

Officer H. Wilkes LCPD, was dispatched to Home Depot in reference to a shoplifting. Upon arrival, Officer met with AP staff to gain information. AP stated that a male came into the business and purchased three items using a Debit Card (US Visa x7279), an Amazon Echo, a wireless adapter, and construction wire. The male went to his truck and dropped the items off, and returned back to the business with the receipt. The male then went and picked up the same items off of the shelves again, and filed a return for those items using his receipt. The money was granted back to the male through

his debit card (\$160.59 total before tax). The above offender did have the intent to deprive Home Depot of their merchandise. During investigation, Officer was able to identify the male offender as Albert Thomas Yberra (suspended drivers license status), who was driving his registered vehicle, a 1996 Dodge Ram 1500 (DWW-732). The offender left towards Simpson Rd, but officers were unable to locate the male. A report was generated for this incident and AP staff advised that he would contact Investigator Jon Yates if he received any more information regarding the incident. Pictures of the offender and the receipt have been attached to the report. All of the above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, Tennessee.

Charles Perry, 57, Burnette Loop Belvidere, was charged with Assisting other Agency.

James Mullins,62, Ridge Avenue Lenoir City, was charged with Tampering/ Fabricating with Evidence, Criminal Littering, Driving Unregistered Vehicle, License Required, and Financial Responsibility Law.

Deputy Harrison LCSO, observed a blue Dodge Durango going northbound on Interstate 75 without a registration plate displayed. Deputy got behind the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop on Interstate 75 northbound at the 80 mile-marker. While the vehicle was moving to the shoulder, Deputy observed a small white object come out the driver's side window and shatter as it hit the ground causing debris to scatter through the lane of travel.

Upon making contact with the driver, James Mullins he stated he did not have a valid license and the object he threw out the window was a "cigarette".

Deputy spoke with the front-seat passenger and the backseat passenger Charles Perry who stated they were coming from Alabama to Ohio for work. Deputy had Mullins exit the vehicle and after speaking with him further, Deputy asked for consent to search the vehicle which he agreed. While conducting a search of the vehicle, Loudon County Dispatch advised Mullins was unlicensed out of Alabama, had multiple felony and misdemeanor warrants from surrounding states, and Perry had an extraditable warrant out of Franklin County for violation of a court order.


Dispatch also advised the vehicle was not registered to the driver and that insurance was unconfirmed. Both subjects were placed in custody and while conducting an inventory of the vehicle Perry stated Mullins attempted to hide a meth pipe and a small amount of meth in the vehicle behind the passenger seat as Deputy initiated a traffic stop.

Deputy spoke with front seat passenger after receiving the statement from Perry at which point he stated the object Mullins threw out the window while moving to the shoulder was a meth pipe with meth inside. Mullins was read Miranda and when questioned about the object he continued to state it was a cigarette. MoneyMakers arrived and impounded the vehicle. Both Mullins and Perry were transported to the London County Jail without incident.

This did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

bers and personal identifying information from unsuspecting customers. A skimming device was installed at a local business and would collect the credit and debit card numbers and other personal identifying information from customers who used the machine when making purchases. Once Tellez and Martinez obtained the account numbers and other information from the skimming device, they would re-encode that information onto magnetic-stripe cards such as prepaid gift cards and use the fraudulent cards to obtain cash, purchase money orders, and purchase gift cards at local ATM machines and local point of sale terminals throughout East Tennessee. Local store surveillance footage captured them committing their crimes, including footage from local Walgreens, CVS, and Kroger stores.

Upon return to Florida, Tellez was stopped for a traffic violation in Lee County, and he had thumb drives containing over 300 account numbers and corresponding customer information. According to court records, the average yield for each compromised account number was over \$1,400 back of the card.

aggravated identity theft and was sentenced to 24 months in prison in the Eastern District of Tennessee. He was also sentenced to 51 months in prison in the Middle District of Florida for additional identity theft offenses.

Eastman Credit Union. a local financial institution that discovered fraudulent transactions, suffered actual losses from the scheme of \$39,899,97.

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the United States Secret Service, the Johnson City Police Department, the Kingsport Police Department, and the Lee County, Sheriff's Office. Florida The investigation was led by United States Secret Service Senior Special Agent Thomas R. Whitehead.

Assistant United States Attorney Mac D. Heavener, III represented the United States.

(2) (B) Sixty (60) days from the date the creditor received an actual copy of the notice to creditors if the creditor received the copy of the notice less than sixty (60) days prior to the date that is four (4) months from the date of first publication (or posting) as described in (1) (A); or

(3) Twelve (12) months from the decedent's date of death.




