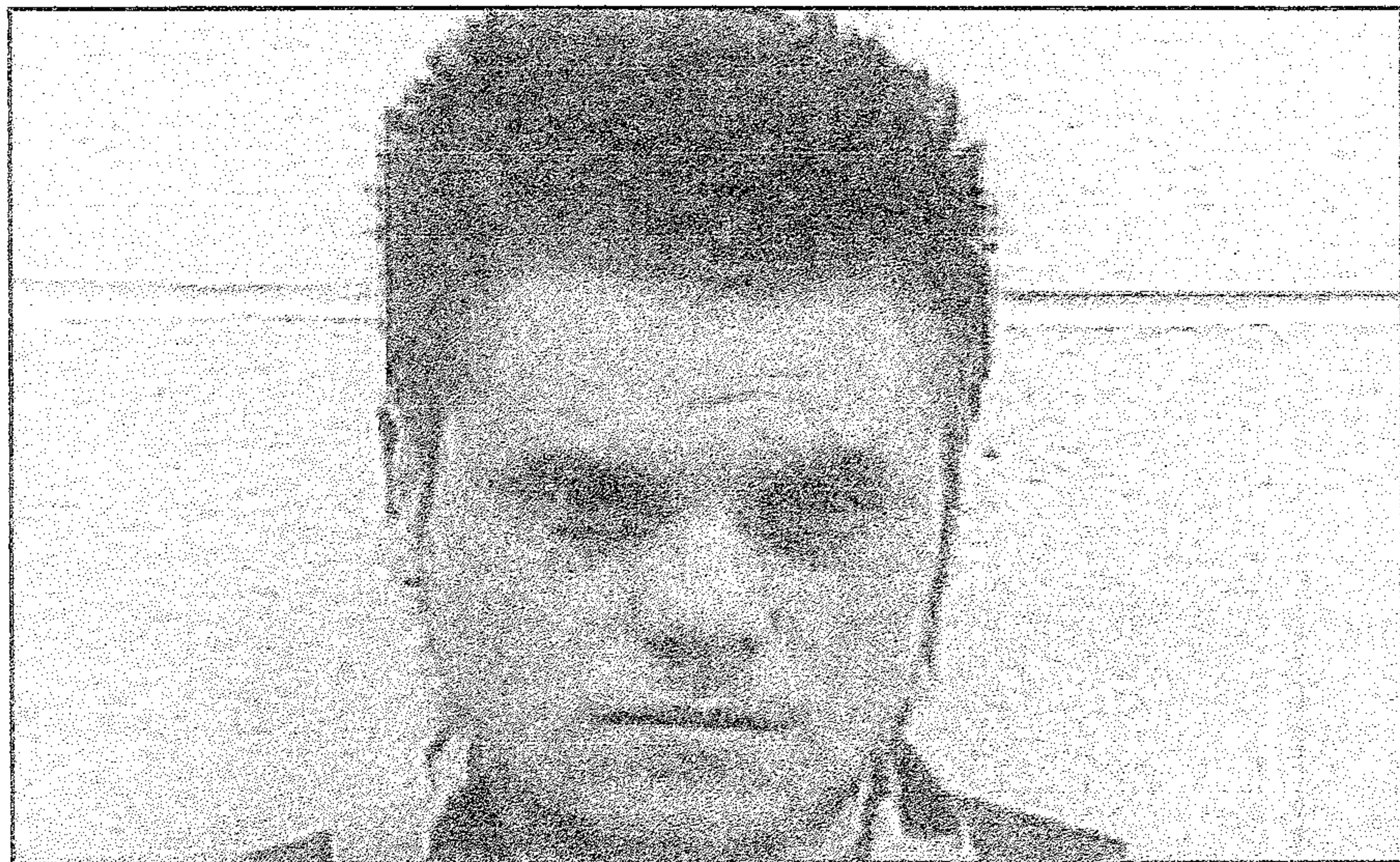

Pair Sentenced For Two Counts of Rape In The National Park

Dusty William Oliver, 41, and Richard Graham, 49, both from Blaine, were sentenced by the Honorable Judge Thomas A. Varlan, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Knoxville, for raping two men in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park (GSMNP). Oliver and Graham

pleaded guilty to an indictment charging them with two counts of aggravated sexual abuse in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2241(a) and 2. Oliver was sentenced to 300 months in prison, followed by 15 years' supervised release. Graham was sentenced to 230 months in prison, followed by 15 years' supervised release.

Both Oliver and Graham will be required to register with state sex offender registries and comply with special sex offender conditions during their supervised release.

