CDC streamlines COVID-19 guidance to help the public better protect themselves and understand their risk

CDC is streamlining its COVID-19 guidance to help people better understand their risk, how to protect themselves and others, what actions to take if exposed to COVID-19, and what actions to take if they are sick or test positive for the virus. COVID-19 continues to circulate globally, however, with so many tools available to us for reducing COVID-19

severity, there is significantly less risk of severe illness, hospitalization and death compared to earlier in the pandemic.

"We're in a stronger place today as a nation, with more tools—like vaccination, boosters, and treatments—to protect ourselves, and our communities, from severe illness from COVID-19," said Greta Massetti, PhD, MPH, MMWR author.

"We also have a better understanding of how to protect people from being exposed to the virus, like wearing high-quality masks, testing, and improved ventilation. This guidance acknowledges that the pandemic is not over, but also helps us move to a point where COVID-19 no longer severely disrupts our

Charlotte Thompson, 50, Smallen Road Loudon, was charged with Simple Possession, Failure to Move Over for Emergency Vehicle, and Poss. Of Drug Para. Officer Eldridge LCPD, initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle on Hwy 321 South at Market Dr. Before exiting his vehicle, Officer looked in his side mirror and noticed that an approaching vehicle was still in his lane and not moving over or slowing down even with his emergency equipment activated. The SUV (BGB7239) passed by his patrol car so close that it would have hit the door if it had been open. Officer quickly pursued the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop in front of the Titlemax and made contact with a female driver (Charlotte Thompson). While looking for her Drivers license, Officer observed a Crack pipe in plain view in the drivers seat the driver was asked to exit the vehicle and detained at that time. A probable cause search of the vehicle revealed Thompson to have 2 glass pipes and a brillo pad (used in conjunction to smoke crack or meth). One of the pipes contained a small, white rock which appeared to be consistent with Crack Cocaine weighing in at 0.12 grams. Thompson was transported to the Loudon Co jail and the drug in question will be sent off to the TBI for further testing. The vehicle was impounded by Malones and this did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon Co, TN.

In support of this update CDC is:

Continuing to promote the importance of being up to date with vaccination to protect people against serious illness, hospitalization, and

death. Protection provided by the current vaccine against symptomatic infection and transmission is less than that against severe disease and diminishes over time, especially against the currently circulating variants. For this reason, it is important to stay up to date, especially as new vaccines become available.

Updating its guidance for people who are not up to date on COVID-19 vaccines on what to do if exposed to someone with COVID-19. This is consistent with the existing guidance for people who are up to date on COVID-19 vaccines.

Recommending that instead of quarantining if you were exposed to COVID-19, you wear a high-quality mask for 10 days and get tested on day 5.

Reiterating that regardless of vaccination status, you should isolate from others when you have COVID-19.

You should also isolate if you are sick and suspect that you have COVID-19 but do not yet have test results.

If your results are positive, follow CDC’s full isolation recommendations.

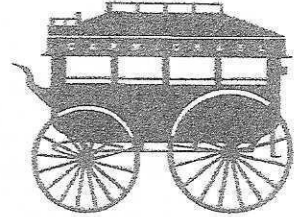
If your results are negative, you can end your isolation.

Recommending that if you test positive for COVID-19, you stay home for at least 5 days and isolate from others in your home. You are likely most infectious during these first 5 days. Wear a high-quality mask when you must be around others at home and in public.

If after 5 days you are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of medication, and your symptoms are improving, or you never had symptoms, you may end isolation after day 5.

Regardless of when you end isolation, avoid being around people who are more likely to get very sick from COVID-19 until at least day 11.

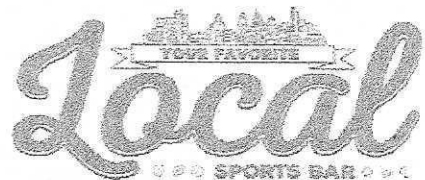
