


Timothy Manning, 39, County Road 319 Niota, was charged with DUI, Driving on Suspended/Revoked License, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Officer McGinnis LCPD, arrived at Highway 321 N (Taco Bell), in reference to a possible intoxicated driver. Dispatch had advised that a man was seen sitting in the drivers seat of a gold car parked in the Taco Bell parking lot, "bouncing" around in the vehicle and hanging his belt across the rear view mirror. Upon arrival Officer saw the vehicle matching the description dispatch had given him, with a registration coming back to a female Manning.





Tyrell Douglas, Seta Road Knoxville, was charged with Driving on Revoked/Suspended License. and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, was conducting a patrol in the area of Highway 321 near Interstate 75 in Lenoir City, TN.

During patrol duties Officer observed a white in color Chrysler minivan traveling south on Highway 321. While observing the vehicle, Officer was able to identify the driver to be Tyrell Douglas of Knoxville, TN. Officer knew from prior knowledge that DOUGLAS was driving on a suspended Tennessee driver's license status. Officer then conducted a traffic stop on the minivan in the area of the south bound ramp of Interstate 75 in Lenoir

City. Upon making contact with DOUGLAS during the traffic stop Officer noticed that he was very nervous and could not sit still.


DOUGLAS also could not comprehend simple instructions without Officer having to repeat myself numerous times.

Officer then had DOUG-LAS step out of the vehicle to speak with him further about his suspended license status. While speaking with DOUGLAS he continued to not follow instructions and stated that he takes medication for depression and stated that it makes him jittery. Officer then requested Corporal C. Gray of the Loudon County Sheriff's Office to respond to his location with his partner K9 Kora.

Once on scene K9 Kora conducted an open-air sniff of the vehicle where Cor-

poral C. Gray stated that she positively alerted to an odor of narcotics coming from inside of the vehicle. A probable cause search of the vehicle revealed a glass pipe that had a charred bottom that resembled a pipe commonly used to smoke methamphetamine


DOUGLAS stated that he had used the pipe to smoke methamphetamine roughly two days prior. DOUGLAS was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail. DOUGLAS'S license was suspended for failure to appear on Feb 4th, 2022.

The Lenoir City Council met in its first regular session meeting since the election and new face Todd Kennedy was in attendance.

Missing from the meeting was our good friend Eddie Simpson who was under the weather as reported by Mayor Tony Aikens.

Editors Note: We unfortunately have to even report this since another publication has found it necessary to shame elected officials (of their choosing of course) due to an absence or failing to return their phone call.

Dr. Tommy Patterson from Maranatha Church of the Harvest gave the invocation and the pledge was led by Todd Kennedy.

The first item for consideration was the purchasing committee's recommendation to add \$3-400 regarding a contract for Kimley-Horn for signal timing. Ms. Amber Scott Kelso City Administrator reported this added money was to have an outside agency provide a necessary protection for the whole project and was an insurance requirement as well. The item passed unanimously.

Fire Chief Richard Mar-

tin gave a recommendation to hire full time Weston Ivey who was part time to fill a vacancy for a retiree. The vote passed unanimously.

Councilman Todd Kennedy was appointed to the Personnel Committee by Mayor Aikens. The vote passed with Kennedy abstaining.

The council also will be canceling the December 26, 2022 meeting by a unanimous vote as well.

Ms. Janet Bove was then honored with a proclamation by Mayor Tony Aikens on behalf the City County and the City of Lenoir City for her service to the communitv. Ms. Bove has served as chairwoman of the GFWC Suburbia Women's Club and during her time provided service to the community through the club. The GFWC is responsible for the Lenoir City Arts and Crafts Festival attended by thousands each year. They now also maintain the park area well and the club has also donated well over \$50000 to the Central Park Project on Broadway. Ms. Bove is the wife of George Bove a member of the LCUB and a Shriner and Mason as well.






