Stephanie Day, 37, Andersonville Pike Knoxville, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Driving on Roadway Laned for Traffic.

Loudon E911 dispatched a reckless driver southbound on 175. The complainant stated they were following a white Nissan Altima which could not maintain its lane. Sgt. Rogers LCSO, observed a white Nissan Altima exit southbound at the 72 exits. Once at the intersection of Hwy 72, Deputy observed the driver(original complainant) of the vehicle behind the white Altima exit their vehicle and run back to Deputy Jackson's vehicle who was

just behind the complainant. The white Altima made a left turn onto Hwy 72, and Deputy then pulled out behind it. While observing the vehicle Deputy noted it traveled over the center line multiple times nearly striking an oncoming vehicle. Deputy initiated a traffic stop near Hwy 72 and Carding Machine Rd. Upon contact with the driver, Ms. Stephanie Day, Deputy noted she had bloodshot watery eyes and a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from her person. Ms. Day stated she was coming from Chilis in Turkey Creek en route to a friend's house on Niles Ferry in Greenback. Ms. Day originally stated she had one Michelob Ultra and then stated she had at least two

Crown Royal mixed drinks. Deputy asked Ms. Day to rate her level of impairment (completely sober being 0, blackout drunk being 10), to which she answered "5". Ms. Day was asked to step out of the vehicle multiple times and refused until Deputies began to move towards. Once out of the vehicle Ms. Day lost her balance multiple times and was slurring her words. Deputy also ob-

served vomit down the interior of the driver's side door. Ms. Day refused to do SFST. Based on the totality of the circumstance, Deputy took Ms. Day into custody for DUI and then read her TN Implied Consent which she stated she would not acknowledge. Deputy transported the offender to the Loudon County Jail. Said did occur in Loudon County, TN.



term investigation of a telemarketing and pharmacy scheme, resulted in the indictment of seven individuals (including a medical doctor and two pharmacists) and related organizations they controlled. All but one of the individuals entered guilty pleas to offenses related to the investigation, and a jury found the remaining defendant, Peter Bolos, guilty of conspiracy to commit health care fraud, mail fraud, and criminal misbranding following a month-long trial last year in the United States District Court in Greeneville. Tennessee.

In May 2022, the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer imposed sentences in the case that ranged from 14 years in federal prison to probation. The Court also ordered over \$100 million in restitution and forfeiture, and the United States recovered over \$26 million at or prior to the completion of sentencings. Additional details about individuals prosecuted, and the sentences imposed, can be found in the following press releases: Bolos sentencing and Bolos defendants sentencing.

NHCAA recognized the following members of the United States Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Tennessee for their work on the case: former Assistant United States Attorney T.J. Harker, Assistant United States Attorney Mac D. Heavener, Legal Assistants Barbra Pemberton and April Denard, and IT Specialist Bryan Brandenburg.

Federal partners receiving recognition included the Department of Justice Consumer Protection Branch (former Assistant Director John Claud and Trial Attornev David Gunn), the United States Department of Health and Hunan Services, Office of Inspector General (Supervisory Special Agent Robert Turner), the United States Department of Homeland Security, Homeland Security Investigations (Special Agent John Lyons), the Federal Bureau of Investigation (Special Agent Reanna O'Hare and Financial Analyst LeAnn Lanz), the United States Food and Drug Administration, Office of Criminal Investigations (Special Agent Brian Kriplean), the United States Office of Personnel Management, Office of Inspector General (Supervisory Special Agent Wayne VanVarick), and the United States Postal Service, Office of Inspector General (Special Agent Timothy Jones).

While performing HGN on Mr. Barrientos, Officer observed him to have the lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes as well as nystagmus in both eyes at maximum deviation. While performing the walk and turn, Mr. Barrientos failed to take the correct number of steps down and back. Mr. Barrientos also was placing his hands inside his pants multiple times to keep balance. Mr. Barrientos stated he no longer wanted to continue the SFST, due to the totality of circumstances Mr. Barrientos was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail. Mr. Barrientos was read the implied consent, in which he refused. During my investigation it was also determined Mr. Barrientos did not have a valid drivers license. All the above occurred in Lenoir City, TN.






