

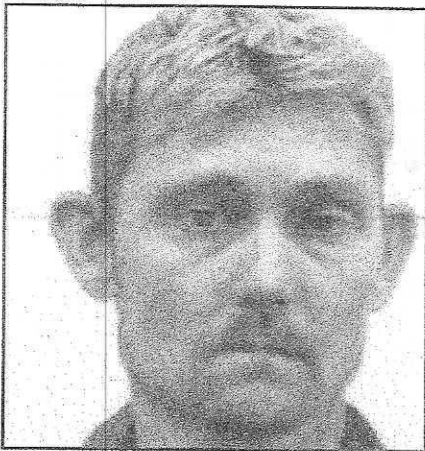

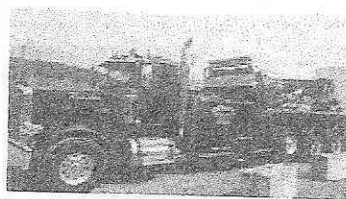

Konni Wallace, 32, Rainbow Drive Texas, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Patrol Deputies responded to Mandy Lane in reference to a domestic. When they arrived, they spoke to complainant/victim who said that her son and daughter-in-law assaulted her. Victim walked next door to the house who is her father-in-law. She knocked on the door as she always does and started to walk in. As her left foot entered the house, the door was immediately slammed on it. This pinned her foot between the door frame and the door causing her to fall backward onto the ground. She looked up and saw her brother-in-law Joshua Wallace, trying to push the door closed and heard him cursing, saying

that she is not coming into the house. Once the door was released, victim was able to remove her foot and limped back to her home. Deputies on scene spoke to Joshua Wallace and his wife Konnie Wallace. They said that none of this was true and that they were just trying to leave the house.

Sgt. Detective A. Parton was assigned this case. Sgt. went to Mandy Lane and spoke to the victim. She gave him the same story that she provided the Patrol Deputies with. She said she went to the hospital on this date and had an x-ray done on her foot to make sure it was not broken. She was released with the doctor saying that she would probably have some bruising appear later. Sgt. looked at victim left forearm and observed that it was swollen, and a bruise was appearing. On her left foot, Sgt. observed red marks on two of

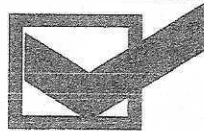
her toes consistent with her story and a small laceration on one of the toes. Sgt. went to her in-law's house at Mandy Lane and spoke to father-in-law and her sister-in-law. They said that on the night of the incident, Joshua and Konnie were sitting on the couch. When they saw victim approaching the home, they jumped up from the couch and tried to prevent her from coming in. Joshua and Konnie both hit the door trapping victim foot and causing her to fall backward. They said

that Joshua and Konnie were putting their body weight into the door while cursing at victim. Sgt. spoke to a female. She said she did not see the incident, but she heard Joshua screaming to victim that she is not coming into the house. Home owners said that victim comes over to the house often and that she is welcome anytime. Seeing that Joshua and Konnie Wallace were the primary aggressors, and they are related to the victim by blood and marriage. Warrants were issued on Joshua and Konnie Wallace for domestic assault.

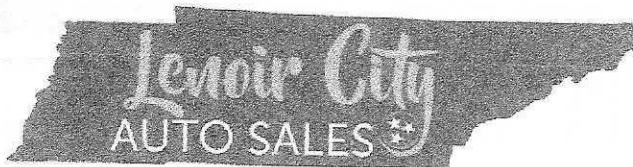

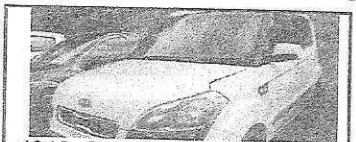

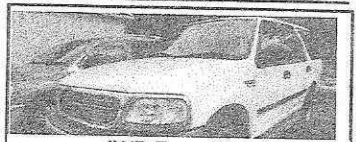

Jeremiah Neal, 24, Foster Road Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault, and False Imprisonment.

Deputy M. Tinnel LCSO, was dispatched to Lenoir City Dodge, on a possible domestic assault which occurred in the county. Upon arrival, Deputy spoke with the victim, who gave a verbal and written statement. The victim received a phone call from her boyfriend, Jeremiah Neal, to give him a ride for medical help where he was hurt on a jobsite in Knox County. She went to the jobsite and picked him up. An altercation occurred there with a friend of victim. After that incident, all three got into the vehicle and headed toward Loudon County. Another altercation ensued between Mr. Neal and victim, but it occurred in Knox County also, where he forced her into the car by physically picking her up and placing

her in it. He then drove into Loudon County on Martel Road, reaching back into the back seat, attempting to grab at victim several times while driving. Victim asked to be let out of the car several times, but Mr. Neal would not let her out.

When they got to the Lenoir City Cemetery near the U.G.O., Mr. Neal told the male to get out of the vehicle. The male exited the vehicle. Victim also exited the vehicle at that time. Mr. Neal attempted to grab her to pull her back in, but she ran to the Lenoir City Dodge dealership.

Mr. Neal was taken into custody by Lenoir City Police a short time later. He was transported to Fort Sanders Loudoun for treatment for a head injury sustained at his jobsite earlier. After treatment, he was taken to Loudon County Jail and charged with domestic assault and false imprisonment.
