

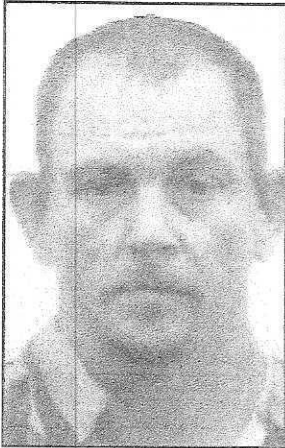

Kingsport Man Found To Be A Career Criminal And Sentenced To 264 Months Imprisonment For Possession Of A Firearm

Phillip Thomas Green, 36, of Kingsport, Tennessee, was sentenced to 264 months in prison by the Honorable Clifton L. Corker, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Greeneville.

On June 22, 2022, following a 2-day jury trial, a federal jury found Green guilty of being a felon in possession of a firearm in

violation of 18 U.S.C. § 922(g)(1). During the sentencing proceeding, Judge Corker found Green to be an Armed Career Criminal based on his lengthy, criminal history, which subjected Green to a mandatory minimum of 180 months' imprisonment. After his incarceration, Green will be on supervised release for a period of five years.

According to court

documents and evidence presented at trial, Green has ten prior felony convictions, including five felony drug convictions. The evidence further showed that on August 16, 2019, officers with the Kingsport Police Department responded to a disturbance on Park Street in Kingsport. They learned that Green

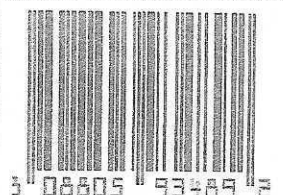

Officer Law LCSO, was on routine patrol when Officer observed a Blue Scion Tc (TN Tag 47A-H44) with expired registration (10/2022). Upon conducting a traffic stop at Creekswood Park Blvd @ Highway 70 E, Officer identified the driver to be Eric Pickel, the front seat passenger as Justin Davis and the back-seat passenger to be Tammy Pickel. After running all the individuals through Central Dispatch, they advised Mrs. Pickel had one active VOP and two active FTA's out of Bradley County. Mrs. Pickel was then placed under arrest, the next schedule wrecker "Money Makers", was dispatched to the scene to tow the vehicle due to no insurance. While Officer Z Parmer, was doing a vehicle inventory for towing purposes, a large shard of Methamphetamine was in plain view in the front seat

passenger seat. Then while conducting a probable cause search another bag with several shards of a white crystal-like substance (7.38 grams), and a blue weight scale was located below the passenger side seat. Officer then advised both males their Miranda Warnings, and both subjects declined to answer questions. Due to the totality

of circumstances both males were placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. While on scene at the Jail Mr. Pickel advised he had Methamphetamine (22.50 grams) underneath his privates. Mr. Pickel was determined to be driving in possession of 29.85 grams of a White Crystal-like substance.

Chad Tinnel, 32, Clyde Street Knoxville, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Simple Possession x2, and License Required.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, was conducting a patrol in the area of Highway 321 South in Lenoir City, TN. During his patrol duties Officer observed a gold in color Chrysler mini-van traveling south on Highway 321. While observing the vehicle Officer noticed that the windows on the minivan were dark to the point that you could not see into the vehicle clearly. A traffic stop was conducted on the minivan in the area of Market Drive near Town Creek Parkway in Lenoir City, TN. Upon traffic stop Officer made contact with a male driver who was later identified as Chad Tinnel. While informing the

driver for the reason of stop Officer visually observed a marijuana blunt sitting in plain view located near the cupholder on the dash of the minivan. The windows on the minivan were tested using a department issued Laser Labs window tint meter. The windows registered at 12%, which is in violation of T.C.A: 55-8-107 Window Tint. Officer instructed TINNEL to then step out of the vehicle due to the marijuana blunt which was in plain view (0.55 Grams). Once TINNEL exited the vehicle he stated to both, Officer. Ketner, and Miller that he had a capped hypodermic needle in his pocket. The needle was located and seized. Located during a probable cause search of the vehicle was a battery with a false bottom that had a screw cap lid. Located inside the hollowed-out battery was (0.51 Grams) of a crys-

tal-like substance believed to be methamphetamine and a quarter piece of an orange pill believed to be suboxone. TINNEL was then placed under arrest. Once under arrest TINNEL was mirandized where he admitted that the crystal-like substance was methamphetamine and that the quarter piece of the orange pill was suboxone. TINNEL was also found to be driving without while not licensed. TINNEL was transported to the Loudon County Jail.

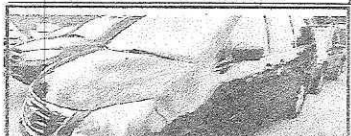

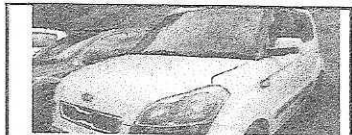

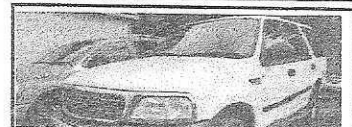

had vandalized a vehicle and then left the scene. The officer also learned that Green had an outstanding arrest warrant. A short time later, the officer responded to a report of a suspicious male on Highland Street, which is near Park Street. The description of the male matched the one given of Green, and the officer responded back to the Park Street location. Green was found in the driveway of the Park Street residence. When confronted by the officer, Green fled the scene on foot. He was apprehended in the backyard of a nearby residence. After being taken into custody, Green was found to have a loaded Taurus, .380 caliber handgun.

"This investigation and prosecution was a part of the Department of Justice's comprehensive strategy to combat and reduce violence in our local communities by targeting dangerous individuals who unlawfully possess firearms," said U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III. "We will continue to work with our local and federal partners to remove firearms from prohibited individuals."

"Armed Career Criminals are one of the greatest threats to our communities. These individuals show total disregard of the law by repeatedly committing many of the same offenses, which in many incidents, include violent crime," said Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms ("ATF") Special Agent in Charge Mickey French. "The ATF, along with our local, state, and federal law enforcement partners, will continue to investigate, apprehend, and charge the individuals who knowingly and willfully continue to break the

law."

This case was the result of an investigation by the King-sport Police Department and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF).

Assistant U.S. Attorney B. Todd Martin represented the United States.

This case is part of Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN), a program bringing together all levels of law enforcement and the communities they serve to reduce violent crime and gun violence, and to make our neighborhoods safer for everyone. On May 26, 2021, the Department launched a violent crime reduction strategy strengthening PSN based on these core principles: fostering trust and legitimacy in our communities, supporting community-based organizations that help prevent violence from occurring in the first place, setting focused and strategic enforcement priorities, and measuring the results.

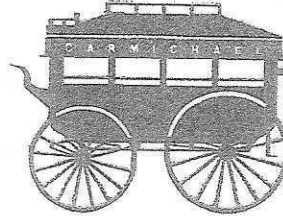
