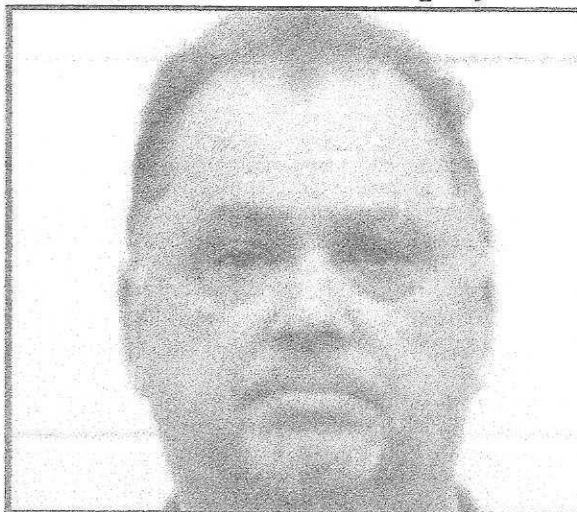

Convicted Knoxville Gang Leader Sentenced To Life Plus Ten Years For Drugs, Firearm, And Money Laundering Crimes

Alim J. Turner, 23, of Knoxville, was sentenced to life plus ten years in prison, by the Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Knoxville.

The sentencing follows Turner's federal trial last July in which a jury convicted him and six oth-

er gang members of conspiring to distribute various controlled substances, including methamphetamine, heroin, fentanyl, marijuana, oxycodone, alprazolam, and buprenorphine. Witnesses testified at trial that Turner was the Knoxville leader of a violent street gang known as the Unknown Ghost Vice Lords. The jury also convicted Turner

and other defendants of conspiracy to commit money laundering. In addition, Turner and other defendants were convicted of counts charging the possession of firearms in furtherance of drug trafficking, the illegal distribution of drugs, and unlawful possession of firearms in

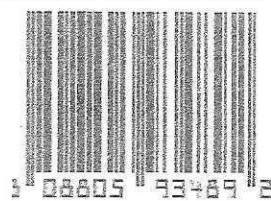
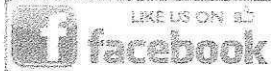

James Lebus, 28, River Sound Drive Knoxville, was charged with Criminal Impersonation, and Contraband in a Penal Institution.

Officer T. Eldridge LCPD, responded to a possible overdose call at Hillside Ln. Upon arrival, Officers made contact with a male subject (Lebus) who led officers upstairs to the location in which the possible overdose occurred. After checking on the overdose victim Officers began identifying all parties involved at the crime scene and a records check revealed the male subjects information to come back "Not on File" Officer Eldridge then went to locate the male and was advised by EMS that he just went out of the front door of the house. Officers then observed Lebus fleeing the scene in a silver Ford Fiesta (39AU81) and heading towards Browder Hollow Rd.

Officers located the vehicle on Browder Hollow at Hwy 11 and initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle. Convicted Knoxville Gang Leader Sentenced To Life Plus Ten Years For Drugs, Firearm, And Money Laundering Crimes

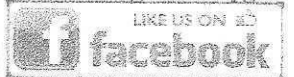
Alim J. Turner, 23, of Knoxville, was sentenced to life plus ten years in prison, by the Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Knoxville.

The sentencing follows Turner's federal trial last July in which a jury convicted him and six oth-

er gang members of conspiring to distribute various controlled substances, including methamphetamine, heroin, fentanyl, marijuana, oxycodone, alprazolam, and buprenorphine. Witnesses testified at trial that Turner was the Knoxville leader of a violent street gang known as the Unknown Ghost Vice Lords. The jury also convicted Turner

and other defendants of conspiracy to commit money laundering. In addition, Turner and other defendants were convicted of counts charging the possession of firearms in furtherance of drug trafficking, the illegal distribution of drugs, and unlawful possession of firearms in
