

Corey Lynne Clark, 36, Hitchcock Road Knoxville, was charged with DUI, Vi-olation of Implied Consent, and Financial Responsibility

Officer Carroll LCPD. was dispatched to a wreckno injury at the intersection of Town Creek Pkwy/ Hwy 321 N. Prior to arrival on scene, dispatch advised one driver was attempting to flee the scene. Officer was able to make contact with the vehicle which was a red Audi bearing the tag# QXQLY7E, and conducted a traffic stop at Ingles on Hwy 321 N. Upon speaking to the female driver of the vehicle, who was identified as Corey Lynne Clark, she advised she fled the scene due to the driver of the other vehicle becoming very irate, and cursing at her. While speaking with Ms. Clark, Officer noticed a strong odor of alcohol omitting from her person. Ms. Clark did have

Deputy Stanley LCSO, responded to a MVA on East Coast Tellico Pkwy near Riden Road. Upon arrival, Deputy made contact with a male subject on the side of the road. He advised that his wife (Amanda English) had wrecked her vehicle off to the side of the road into woods. Complainant

advised that she was possibly intoxicated. Deputy then made contact with Amanda. who was laying in the grass. During Deputy initial observations, he did not observed any injuries externally on Amanda. At that time Deputy requested the response of Greenback Fire and EMS to the scene to assess Amanda for any possible injuries sustained in the accident. Deputy asked Amanda if she was intoxicated, in which she said she was. Deputy then asked her if she had any beer or liquor prior, in which she said liquor. Deputy observed

Amanda's eyes to be bloodshot and she was very unsteady on her feet.

Complainant was able to assist her to his vehicle so she could sit down. Amanda then proceeded to fall asleep in the back seat of his vehicle. forcement agents prepare for early morning operation in Arkansas

FBI and other law enforcement agents prepare for morning operation in Arkansas

FBI agents prepare for an early morning operation in Little Rock, Arkansas, focused on gang members believed to be responsible for violence and drug trafficking in the region.

"Today's operation and arrests are the culmination of a multi-year, multi-ageninvestigation targeting violent organizations which preyed upon Arkansas communities," said FBI Little Rock Special Agent in Charge James Dawson. "For the past two years, FBI employees and Arkansas law enforcement partners worked relentlessly to investigate and combat the violence plaguing our state. Today, those efforts have brought much-needed relief to besieged neighborhoods across central Arkansas."

Of the 80 defendants indicted in the three investigations, eight of those were already in custody when the operation began.

FBI and other law enforcement agents began early in the morning by searching for remaining 72 suspects; they successfully arrested 45. In addition to these arrests, authorities seized four firearms, small amounts of drugs, and \$30,000 in cash.

"We are grateful to the numerous agencies who assisted with this operation, especially the police departments who have investigators assigned to our task force," said Dawson. "We also thank the dedicat-

ed prosecutors at the U.S. Attorney's Office who continue to ensure violent criminals in Arkansas are held responsible for their illegal actions."

These efforts are part of several Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) operations. These operations seek to identify, disrupt, and dismantle the highest-level criminal organizations that threaten the United States using a prosecutor-led, intelligence-driven, multi-agency approach.

A burnt cigarette containing a green leafy substance was found in an ash tray cup in the cupholder. After the finding Deputy had charged Amanda with Simple Possession.

Deputy transported Amanda English to Fort Loudoun Medical Center for the blood drawl, and then The Loudon County Jail without incident. All occurred in Loudon County






