Omar Cardenas Added to FBI's Ten Most Wanted Fugitives List

Suspect is accused of killing a man in front of barbershop

Omar Alexander Cardenas, wanted for his alleged involvement in the murder of a man and unlawful flight to avoid prosecution, has been added to the Ten Most Wanted Fugitives list. The FBI is offering a reward of up to \$100,000 for information leading directly to his arrest.

On August 15, 2019, Cardenas allegedly fired several rounds

from a semi-automatic handgun in the direction of a barbershop, striking an adult male standing outside in the head, causing his death. The incident took place at Hair Icon Barber Shop, which is located in a small shopping center in the Sylmar neighborhood of Los Angeles, California.

Law enforcement officials believe the victim may not have known

Cardenas.

"At the scene of the crime, Mr. Cardenas is believed to have fired approximately six shots into a public space," said Special Agent Michael Alker who is investigating the case for the FBI's Los Angeles Field Office. "He is not only a risk to the public, but

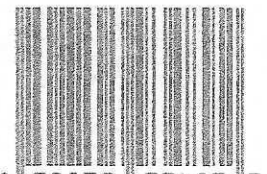

Timothy Hensley, 28, Baker Lane Maynardville, was charged with Poss. Of Drug Para, Prohibited Weapons, and Unlawful Carrying or Possession of a Weapon.

Nathan Spries, 28, Hartly Lane Knoxville, was charged with Poss. Of Drug Para, and Assisting other Agency.

Connie Holloway, 50, Greenwood Road Knoxville, was charged with Poss. Of Drug Para.

Deputy Stanley LCSO, re-

sponded to a call at the TA truck stop in regards to a possible kidnapping. Upon arrival, Deputy made contact with two male subjects sitting on the bench in beside the suspect vehicle in question. The two males were identified as Timothy Hensley and Nathan Spries. While talking to the two they advised they were on their way to Sweetwater to sell a catalytic convertor. At that time, Cpl. K9 Gray made contact with the reporting female/victim and another female involved (Connie Holloway). At that time Holloway, Hensley, and Spries were detained. Deputy read both Hensley and Spries their Miranda Rights, in which they agreed to speak to Deputy without council.

While asked about the suspected kidnapping, Holloway, Spries and Hensley all had corroborating stories stating that victim was with them voluntarily and she was not being held against her will. They stated they were on their way to Sweetwater and advised they stopped at the TA because victim was not feeling good and had to use the bathroom. Deputies on scene talked with victim and she stated that she has been riding around with Hensley for the past few days. She stated that he would not let her out of the car, and when she fell asleep in the car, she woke up with Holloway and Spries were in

the back seat.

During the investigation, Cpl. Gray deployed his K9 on the suspect vehicle, in which Deputy was advised the K9 alerted to possible narcotics. A search was conducted of the vehicle, in which multiple Drug Paraphernalia items including spoons with residue and burn marks, multiple baggies containing residue, and needles. A sawed off shotgun was found in a backpack in the back hatch of the vehicle. Later in the investigation, Timothy Hensley stated the shotgun belonged to him. Upon running a Criminal history of Hensley it was discovered that he was a violent convicted felon. It was also discovered that Nathan Spries had three active warrants out of Knox County.

At that time, Holloway, Spries, and Hensley were placed into custody on the charge of Possession of Drug

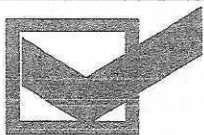

Ashley Plemons, 33, Homeless Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Officer Law LCPD, was dispatched to a physical domestic at Pine Ridge Dr. Upon arrival Officer met with the victim who stated her daughter "Ashley Plemons" had shown up to her residence to see her children and dropped off some birthday items for her daughter. Victim stated when she advised her daughter she couldn't stay long due to the time of night it was, Ashley then became irate and began

lunging towards her. Victim stated she was trying to get away from Ashley, when Ashley put her in a choke hold, thus causing her to loose her breathe for several moments. Upon speaking to the witness she stated she observed her sister "Ashley Plemons" on top of her mother trying to choke her out. After several minutes the fight was broken up and Ashley then left on foot prior to our arrival. Ashley was located walking at Simpson Rd West. During my investigation Officer asked Ashley several times to tell him her side of the story, and she was

unable to due so. Ms. Plemons was then placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. All the above occurred in Lenoir City, TN.

Celina Wastewater Employees Operated Private Business with City Resources

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has revealed improper conduct by three employees of the Celina Wastewater Treatment Plant in Clay County. The investigation began after a former City Mayor identified and reported questionable invoices found at the treatment plant.

