Resisting Just Adds To Charges for Local Man

Russian National Extradited for Role in Hacking and Illegal Trading Scheme

Defendant among five charged in multi-million dollar scheme to trade based on inside information stolen from U.S. computer networks

A Russian national has been extradited to the United States from Switzerland to face charges relating to his alleged involvement in a global scheme to trade on non-public information stolen from U.S. computer networks that netted tens of millions of dollars in illegal profits. Four other Russian nationals were also

charged as part of the scheme.

Vladislav Klyushin, also known as "Vladislav Kliushin," 41, of Moscow, Russia, was arrested in Sion, Switzerland on March 21, 2021 and was extradited to the United States on Dec. 18. Charges were unsealed this morning in U.S. District Court in Massachusetts. Klyushin is charged with

conspiring to obtain unauthorized access to computers, and to commit wire fraud and securities fraud, and with obtaining unauthorized access to computers, wire fraud and securities fraud. He will appear later this morning in federal court in Boston.

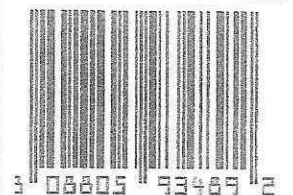

Deputy Branson LCSO, observed a maroon Dodge Ram displaying TN tag L25-78E traveling South in Hwy 411 S. near Cope Rd. Deputy observed the vehicle cross the white line 3 times. 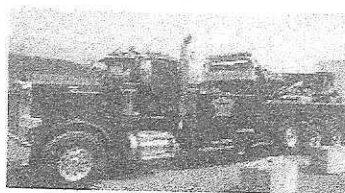

Ethan Walls, 21, Pinecrest Circle Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault, and Resisting Arrest.

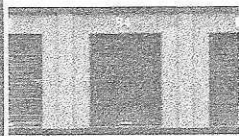
Deputy Rodriguez LCSO, responded to Pinecrest Circle in regards to an active physical domestic. The caller advised her husband is highly intoxicated and is physically assaulting her. Upon the officer's arrival, they came in contact with Ethan Walls, Suspect/Arrestee, who was sitting down in the child's bedroom and appeared highly intoxicated. Due to the severity of the call and the suspect being highly intoxicated, Deputy attempted to detain the individual for officer safety. The Suspect started to resist and officers eventually were successful in detaining the Suspect. Officers attempted to walk the Suspect out of the residence and place him in the back of his squad car. He continued to resist so they decided to have the Priority medical

unit transport the Suspect to Fort Loudon Medical Center due to the amount of alcohol consumed. Officer spoke to the Suspect's wife/victim, and she advised he drank an entire bottle of vodka, was being belligerent, and was outside of the residence being loud. She attempted to get him in the house and after many attempts, she finally convinced him to go in the house. He got up acted like he was gonna go inside but he decided to punch the victim in the back of the head with a closed fist. An argument sparked and they ended up in the residence. When they entered the residence he fell, got back up on his feet, and threw a chair at the Victim. He advised the Victim she was going to be the reason the kids died tonight. Due to the Suspect being highly intoxicated, physical with officers, along with the Victim statement we deemed Mr. Walls to be the primary aggressor, and was placed in custody.

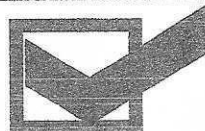

known as "Ivan Yermakov," 35, and Nikolai Rumiantcev, also known as "Nikolay Rumyantsev," 33, both of Moscow, Russia, are charged in the District of Massachusetts with conspiring to obtain unauthorized access to computers, and to commit wire fraud and securities fraud and with obtaining unauthorized access to computers, wire fraud and securities fraud. Ermakov, a former officer in the Russian Main Intelligence Directorate (GRU), a military intelligence agency of the General Staff of the Armed Forces of the Russian Federation, was previously charged in July 2018 in federal court in Washington, D.C. for his alleged role in a hacking and influence effort related to the 2016 U.S. elections. In October 2018, Ermakov was also charged in federal court in Pittsburgh in connection with his alleged role in hacking and related disinformation operations targeting international anti-doping agencies, sporting federations, and anti-doping officials.

Mikhail Vladimirovich Irzak,

also known as "Mikka Irzak," 43, and Igor Sergeevich Sladkov, 42, both of St. Petersburg, Russia, are also charged in the District of Massachusetts with conspiracy to obtain unauthorized access to computers, and to commit wire fraud and securities fraud, and with securities fraud.

