

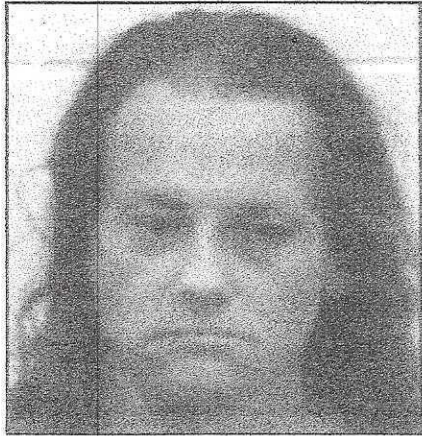

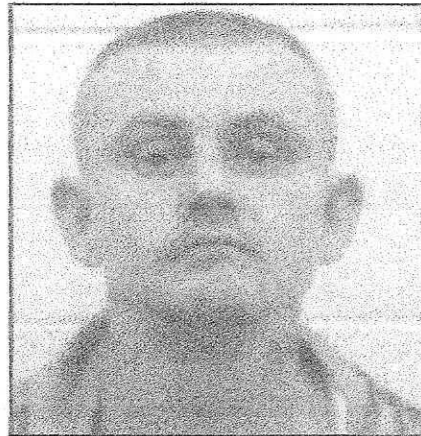

Man Charged with Contributing After Waiting on Teen

Timothy Hughes, 39, Cedar Lane Road Madisonville, was charged with Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor.

Sgt. C Rogers LCSO, observed a dark gray sedan failing to maintain it's lane while following extremely close to another vehicle traveling on Harrison Rd. It appeared that the gray sedan was going to pass the other vehicles multiple times but then

returned to the appropriate lane. Deputy initiated a traffic stop as the vehicle turned on to Glenfield Drive and it continued to the intersection of Glenbrook Drive. Deputy then observed a middle aged man and a juvenile female standing on the side of the road where the vehicle stopped. As Deputy approached the vehicle Deputy asked

Former Shelby County Criminal Court Clerk Staffer Stole Cash from Evidence

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office, working in conjunction with the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, has resulted in the indictment of former Shelby County Criminal Court Clerk staffer Steven Sharp.

Sharp stole at least \$61,890.87 in cash from the Criminal Court Clerk's two property and evidence storage locations.

The Criminal Court Clerk's Office maintains all property and exhibits held in evidence for cases before the criminal court and preserves evidence for any future appellate proceedings. In June 2021, investigators received a complete list noting that 2,045 evidence cases contained money stored in the evidence rooms.

After reviewing all the evidence cases,

investigators determined that former Principal Court Clerk Steven Sharp stole cash from 270 of the 2,045 cases. In February 2022, Sharp admitted to investigators that, beginning in 2018, he took money from evidence boxes in both evidence room locations.

This investigation originated when the

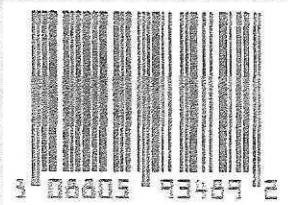

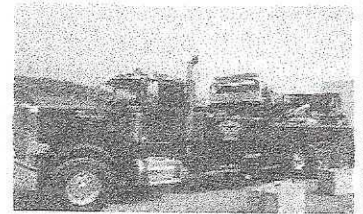

pill. In the trunk there was a Scooby Doo stuffed animal. I noticed that the stitching on the stuffed animal had been tampered with. Officer pulled the stitching and located 84 grams of meth. Roth took

Jerry Bailey, 41, Mount Pleasant Road Andersonville, was charged with Altering, Falsifying or Forging Auto Title, Poss. Of Drug Para., Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth.

