Former Tennessee Law Enforcement Officer Sentenced for Federal Civil Rights Offenses

Former law enforcement officer Anthony "Tony" Bean (61), currently of Altamont, Tennessee, was sentenced by the Honorable Travis R. McDonough, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Chattanooga to 72 months in prison.

Tony Bean was convicted of using excessive force against arrestee C.G. on two

occasions during C.G.'s arrest in 2014, while Bean was the Chief of the Tracy City Police Department in Tracy City, Tennessee, and of using excessive force against arrestee F.M. during F.M.'s arrest in 2017, while Bean was the Chief Deputy of the Grundy County Sheriff's Office in Grundy County, Tennessee, in violation of Title 18 U.S.C. § 242. Following his

imprisonment, Bean will be on supervised release for 24 months.

In June of 2021, the court heard evidence over the course of three days that showed that, during C.G.'s arrest in the Tracy Lakes area of Grundy County in 2014, Bean repeatedly punched C.G. in the face while C.G. was handcuffed and compliant, causing C.G. pain and other injuries. The court

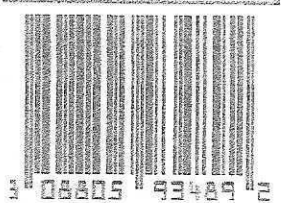

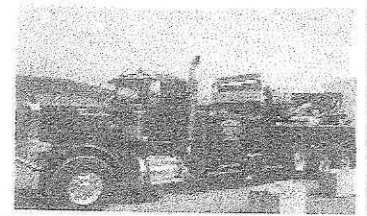

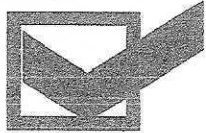

Scott Russo, 35, Louis Avenue Knoxville, was charged with Simple Possession, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, was conducting a patrol in the area of Highway 321 South in Lenoir City, TN. During patrol duties Officer observed a gray in color Chevy sedan traveling south on Highway 321.

While observing the vehicle Officer noticed that the window tint on the vehicle was dark to the point that you could not see into the vehicle. Officer also observed the Chevy sedan cross over three lanes of traffic on Highway 321 South where it turned into a parking lot. The Chevy sedan made the lane change from sitting in stationary traffic which was a result from a red light at the intersection of Highway

321 and Town Creek Parkway. The vehicle failed to use a turn signal 50 feet prior to making the lane change.

Officer initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle in the parking lot of Freddy's in Lenoir City, TN. Upon traffic stop Officer made contact with the driver, Scott Russo. RUSSO'S window tint on the vehicle registered at 15%. While speaking with RUSSO Officer noticed a strong odor of marijuana coming from inside of the vehicle along with visually observing a tray commonly used to roll marijuana blunts with and a blue colorful bag labeled Jett Smacker which was a bag that marijuana is sold in and is commonly found in states that legally sale marijuana.


Officer then had RUSSO step out of the vehicle to speak with him further about a citation and to speak with him about the odor of marijuana coming from his vehi-

cle. RUSSO stated that he did have marijuana inside of his bag located in the passenger's seat.

A probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted where Officer located two separate bags containing a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana (11.43 Grams), one bag containing

a crystal-like substance that RUSSO freely stated was methamphetamine (0.76 Grams), along with three hypodermic needles, one spoon with crystal residue and one marijuana grinder.

All items were located in a black bag containing property belonging to RUSSO.



Matthew Jones, 39, East 1st Ave Lenoir City, was charged with, DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Officer Kelley LPD, was dispatched to a reckless driver call that just turned onto Highway from Highway 72. The caller stated that a dark grey colored Toyota sedan tag #390BFRG was failing to maintain lane control. Officer Kelley was driving on Highway 11

When the said vehicle above occupied by a white male driver and white female passenger. Officer went to turn around Huffland drive when the driver of the said vehicle turned up Keene Street and what seemed to be trying to speed away before Officer could get behind the vehicle.

Officer Kelley came across the railroad tracks on Keene Street when he seen the dark colored Toyota over the curb in the oncoming lane of travel going to the side of a fence before turning onto Vale street when he struck a fence post on Vale street before going over the curb on the left side of the road when his car shut off. Once Officer made contact with the driver identified the driver as Matthew Jones when he stated he was trying to get to where he is staying at Vale street and was just trying to make it home.

Officer Kelley smelled a strong odor of Alcohol coming from his person, When Officer was getting Mr. Jones out of the driver seat Mr. Jones could not stand without holding onto his car as well as had slurred speech. Mr. Jones refused to do Field sobriety test and also refused to sign the Implied consent form. Mr. Jones was placed under arrest and transported to Loudon County jail. James towing has possession of his vehicle.

also heard evidence that, during F.M.'s arrest Grundy County in 2017, Bean punched F.M. in the face while F.M. was compliant, causing pain and other injuries. The court also heard evidence that Bean bragged about using excessive force against victims and failed to report his uses of force.

Deputy Assistant Attorney General Kristen Clarke of the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division, U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Tennessee Francis M. (Trey) Hamilton III, and FBI Knoxville Special Agent in Charge Joseph E. Carrico made the announcement.

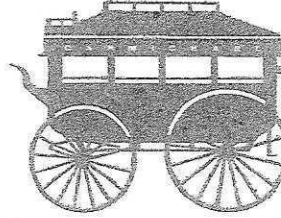
"Law enforcement officers who violate victims' rights also violate the trust of their communities," said Deputy Attorney General Kristen Clarke. "The Department of Justice will hold accountable those officers who abuse their authority, wherever they may be."

"Nobody is above the law," said U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton. "The defendant, Anthony "Tony" Bean abused his authority and violated the civil rights of arrestees by physically assaulting them while they were restrained and not posing any threat. A sentence of 72 months sends a strong message to the community that the abuse of arrestees will not be tolerated, and law enforcement officers who break the law will be held accountable for their actions."

"When an officer betrays the oath to protect and serve, the public is put at risk and the law enforcement community is tarnished," said Special Agent in Charge Joseph E. Carrico. "The public has a right to trust that officers will do the right thing. When they don't, the FBI remains committed to investigate and bring them to justice."

This case was investigated by the Knoxville Division of the FBI and was prosecuted by Trial Attorneys Kathryn E. Gilbert and Andrew Manns of the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division and Assistant United States Attorney James Brooks of the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Tennessee.
