FBI Director Discusses Use-of-Force Data, HBCU Bomb Threats in Meeting with Black Law Enforcement Leaders

Wray Emphasizes FBI Commitment to Officer Safety, Violent Crime Reduction

During a speech at the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives conference in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, this morning, FBI Director Christopher Wray told attendees that the Bureau has reached a milestone in the National Use-of-Force Data Collection that will allow the agency to release

more information on police use-of-force incidents in the near future.

The data collection, which aims to provide national statistics on police use-of-force incidents, recently reached a 60% participation rate.

The FBI released some information at the 40% participation

threshold last year. The soon-to-be-released data will include information on things like types of force used and resistance encountered. Additional data can be released once 80% of total law enforcement officers are represented in the data collection.

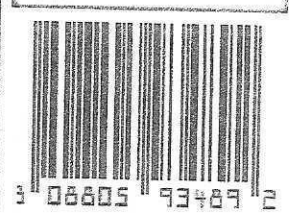

Mark Chouinard, 47, Anchor Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession, Poss. Of Drug Para. X2, Mfg/Del/Sale or Pos. of Meth, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic

Deputy Harrison LCSO, observed a gold Toyota Tacoma traveling on Martel Road failing to maintain its lane and maintaining a speed of 50mph in a 35mph zone. Deputy conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle in the area of Martel Road. Upon making contact with the driver,

Mark Chouinard, he exhibited extreme signs of nervousness. While speaking with Chouinard, Deputy observed a marijuana roach on the dash of the vehicle. Deputy had Chouinard exit the vehicle and during a search of his person, Deputy located a marijuana joint in his front left pocket. Deputy advised him he was about to conduct a probable cause search of his vehicle and if there was anything else in his possession to notify Deputy before he did so. Chouinard then stated there was a meth pipe in the ashtray also. During a search of the vehicle, Deputy

located a meth pipe in the ash tray, a scale with residue in the passenger seat, and in the back pocket of the passenger seat, Deputy located approximately 24.1 grams of meth in a large clear plastic bag along with another meth pipe. Loudon County Dispatch also advised Chouinard's license was revoked for DUI as of 2021.

Deputy placed the offender in custody and transported him to the Loudon County Jail. Moneymakers arrived and towed the vehicle. While on scene at the jail, Narcotics was notified and conducted a TruNarc scan which resulted in a positive test for meth (scan#1483). This did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

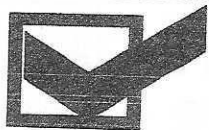

“Because once we get to the 80% mark, we’ll be able to share even more data and insight into use-of-force incidents,” Wray said. “And we can give the public the necessary facts, and I believe, strengthen our nation’s confidence in law enforcement.”

Wray also addressed a variety of other topics of interest to law enforcement in his remarks, including:

Director Wray Speaks at NOBLE

FBI Director Christopher Wray discussed violence against law enforcement, data collections, and violent crime reduction at the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives’ Winter CEO Symposium.

Threats to HBCUs and Other Institutions

Wray reiterated the FBI’s commitment to investigating the recent threats to Histor-

ically Black Colleges and Universities and houses of worship. More than 30 of the FBI’s 56 field offices are now involved in this investigation. The FBI is pursuing leads all over the country.

Violent Crime

More than 50 FBI Violent Crime Task Forces across the country are working with law enforcement to address the troubling surge in violent crime in recent years. In some of the hardest hit cities, the FBI’s Violent Crime Rapid Deployment Teams are creating strategies to reduce violent crime.

“We all know that—at all levels of government—our most fundamental duty is to safeguard people’s right to live without fear of violence,” Wray said.

Threats to Law Enforcement

The FBI continues to be concerned about violence against law enforcement. Wray noted that nearly half

of the officers who were killed in the line of duty last year were ambushed.

“These are tough times in our profession. And every chance I get, I try to remind the public, members of Congress and others, really anybody who will listen, about the dedication and bravery that you and your people, the men and women of law enforcement, show every day, as they serve our communities,” Wray said.

Law Enforcement Data Collections

In addition to the Nation-

al Use-of-Force Data Collection, Wray urged law enforcement leaders to participate in other FBI data collections, especially the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) and the new Law Enforcement Suicide Data Collection (LESDC). NIBRS provides detailed crime data, while the LESDC aims to help understand and prevent suicides in law enforcement.

“I firmly believe that this data is going to be vital for all of us as we continue making the physical and mental health of our people a priority,” Wray said.
