

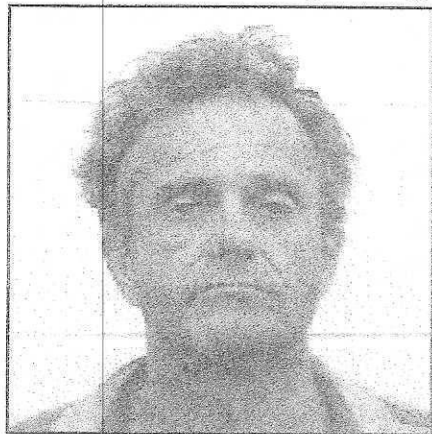

Aegis Sciences to Begin Monkeypox Testing, Increasing Nationwide Testing Capacity

Aegis Sciences will begin testing for monkeypox using CDC's orthopoxvirus test, which detects most non-smallpox related orthopoxviruses, including monkeypox virus.

"The ability of commercial laboratories to test for monkeypox is an important pillar in our comprehensive strategy to combat this disease,"

said CDC Director Rochelle Walensky, M.D., M.P.H. "This will not only increase testing capacity but also make it more convenient for providers and patients to access tests by using existing provider-to-laboratory networks."

Aegis will perform this testing at its laboratories in Nashville, Tenn., and can accept specimens from any-

where in the country. Aegis expects to be able to perform up to 10,000 tests per week, increasing the current capacity provided through CDC's Laboratory Response Network (LRN), Labcorp, Mayo Clinic Laboratories, and Quest Diagnostics to up to 70,000 tests

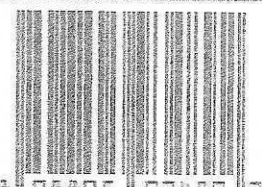
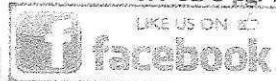

Charged

William Brewster, 48, Shendoah Drive Friendsville, was charged with DUI, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Jordan Norman, 35, Long Hollow Road Knoxville, was charged with Tampering/Fabricating with Evidence, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Deputies with LCSO, were dispatched to an overdose at the TA Truck Stop on Watt Rd. Sgt. Rogers LCSO, arrived first on scene and observed a male subject Jor-

dan Norman standing at the driver's side door of a running white Lincoln Navigator. Norman was attempting to help another male subject slumped over at the wheel (William Brewster).

The report stated the subjects were in the middle of the parking lot in an area frequented by the public. Norman advised his friend Mr. Brewster, had used Heroin and was overdosing. Mr. Brewster's eyes were rolled back and he did not have a

pulse. Deputy did administer 2 doses of Narcan to Mr. Brewster before he became conscious.

Mr. Brewster stated that he had used about half a point of Heroin intravenously before loosing consciousness. Mr. Norman also stated that his friend had been clean for awhile but had used approximately half a point this said night. Neither subject would advise where the used drug paraphernalia was, however Deputy Jared Johnson, found a small case with syringes, a burnt spoon, cut straw and a baggie with a powdery residue a short distance away in the grass.

Mr. Norman later stated that Mr. Brewster had used the paraphernalia to get high and that he had hid the paraphernalia in the grass after Mr. Brewster became unconscious.

Mr. Norman was taken

into custody for Tampering with Evidence and Drug Paraphernalia. Mr. Brewster was charged with DUI and Drug Paraphernalia.

Mr. Brewster elected to be transported to the hospital due to his medical state and did not perform SFST. Both subjects were transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Mountain City Employees Indicted
Former Bookkeeper and Current City Recorder Both Face Charges

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Donna Nelson, a former bookkeeper, and Sheila Shaw, the current recorder for the Town of Mountain City in Johnson County. The investigation began after town officials identified questionable transactions.

Investigators determined that Nelson stole at least \$3,959.71 from the town between July 2017 and September 2021.

One of Nelson's responsibilities included collecting payments for water and sewer services. Occasionally, customers' payment checks were unable to clear because the customer's bank account did not have an adequate balance to cover the payment. These insufficient funds payments were known as "bad checks." Nelson would then collect money from these customers in order to settle their accounts.

Investigators revealed that Nelson kept at least \$2,369.71 in town collections by failing to remit repayments made by customers who had initially submitted bad checks. For example, records show that in May 2019, \$92.99 in cash was collected to replace a customer's bad check; however, Nelson kept \$90 for her personal use from this transaction.

Nelson also cashed 11 personal checks from herself or her family members totaling \$1,260 from the town's cash drawer that were later returned by the bank for insufficient funds. Nelson did not repay these bad checks to the town, nor did she pay the town's \$30 returned check fee, which totaled \$330. Donna Nelson resigned her position with the town on September 30, 2021.

Investigators also questioned 10 other repayments for bad checks totaling \$1,142 that were never deposited into a town bank account; however, town records did not include adequate documentation to determine conclusively that these funds had been repaid.

Mountain City Recorder Sheila Shaw failed to impose one of her duties by failing to deposit at least \$5,582.63 in cash. Shaw kept this cash in her office, and some of the money had been collected more than a year prior. Shaw told investigators she did not make deposits in a timely manner because she believed someone may realize what Nelson had been doing.

Based upon this investigation, in July 2022, the Johnson County Grand Jury indicted Donna Nelson on one count of theft over \$2,500 and one

count of official misconduct. Sheila Shaw was indicted on one count of official misconduct.

"Mountain City officials should establish clear procedures for how bad checks are handled," said Comptroller Mumpower. "This includes developing a formal record of which customers' payments have been rejected, and when those customers have repaid the town. These records should help the town track and collect its debts."

On June 22, HHS announced that five commercial laboratory companies would soon begin offering monkeypox testing. Since then, CDC has shipped the tests to the laboratories and their employees have been trained on their administration, among other steps.

Anyone with a rash that looks like monkeypox should talk to their healthcare provider about whether they need to get tested, even if they don't think they had contact with someone who has monkeypox. Healthcare providers nationwide can order the orthopoxvirus test from Aegis just as they would normally order other tests. People seeking testing for monkeypox must consult with their healthcare provider first; they cannot separately go to an Aegis laboratory, submit a specimen, and request testing. Aegis will use electronic laboratory reporting to report results to jurisdictions as outlined in the CDC report-

ing guidance.

CDC anticipates additional commercial laboratories will come online in the coming days, and monkeypox testing capacity will continue to increase throughout the month of July. 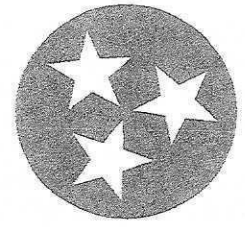

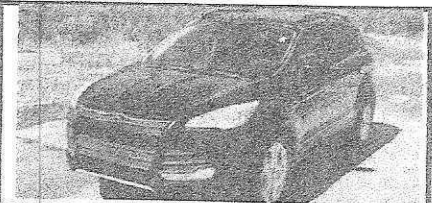

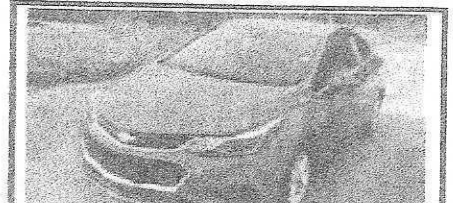
