

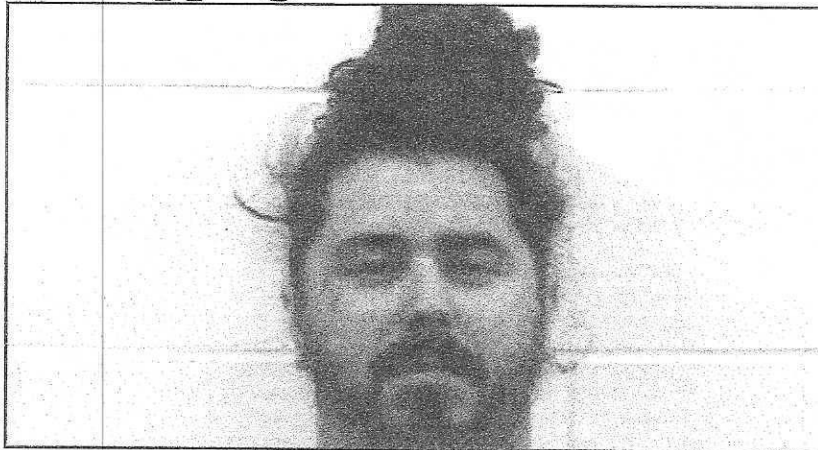

Haywood County Continues Trend of Disappointing Audit Results

County has received nine findings two years in a row

The Tennessee Comptroller's Office has released its annual audit of Haywood County government for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021. Unfortunately, the county's number of audit findings continues to indicate a need for improvement.

For the last two years, Haywood County has received

nine findings. While five findings are new this year, the county also has four repeated findings in its fiscal year 2021 report. A repeated finding indicates county management's unwillingness or inability to correct a finding from the previous annual audit report.

A majority of this year's findings, including all of the re-

peated issues, detail deficiencies and areas of noncompliance within the county mayor's office operations.

The four repeated findings include the Solid Waste Disposal Fund's deficit in unrestricted net position; deficiencies in budget operations; a failure to reconcile general

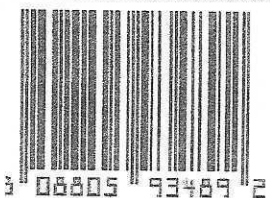

On 01/19/2022 at around 10:30 am, the victim, took her Kia to the Affordable New and Used tires located at Hwy 321, Lenoir City Tn. She states to have been in the waiting room/ office and was dealing with the employee, Austin. She says at around 12:04 pm, she receives a text that says "in the bathroom". She looks at Austin and asks if he just sent her that message. He replies yes, and he states you know you want to see it. She replies no and he tries to get her to go into the bathroom several times. He then says he'll just show her right here and exposes his genitals to her. She tells him he needs to stop, he walks over to her, and straddles her. He then forcibly grabs

the victim's arm and attempts to shove her hand down his pants. She states to shove him off her. He then grabs her phone and proceeds to attempt to unlock it. She refuses to give him the password and he puts the phone in the bathroom. He tells her if she wants it, she'll have to come and get it. The victim waits until another customer enters the store to retrieve her phone out of fear of being further assaulted. The victim waits for the work on her car to be completed and leaves the scene. The victim reported the assault and wrote a statement on 01/20/2022. Said happened in Lenoir City TN.

Firearm

Nakeesha Berry, 35, Rausin Road Philadelphia, was charged with Theft of Property.

Deputy Green LCSO, was traveling South on Interstate 75 approaching mile-marker 68. Deputy observed a silver Nissan Altima traveling in the slow lane between two semi-trucks with no traffic in the left lane.

As Deputy approached the vehicle he observed the vehicle travel along the fog line and drift into the shoulder. This vehicle made an abrupt exit off of the interstate at exit 68 and traveled at an extremely low rate of speed. This vehicle stopped at the stop sign for an extended period of time.

Deputy conducted a traffic stop and made contact with the occupants of the vehicle,

(Driver) and Nakeesha Berry (Front Left Passenger). Deputy advised the driver of the reason for stop and while speaking to both occupants

Deputy observed a series of nervous behavior. Deputy requested the driver to exit the vehicle to gather information while issuing a citation. While speaking with Ms. Berry he observed continued nervous behavior. Deputy asked Ms. Berry if there was anything illegal inside the vehicle which she responded with uncertainty. Deputy made contact with Ms. Berry and asked basic questions in regards to their origin and destination.

Ms. Berry and the driver stories did not corroborate. Deputy asked Ms. Berry if there was anything illegal inside the vehicle and she stated no. I asked a series

of questions such as illegal drugs, cash, or firearms. Ms. Berry stated no to all items but hesitated when asked about firearms.

Ms. Berry eventually stated she possessed a firearm that was under her seat. Deputy asked both parties for consent to conduct a search of the vehicle which they granted. Upon search of the vehicle, Deputy located a black Ruger .380 pistol in a black case under the front left passenger

seat. Deputy ran the serial number through dispatch which returned stolen out of Cocke County. This NCIC entry was confirmed. The firearm is currently valued at approximately \$259.99. Deputy took Ms. Berry into custody and transported her to Loudon County Jail without incident where she was charged with Theft of Property.

edger payroll reduction accounts; and a finding that the Community Development/Industrial Park and Education Capital Projects funds had deficits in unassigned fund balances.

Other findings include purchase orders that were not issued properly, and drug court fees that were not remitted to the state in accordance with state statute. Auditors also noted that the Office of Director of Schools had deficiencies in its budget operations.

The audit also mentions two investigations related to Haywood County government. One investigation of the former budget director is still ongoing, while another related to the Elma Ross Public Library was released in December 2021.

'Haywood County must take steps to improve its government operations,' said Comptroller Jason Mum-

power. 'Last year, Tennessee counties averaged three audit findings in their annual reports. Haywood County has had nine findings for two years in a row. With new opportunities on the horizon for West Tennessee, Haywood County officials must demonstrate a commitment to strong financial management and internal controls.'

(1) (A) Four (4) months from the date of the first publication (or posting, as the case may be) of this notice if the creditor received an actual copy of this notice to creditors at least sixty (60) days before the date of the first publication (or posting); or
