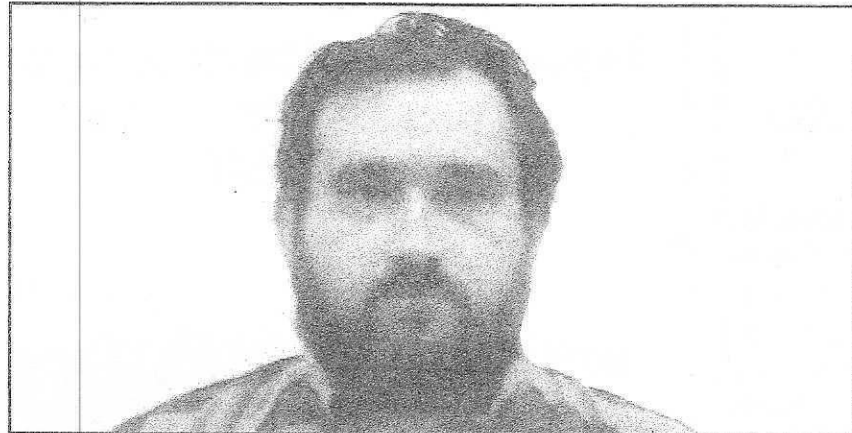

Former East Hickman High School Football Booster Club President Indicted

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Amanda Rosie Tidwell, the former president of the 1st and Goal football booster club at East Hickman High School in Lyles. Tidwell served as the booster club president from February 2021 until her resignation on July 30, 2021.

Investigators de-

termined that Tidwell misappropriated booster club funds totaling \$1,290. Tidwell requested cash and accepted donations and sponsorships for the booster club, but she failed to remit the money or use the funds as designated. She only remitted the funds once she was directly questioned by school officials and booster club members.

Tidwell's total mis-

appropriation of \$1,290 involved four separate instances:

Tidwell requested \$500 from the booster club to pay a deposit on a polo shirt order for the football team. Tidwell never placed the order and kept the funds for more than month. After the school principal confronted Tidwell about the missing \$500 on

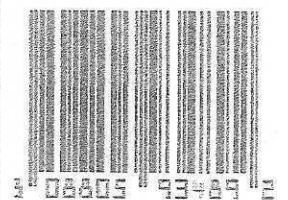

David Gross, 36, Manord Way Louisville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale SCH. VI x2, & Sch. I, Simple Possession, Poss. Of Drug Para, Possession of a Handgun, Lights Required on Motor Vehicle, and Display of Registration Plate.

Officer Parmer LCPD, was on patrol when he observed a

white Hyundai Elantra at the intersection of Hwy 321 N and Hwy 11. The vehicle had no visible tag and the passenger-side break light was out. Officer initiated a stop on the vehicle at Lakeside Dental, E Broadway, and while approaching the vehicle, Officer could smell a strong odor of raw marijuana permeating from the passen-

ger compartment. Officer made contact with the driver, identified as 36 year old David Gross, who displayed nervous behavior such as failure to make eye contact, sweating, and shaking. Officer requested Mr. Gross to step out of the vehicle and inquired about the amount of marijuana that was inside

of the vehicle. Mr. Gross informed Officer he had a couple ounces in his blue backpack in the back seat of the car. A search was performed on the vehicle, and located inside of two, separate, blue backpacks, were the findings of 357.86 grams of raw marijuana, 26.5 grams of marijuana-

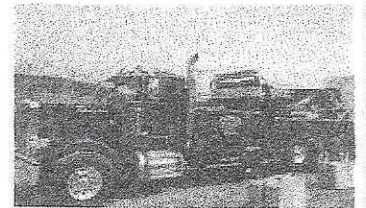

na wax, 12 1ML THC karts, 30.56 grams of mushrooms, a grinder with residue, 2 weed pipes with residue, a measuring cup with residue, small tools commonly used for distributing marijuana wax, a scale with residue, a

box of clear, plastic bags, and a large amount of cash. Inside of Mr. Gross' center console, officers located a loaded SCCY CPX-2 9mm handgun. Mr. Gross was subsequently placed into custody and transported to Loudon County Jail without incident.

