



Duncan Federal Office Building in downtown Knoxville; and again on July 3, 2022, Reno utilized the same sedan and the same 22 caliber rifle to shoot the windows at the John J. Duncan Federal Office Building in Knoxville. The complaint seeks the forfeiture of both vehicles and the firearm used during the shootings on June 18, 2022, and July 3, 2022.

The FBI arrested Reno on July 18, 2022. He was released from custody for health reasons on Aug. 14, 2022, and passed away on Aug. 15, 2022.

Assistant Attornev General Kristen Clarke of the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division and U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III for the Eastern District of Tennessee announced the complaint.

The FBI. ATF and U.S. Marshals Service investigated the criminal case. with substantial assistance from the Knoxville

Fire Department. Assistant U.S. Attorney Casey T. Arrowood for the Eastern District of Tennessee and Trial Attorney Kyle Boynton of the Criminal Section of the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division prosecuted the criminal case.


Assistant U.S. Attorney Arrowood is representing the United States in the civil forfeiture action.