Investigators determined that the current plant supervisor, a retired supervisor, and a current plant employee used city resources, such as time, chemicals, the laboratory, and equipment, to perform water sample testing and analyses

for their private business. By using city resources, the costs to operate their private business were significantly lower.

The three employees were paid a total of \$10,847.52 by the city for time when they were also working for their private business.

Additionally, the value of the plant's laboratory resources and equipment that were used to perform testing for the private business resulted in a total cost of \$10,898.04 to the City of Celina.

The investigation revealed the three employees generated \$277,875 for their private business from January 2014 through November 2020. This occurred while the men were often working on city time and using plant equipment.

Investigators have also questioned compensatory

(comp) time that was accrued by the three individuals, and a total of \$15,328.69 in comp time payments that were made to the current supervisor and plant employee.

The results of this investigation have been communicated to the Office of the District Attorney General of the 13th Judicial District.

"Our investigators have recommended that Celina officials take steps to improve supervision and oversight of wastewater plant employees," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "It's also important for the city to properly enforce its personnel policies regarding outside employment and adhere to federal law regarding limits on compensatory time."

Capital Spending for School Districts is a Local Affair

The Tennessee Comptroller's Office has released a report detailing the amount and types of capital spending for local school districts and an overview of the methods districts and local governments use to pay for capital and debt spending.

Spending for public school capital projects by both local school districts and their county and city governments totaled an estimated \$2 billion in fiscal year 2019-20, including spending for land; building construction and renovation; related facilities like parking lots and athletic

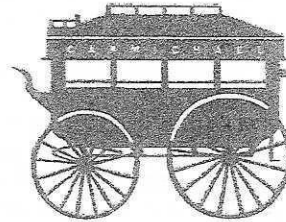
fields; as well as equipment like desks, chairs, playground equipment, and buses.

The bulk of capital spending on K-12 school facilities, and any related debt payments on loans, is paid from local revenues, including revenues from bonds and notes issued by local governments, adequate facilities taxes, and dedicated property taxes. The state supports capital spending for schools primarily through the state's share of Basic Education Program (BEP) funding for several components related to capital needs. State dollars allocated in fiscal year 2019-20 totaled \$503 million for the BEP's capital outlay, equipment, and technology components. (The BEP's capital outlay component will be folded into the newly-approved Tennessee Investment in Student Achievement (TISA) base funding formula, which will be implemented in school year 2023-24. Equipment and technology components are to be split between TISA's base, weighted, and direct funding components.)

The report reviews the factors that can increase capital spending for schools, including student enrollment growth, classroom size limit, the age and quality of school buildings, and the cost of building materials and labor. The report's focus on spending and revenue data from 2019-20 captures more typical spending patterns that occurred mainly before the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic and the large injections of federal emergency relief funds known as ESSER.

A total of 35 districts were identified in the report as having total enrollment growth of 2 percent or more across the period from 2014-15 to 2019-20. These districts were more likely to be in Middle Tennessee and to be city or special school districts.

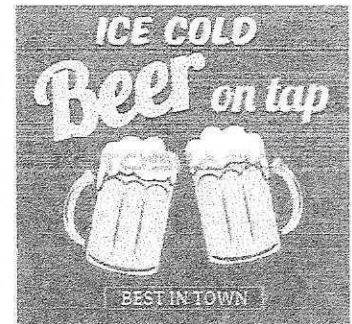

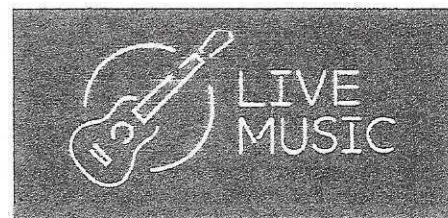

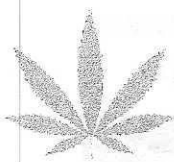

he may also have information related to other violent crimes."

Cardenas is allegedly a member of the Pierce Street Gang and may associate with the Pacoima Van Nuys Boys/ Anybody Killas. Cardenas often goes by the nickname "Dollar."

On April 3, 2020, the Superior Court of Los Angeles County issued a local arrest warrant after Cardenas was charged with murder. The United States District Court, Central District of California, issued a federal arrest warrant on September 2, 2021, after he was charged with unlawful flight to avoid prosecution.

Cardenas is between 5'6" and 5'7" and weighs approximately 240 to 300 pounds. He has dark brown/black hair, a beard, and brown eyes. Alker said Cardenas is known to vary the style of his hair and facial hair, but his large physical size and glass-

es may draw attention. "He normally wears thick prescription glasses and has at least one tattoo," Alker said. Cardenas should be considered armed and dangerous.
