

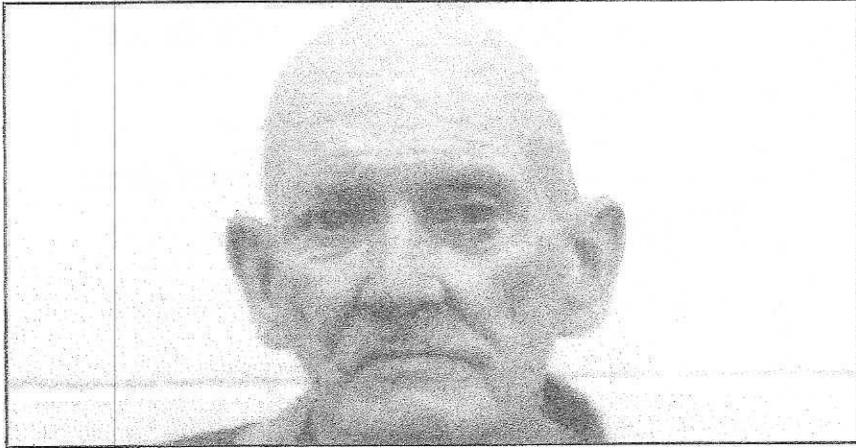

A CDC food safety alert regarding a multistate outbreak of Salmonella Senftenberg infections

A CDC food safety alert regarding a multistate outbreak of Salmonella Senftenberg infections has been posted: <https://www.cdc.gov/salmonella/senftenberg-05-22/index.html>

Key points:

Fourteen people infected with the outbreak strain of Salmonella have been

reported from 12 states. Two people have been hospitalized. No deaths have been reported.

The true number of sick people is likely higher than the number reported, and the outbreak may not be limited to the states with known illnesses. This is because some people recover without med-

ical care and are not tested for

Interviews with ill people and laboratory data suggest some Jif brand peanut butters may be contaminated with Salmonella and making people sick. Four of five people interviewed reported

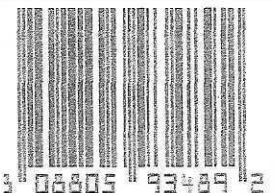
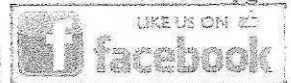

Officer R. Miller LCPD,

responded to 570 Highway 321 (CVS) in Lenoir City, TN in regards to a follow up on case regarding a fake prescription that was passed earlier in the day at Food City in Lenoir City. While on scene at CVS, Officer conducted a casual encounter with a subject in a vehicle. While speaking with the

male subject Officer noticed a strong odor of burnt marijuana coming from inside of the vehicle. The male also stated that he was waiting on his brother who was inside of the store and that they were passing through from Atlanta, GA. Due to the odor of marijuana coming from inside of the vehicle Officer detained the driver and identified him as Asidi Hussein. As Officer detained the driver he noticed the driver's brother exit CVS. The male was positively identified as the subject who had passed the fake prescription at Food City earlier in the day. Officer placed the subject who exited the store under arrest and identified him to be, Ayman Asidi, of Stone Mountain, GA. Due to the odor of marijuana coming from inside of the vehicle

On May 20, J.M. Smucker Company recalled multiple Jif brand peanut butter types, including creamy, crunchy, natural, and reduced fat. Recalled products include lot codes 1274425-2140425, with "425" at the end of the first seven numbers.

Investigators are working to identify whether additional products are contaminated.

What You Should Do:

Do not eat, sell, or serve recalled Jif brand peanut butter. Throw it away. This product has a very long shelf life, so be sure to check any Jif peanut butter you have at home to make sure it has not

been recalled.

Wash surfaces and containers that may have touched the recalled peanut butter using hot soapy water or a dishwasher.

Contact a healthcare provider if you think you got sick from eating a recalled product.

About Salmonella:

Most people infected with Salmonella develop diarrhea, fever, and stomach cramps 6 hours to 6 days after being exposed to the bacteria.

The illness usually lasts 4 to 7 days, and most people recover without treatment.

In some people, the illness may be so severe that the patient is hospitalized. In rare cases, Salmonella infection may spread from the intestines to the bloodstream and then to other parts of the body.

Children younger than 5,

adults 65 and older, and people with weakened immune systems are more likely to have severe illness.