In June 2012 and again in November

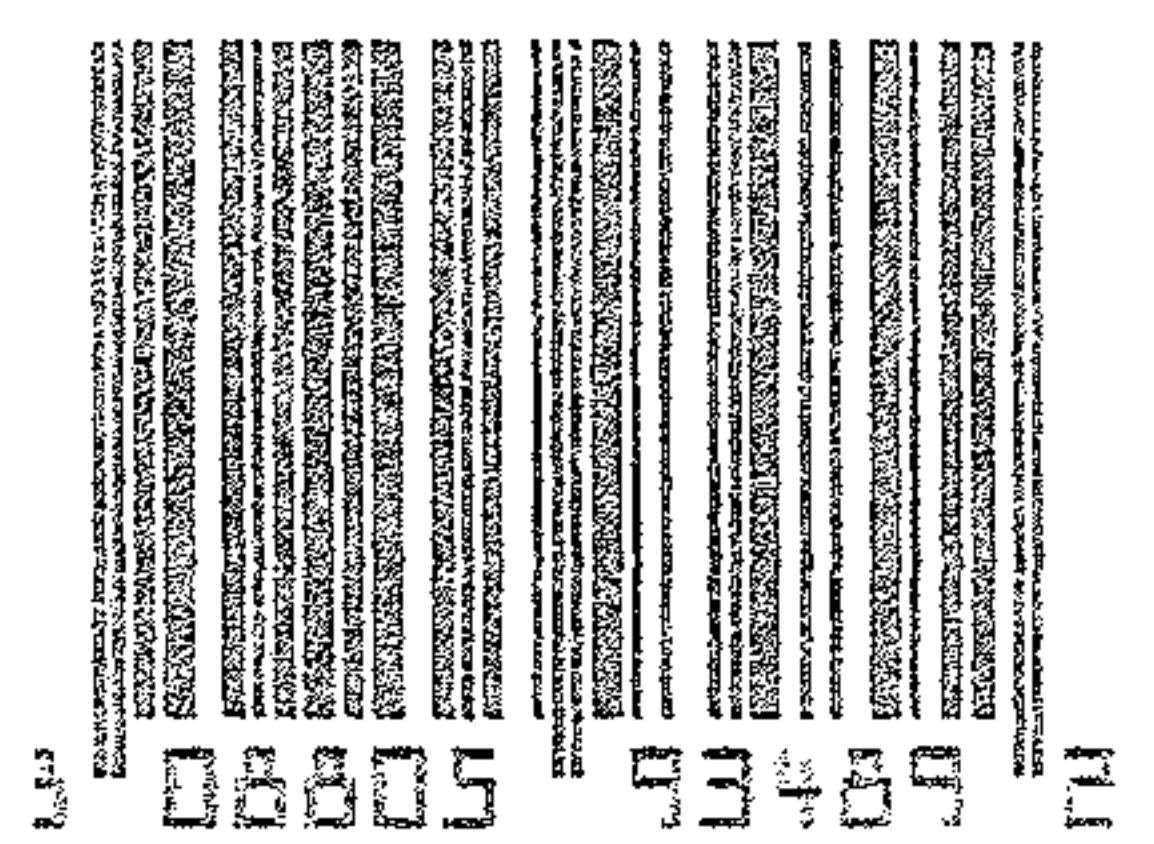
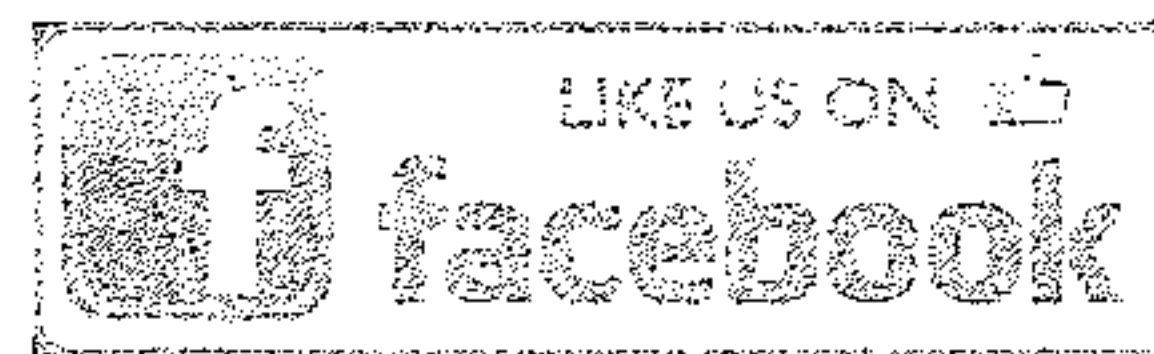

Charges

Cody Chastain, 29, Homeless Loudon, was charged with Reckless Driving x2, Reckless Endangerment x 4, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License x3, False Imprisonment, Evading Arrest x 5, Vandalism, Theft of Property x2Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Corporal Z. Frye LCSO, observed a white Buick sedan traveling on Hwy 70 East at a high rate of speed. Once behind the vehicle Deputy paced the vehicle at approximately 110 MPH. Deputy attempted a traffic stop at Hwy 70 and Creekwood Park Blvd. The vehicle did not stop and accelerated in an attempt to evade arrest. Deputy

initiated pursuit and the vehicle continued through the intersection at Hwy 70 and Hwy 321 and into Roane County with speeds ranging from 45MPH to 120MPH. The vehicle drove into the oncoming traffic lane on multiple occasions at speeds over 100MPH. The vehicle then drove through multiple yards at which point the driver then drove the vehicle into a tree, causing significant damage to the front of the car, at Kingston Hwy. The driver, Cody Chastain, exited the vehicle and fled on foot after Deputy gave multiple commands for him to stop. The passenger, remained in the vehicle. The passenger stated that he asked

the driver on multiple occasions to stop the vehicle and let him out but the driver continually refused his requests and stated he was not going to stop because he had warrants. The registered owner of the vehicle, the mother of the passenger. A K9 track was conducted but was unsuccessful in locating the driver. Cody Chastain was located later and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Sex

