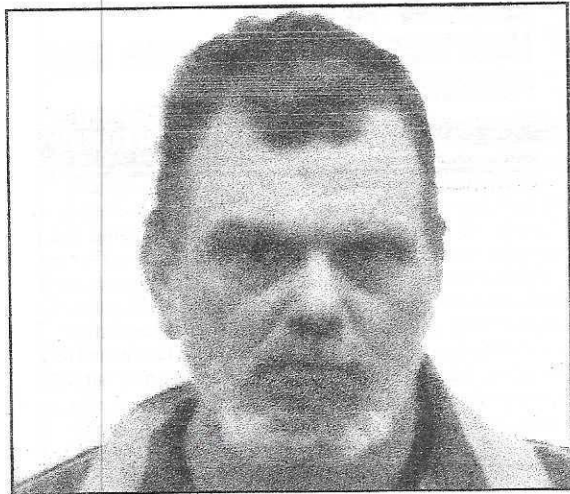

Meth Found on Revoked Driver in LCPD Traffic Stop

Investigation Finds Questionable Cash-Handling Within Jackson-Madison County Metro Narcotics Unit

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office focuses on the activities of a Jackson Police Captain who has managed the administrative aspects of the Jackson-Madison County Metro Narcotics Unit's (JMCMNU) seizures and forfeitures since 2010.

The captain used a safe located at the

Jackson Police Department (JPD) to temporarily store funds in her custody until she could make a bank deposit in the City of Jackson's bank account. On March 5, 2021, an inventory of the safe revealed that \$399,531.26 was inside; some of this money had been in the captain's custody and control since July

2019. Investigators identified discrepancies surrounding a total of \$15,027.50 in seized money, settlement proceeds, and various payments that were under the captain's custody and control. These issues include:

Missing money totaling \$6,639. Investi-

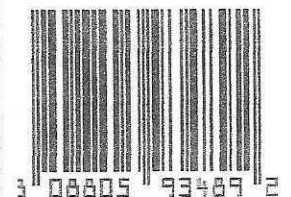

Daniel Shepherd, 42, Sarah Lane Knoxville, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Simple Possession, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Driving on Revoked/Suspended License.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, was conducting a routine patrol in the area of Highway 321 south near Garret Drive in Lenoir City, TN. During patrol duties Officer observed a white in color Chevy Tahoe with a passenger side brake light not functioning properly. I then initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle in the parking lot of Cato in Lenoir City, TN. Upon traffic stop Officer made contact with a male driver who appeared extremely nervous. While speaking with the driver, he stated that he did not have his state issued Tennessee Identification Card with him and mentioned that he did not have a valid driver's license. Officer then had the driver step out of the vehicle due to his nervousness and to properly identify him in a safe manner. The driver was identified as Daniel Shepherd of Knoxville, TN, where it showed him to be driving on a

revoked license status. During the traffic stop Officer attempted to read the VIN of the vehicle back to dispatch due to the registration not coming back on file. While attempting to read the VIN, Officer noticed, SHEPHERD, walking around the front of his patrol unit in a nervous manner and put both of his hands into his pant pockets. SHEPHERD then pulled both of his hands back out of his pockets where Officer noticed that one of his hands was balled into a fist. Officer asked SHEPHERD what he had in his hand several times at which point he handed him a baggie containing a crystal-like substance he stated was "clear" (0.96 Grams). The crystal-like substance tested positive through TRU NARC for methamphetamine. Officer then placed SHEPHERD under arrest. While in custody, SHEPHERD, stated that he also had a baggie containing marijuana inside of the vehicle. A subsequent search of the vehicle revealed (6.11 Grams) of what SHEPHERD stated was marijuana and (1) one glass pipe which contained what is believed to be marijuana residue inside of it.

Officer Ketner LCPD, responded to a Domestic on Broadway. The witness stated that a male was grabbing a female by the hair and pulling her shirt. The female then got out of the vehicle and ran the male then chased her and swung at her. The witnesses then broke the couple up. The male then got back into his vehicle and was driving down Broadway. Officer made contact with the male on Broadway and identified him as Guadalupe Garcia Pena and the female victim. 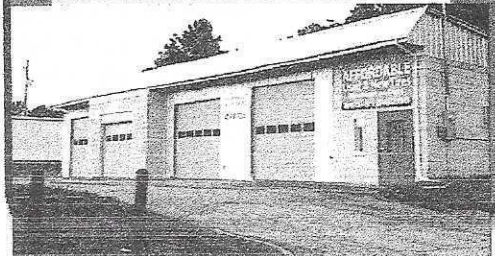

gators reviewed documentation showing that the captain was the last custodian of these funds; however, there was no documentation that the funds were ever deposited to the official bank account.

The captain found \$1,088.50 one day after meeting with investigators. The captain says she found the money in the JPD safe laying under some paperwork and other items on August 24, 2021. She claims that she overlooked it when the safe was inventoried in March.

The captain found and deposited money and money orders after the March 5, 2021 safe inventory that totaled \$7,300. Investigators question the whereabouts of this money that was in her custody and control prior to and during the March 5 inventory. The captain claims

the money was located either at the impound lot or under her computer monitor.

During an interview with investigators on August 23, 2021, the captain stated that she did not steal, borrow, or put back any money, and that she turned in "every penny" that she ever collected.

The results of this investigation have been communicated to the Office of the District Attorney General of the 30th Judicial District who was appointed as Pro Tem in this matter.

"State law requires that municipal funds be deposited no later than three working days after they are received," said Comptroller Mumpower. "In this case, some money was not deposited for up to 698 days. We also found numerous internal control weaknesses within the JMCMNU, some of which contributed to the discrepancies identified by our investigators."