Daniel Santos, 22, Pennsylvania Ave Oak Ridge, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Leaving the Scene of Accident, No Driver License, and Financial Responsibility Law.

Officer Law LCPD., was dispatched to a Single Vehicle MVA near Hwy 321 "Big Fish Out Fitters", Sergeant Rayfield arrived on scene prior to Officer arrival, he advised the Truck was unoccupied in the woods and inside the vehicle was covered in blood. While searching the area for the driver, Officer was flagged down, and advised there was a male just past Melton Hill Dam. Officer located a male just 1/4 mile from the Melton Hill Dam entrance who had a blood stained white shirt who Officer identified as Daniel Santos. While speaking to Mr. Santos he had blood shot watery eyes, appeared con-

fused, and had the odor of an alcoholic beverage omitting from his persons. During investigation Mr. Santos stated he had one beer prior to the wreck, Officer had Officer Marco Luna LPD with Loudon City translate via the phone. Mr. Santos refused medical treatment, and refused implied consent. After running Mr. Santos through dispatch, they advised he did not have a valid drivers license, Mr. Santos admitted to driving the vehicle, and was unsure how he wrecked. Due to the totality of circumstances Mr. Santos placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. While on scene at the Jail Officer Luna read Mr. Santos the Tennessee Implied consent, and he did refuse a blood draw. All the above occurred in Lenoir City, TN. Officers with the City of Lenoir City could not locate any insurance on the vehicle.

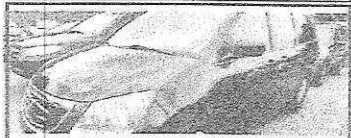

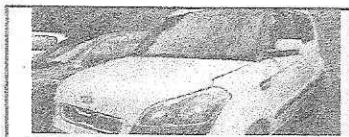

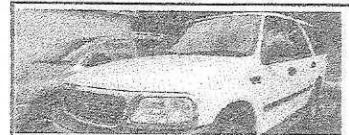

Maria Medina-Gonzales, 30, Highland Ave Loudon, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Officer Trey Clemmer LPD, was dispatched to Highland Avenue for a domestic. Officer Luna, Officer Everett and Clemmer arrived on scene and made contact with the victim and a Ms. Maria Medina whom both seemed aggravated at the moment of our arrival. Officer spoke to Ms. Medina and asked what had happened and she stated to him that she found out her boyfriend/victim was cheating on her and went to confront him. She then stated she needed to speak with Officer Luna for translation. Officer then spoke with victim along with Officer Everett and he stated he was asleep in his room then he woke up with her picking the lock with a kitchen knife and came at him with the knife. He then stated that she got closer with the knife yelling at him calling him a cheater and he finally removed the knife from her and called the police. After checking the area there were visual marks on the door where the lock had been pried open and a kitchen knife setting on the dresser top. Maria Medina was placed under arrest for aggravated assault and taken to Loudon County Jail. The above actions did occur in the City of Loudon.

July 26, 2021, she contacted a booster club member requesting to borrow money. She turned over \$500 to the school on July 27, 2021.

Tidwell collected a sponsor donation check of \$50 on June 14, 2021; however, she didn't turn it over until July 27, 2021.

Tidwell accepted a \$300 sponsorship donation from

a local business on June 9, 2021. She later filled in her own name on the check and cashed it. The money was eventually found by booster club officers in Tidwell's notebook that was turned over six days after her resignation on August 5, 2021.

Tidwell accepted a \$440 cash donation to pay for a team meal on July 19, 2021, but she retained and failed to remit the funds for 53 days instead of paying for the meal.

Additionally, Tidwell wrote personal checks to the high school totaling \$220 to pay for smart cards sold by her son as part of a school fundraiser. Both checks were returned for insufficient funds. At the conclusion of the investigation, Tidwell still had not paid the school for the smart cards.

Based upon this investigation, in June 2022, the Hickman County Grand Jury indicted Amanda Rosie Tidwell on one count of theft over \$1,000, and one count of forgery.