Ermakov, Rumiantcev, Irzak and Sladkov remain at large.

Acting United States Attorney Nathaniel Mendell stated, "The integrity of our nation's capital markets and of its computer networks are priorities for my office. Today's charges show that we, the FBI, and our other law enforcement partners will relentlessly pursue those who hack, steal and attempt to profit from inside information, wherever they may hide."

"Today's announcement and the extradition of Vladislav Klyushin is just one more example of how the FBI and our partners are working around the clock and around the world to counter the cyber threat that we face today," said Albert Murray III, Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the FBI Washing-

ton Field Office Criminal and Cyber Division. "As alleged, Klyushin and his co-defendants used various illegal and malicious means to gain access to computer networks to perpetrate their illegal trading scheme. These crimes have real consequences. And, as our efforts in this case demonstrate, the FBI is relentless in our work to identify and locate criminals like Klyushin—no matter where they are—and bring them to the U.S. to face justice."

According to the charging documents, Klyushin, Ermakov and Rumiantcev worked at M-13, an information technology company based in Moscow, where Klyushin served as the company's first deputy general director. M-13 purported to offer penetration testing and "Advanced Persistent Threat (APT) emulation"—both services that seek exploitable vulnerabilities in a computer system, purportedly for defensive purposes. M-13's website indicated that the company's "IT solutions" were used by "the Administration of the President of the Russian Federation,

the Government of the Russian Federation, federal ministries and departments, regional state executive bodies, commercial companies and public organizations." In addition to these services, Klyushin, Ermakov and Rumiantcev also allegedly offered investment management services through M-13 to investors in exchange for up to 60 percent of the profit

Between at least in or about January 2018 and September 2020, Klyushin, Ermakov, Irzak, Sladkov and Rumiantcev allegedly agreed to trade in the securities of publicly traded companies based on material non-public information ("MNPI") about the earnings of those companies, in advance of the public announcements of financial results. The MNPI was allegedly acquired through unauthorized intrusions into the computer networks of two U.S.-based filing agents (Filings Agents 1 and 2)—vendors that publicly traded companies used to make quarterly and annual filings through the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC).

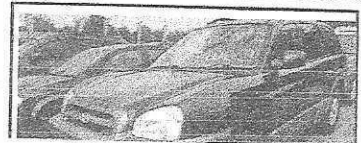

Franklin Major, 39, Vale Street Loudon, was charged with Criminal Court Capias x4, Aggravated Assault, Resisting Arrest, Reckless Endangerment, Evading Arrest, and Theft of Property.

Katherine Finn, 42, Floyd Street Smyrna, was charged with General Session and Criminal Court Capias.

Loudon County Deputy Clay Jenkins approached a blue and Maroon Lincoln Navigator parked near the air pump at Weigel's located at Highway 72, in Loudon, Tennessee. The driver of the vehicle was known to Deputy Jenkins as Franklin Majors who had outstanding warrants issued by the Criminal Court of Loudon County for failure to appear. Deputy Jenkins identified the passenger of the vehicle as Katherine Finn. After receiving verification that both

Frank Majors and Katherine Finn had active warrants in Loudon County, Deputy Jenkins attempted to take Frank Majors into custody. Frank Majors began actively resisting Deputy Jenkins and while combating the arrest, Frank Majors entered the driver's compartment of the vehicle, started the vehicle, and placed the vehicle in reverse. Deputy Jenkins was actively attempting to remove Frank Majors from the vehicle when he accelerated in reverse striking Deputy Jenkins with the driver's door causing him to fall into the island surrounding the air pump. Deputy Jenkins regained his balance, moved to the end of the island in the parking lot, and gave verbal commands for Frank Majors to stop the vehicle. Frank Majors accelerated forward forcing Deputy Jenkins to take evasive actions to prevent being struck by the front of the vehicle as it progressed forward. As the vehicle was coming towards Deputy Jenkins, he fired his sidearm into the front passenger tire attempting to stop the threat of being seriously injured or causing his death. During the aggressive operation of the vehicle, Katherine Finn was in the immediate area of the Driver's side of the vehicle causing her to be in danger of being struck by the aggressive motion.