Diann Egres, 74, Coyatee Shores Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault. Deputy Rogers LCSO, was dispatched to a domestic disturbance at Coyatee Shores. Upon arrival Deputy made

contact with the complainant Ms. Diann Egres who was visibly upset. Diann stated she was mad at the victim because they had not had sex in 20 years and that she did not like what he was viewing on the internet. Diann unplugged her husband's computer, took it and then started a verbal argument with him. Diann said the argument then moved downstairs where it became physical at which time victim tried to rape her. Diann also stated that victim stopped when she told him he had hurt her back. Deputy then spoke to victim who stated that his wife did become angry when she questioned him about why they did not have a physically intimate relationship and told him he needed to leave. Victim did leave the room and began down the stairs when his wife threw a

hard glass drink and hit him. She then followed him down the stairs and grabbed him by the face scratching him to the point he was dripping blood. Diann then picked up a pot and began hitting him with it at which time victim pushed his wife away from him and into the couch. He then helped her back up after she told him she hurt her back. Said hard glass was found on the stairs and the pot was found down stairs where the physical altercation occurred. Deputy spoke

with both subjects several times and Diann testimony changed and she often became confused when asked why she was contradicting herself. After speaking with other Deputies on scene and an Investigator it was determined based on the totality of the circumstances that Ms. Egres was the offender in this domestic assault. Deputy did take Ms. Egres into custody and transported her to the Loudon County Jail. Said did occur in Loudon County, TN.

Robin Portillo, 32, Old Rutledge Pike Knoxville, was charged with Driving Without a Valid License, Theft of Property, Simple Possession, Possession of a Firearm, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Terrick Godbolt, 39, Old Rutledge Pike Knoxville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II, Possession of a Firearm, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Poss. Of Drug Para., Simple Possession, Tampering/Fabricating with Evidence, and Theft of Property.

Officer A. Lee LCPD, was dispatched to a reckless driver that had pulled into the Loves Truck Stop. Dispatch advised a Red Ford Mustang was driving poorly. Officer located the vehicle as it was leaving Loves

and initiated a traffic stop. The driver, Robin Portillo, advised she did not have a valid license and the vehicle was uninsured. As Officer was speaking with Portillo he could smell a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. Godbolt admitted to having marijuana "roach-es" in the vehicle. During a search of the vehicle Officer located a Sig Sauer P365 handgun S/N: 66A513676 and ammunition in the glovebox. A records check through dispatch revealed the handgun was stolen. Officer placed Portillo and Godbolt into custody. Officer A. Bialek noticed a small zippered pouch at Godbolts feet. Inside the pouch was 7.5 grams of methamphetamine, 0.9 grams of fentanyl, and 1.1 grams of marijuana. All substances were confirmed by TruNarc test. Godbolt knowingly concealed evidence with intent to hin-

der the investigation. In furtherance of the lawful search Officer located digital scales and several small baggies believed to be used by the Offenders for the sell and/or delivery of methamphetamine and fentanyl while in possession of a firearm. Godbolt and Portillo were transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. All the above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, TN

Rape

2015, Oliver and Graham raped two different male victims in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. The defendants preyed on homeless, drug-addicted, heterosexual males, who they believed were unlikely to report their attacks to law enforcement. After quickly befriending their victims on the roadside in Knoxville, they took the victims to the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. Each victim was tricked into hiking unfamiliar trails in pitch darkness, whereon they were raped by both defendants at once.

The defendants escaped prosecution for their crimes until a tenacious investigation by special agents with the U.S. Department of Interior National Park Service in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park devel-

oped prosecutable cases against them. "The defendants exploited vulnerable victims; however, the victims were brave enough to come forward and report their attacks. The victims' cooperation throughout the investigation and prosecution was necessary, and I commend them for seeing it through. The hefty sentences should serve as a warning to others that one will pay heavily for committing violent crimes in our national parks," said U.S. Attorney J. Douglas Overbey.

"I want to express my thanks to ISB investigators, park rangers, and the Blount


County Sheriff's Office for their perseverance and hard work that led to the conviction and sentencing of these two men responsible for heinous crimes within the park," said Superintendent Cassius Cash. "To ensure that we've heard the voices of all victims, investigators continue to welcome any information

about additional assaults that may be associated with Graham and Oliver."

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the U.S. Department of Interior National Park Service for the GSMNP.

Assistant United States Attorney Jennifer Kolman represented the United States.