Officer Law LCPD, observed a White Honda Civic (TN Tag QDTY4BH) in the area of 1100 Highway with an altered registration. Upon conducting a traffic stop Officer identified the driver to be Jerry Bailey, after further investigation it was determined white out had been used on the expiration date and then with a permanent marker changed the 08/08/2022 to display 08/28/2022. After receiving consent to search, Officer located several small baggies with white residue inside, a few syringes and a half-bro-

ken Meth Pipe in the vehicle. Mr. Bailey was then placed under arrest, located in Mr. Bailey's wallet was .84 grams of a white crystal-like substance believed to be Methamphetamine. Mr. Bailey was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. All the above occurred in Lenoir City, TN.

Staffer

family member of a victim came to the evidence room to retrieve the family member's belongings. An office employee noticed that money was missing from the evidence box. A second incident of missing money also occurred which prompted an audit of the property and evidence rooms on October 19, 2020. Sharp did not show for work the day of the audit, and his employment was official-


ly terminated on October 22, 2020.

Based upon this investigation, in August 2022, Steven Sharp was indicted by the Shelby County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$2,500 and one count of official misconduct.

"Offices that maintain evidence must conduct periodic inventories to ensure that all

property is safeguarded," said Comptroller Mumpower. "It's also necessary to establish strong internal controls that help eliminate occasions when one person is left unattended with important and valuable assets."





the male (Tim Hughes, 39) if he knew the driver of the sedan to which he stated, "yes, she is coming to pick me up." Deputy then made contact with the driver (17), the driver stated Mr. Hughes had texted her and asked her to come pick him up, she believed they were just going to drive around. The driver stated she had worked with Mr. Hughes at Buddy's BBQ.

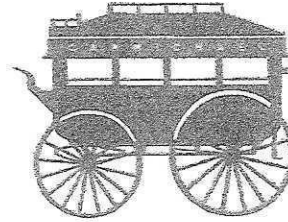
While speaking to Mr. Hughes, he was asked why he walked down the street from his house to meet the driver to which he replied, "I just got bored waiting on her." Deputy asked Mr. Hughes if he knew she was 17 to which he stated "yes but we are just going to get cigarettes, I don't have a license". Deputy asked Mr. Hughes why he didn't have his wife or other relatives at the house take him to the store, and he stated "I didn't want to wake up anyone". Deputy then asked him if his wife would be upset if she knew he wasn't at the house and he stated "she's already mad at me".

Deputy then spoke to the female with Mr. Hughes who stated her name was female(15), and that she was Mr. Hughes' step-daughter. Ms. Roberts stated she left the house with Mr. Hughes because she was afraid he would get in trouble again. Juvenile was reluctant on stating why she thought Mr. Hughes was going to get in trouble. Z Parmer with LCPD escorted juvenile back to her residence and notified juvenile mother of these events.

Upon contact with the driver of the sedan, the driver, she smelled strongly of an alcoholic beverage and raw marijuana. The driver pupils were dilated to the point that her irises were barely visible and she also had violent eyelid tremors. The driver denied having drunk any alcohol or used marijuana, however she did consent to a vehicle search. During the search Deputy did observe marijuana 'shake' throughout the vehicle and also in a backpack that she claimed possession of. When asked again, the driver did confess to smoking marijuana. The driver did refuse to participate in any sobriety tests. After checking the driver information through Loudon E911, it was confirmed that she had a Full-Extradite-Warrant out of Florida on a FTA (22296486). The driver was taken into custody for Underage DWI and the Florida Warrant. After being read the Miranda Warning, the driver confessed to drinking 4 shots of liquor and smoking marijuana this said evening. The driver also confessed to possessing 2 rolled blunts in her underwear. Once at the Juvenile Center, the driver retrieved said marijuana, she was also charged with Simple Possession.

Mr. Hughes was taken into custody for Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor and transported to the Loudon County Jail by Deputy C. Huskin 986. Deputy transported the driver to the Loudon County Juvenile Shelter and notified her mother. Said did occur in Loudon County, TN.

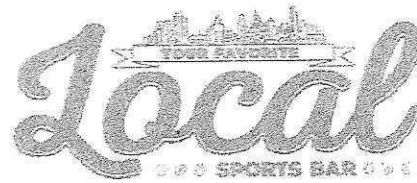
