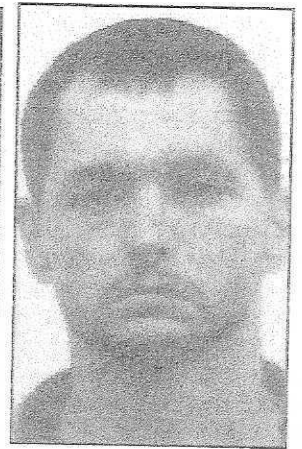

Former South Marshall Co. Volunteer Fire Dept. Treasurer Indicted for Theft

The former treasurer of the South Marshall Volunteer Fire Department in Marshall County stole \$48,310.83 from the department and now faces a 95-count indictment.

The Tennessee Comptroller's Office investigated the actions of Fred Haley, who served as the fire department's treasurer from October 31,

1991, until he was removed by the board on July 20, 2022.

Investigators determined that Haley stole the money by retaining cash proceeds from department fundraisers for his personal benefit (\$2,789), and by writing 90 unauthorized department checks to himself and his personal business, Marshall County Internet Service (\$45,521.83).

Haley paid back a total of \$437.35 to the department in 2022; however, a shortage of \$47,873.48 still exists.

During their investigation, Comptroller investigators found that Haley forged co-signer's signatures on at least four checks that were written to Haley and his personal business. In other

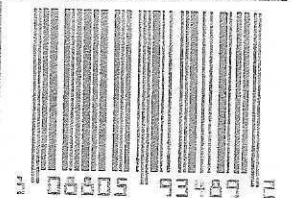

Jose Armando Vazquez, 25, 1st Avenue Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, License Required, and Driving on Roadway Laned for Traffic.

Officer A. Lee LCPD, was dispatched to a wreck on Mcghee Blvd. near Weigles. Upon arrival Officer made contact with Jose Armando Hernandez Vazquez, and passenger. Due to a language barrier, passenger assisted in translation with Jose prior to Sgt. Espinoza arriving on scene. The passenger advised Jose was the driver of the White Ford F-150 and she was the passenger. While investigating the crash Officer could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from Jose's breath and person. Officer asked the passenger to ask Jose how much alcohol he had consumed, to which Jose admitted he had consumed alcoholic beverages. A records check through

Central Dispatch revealed that Jose did not have a valid drivers license. In the back of the F-150 Officer located several empty containers of alcohol. Officer spoke with witnesses who advised that just prior to the crash they observed the White Ford F-150 traveling at a high rate of speed on Mcghee Blvd. The vehicle was then observed losing control, nearly striking one of the witnesses before striking a Jeep Cherokee, resulting in disabling damage to both vehicles. Once Sgt. Espinoza arrived on scene he asked Jose to perform SFST, to which he agreed. Sgt. Espinoza reports Jose performed poorly on all test administered. Due to the totality of the circumstances, Jose Armando Hernandez Vazquez was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. All the above did occur in Lenoir City, TN.

Elijah Morgan, 44, Foster Road Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Deputy Parks LCSO, was dispatched to the Loudon County Justice Center in reference to a prior domestic. The victim had flagged down a Lenoir City officer stating that her husband would not let her leave and told him of an assault that had occurred on 01/04/2023. Deputy made contact with victim who advised last night her husband, Mr. Elijah Morgan, and her had gotten into an argument. During the argument Mr. Morgan became irate and wrapped his hand around neck and began strangling her. Victim advised she kicked and tried to get away but could not overpower her husband and lost consciousness. The victim advised when she regained consciousness she vomited and dry heaved and attempted to run out of the room. Mr. Morgan then grabbed her from behind and put her in a choke hold and began strangling her

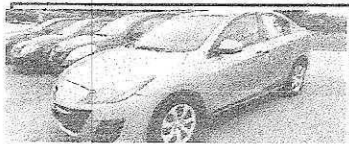
again. The victim advised her husband told her "I was not leaving, that he would kill me and then kill himself." Marks that were consistent with the assault were observed on victim neck and documented on Axon Body Worn Camera. The victim told deputies that she was in fear for her life and believed Mr. Morgan was going to go too far and kill her. The victim advised that Mr. Morgan told her that he would show her when they got home today and she believed that he was going to assault her again. This prompted the victim to flag down law enforcement. The victim filled out a statement form that is attached to this report. Deputies contacted the Loudon County Domestic Violence Center and transported Ms. Morgan to a place of safety for the night. Deputies responded to Foster Road and made contact with Mr. Elijah Morgan. Mr. Morgan was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Justice Center without incident.

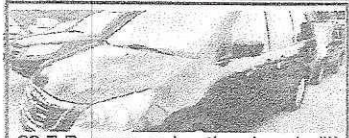

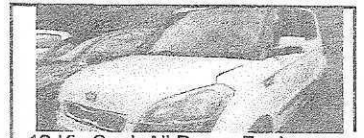

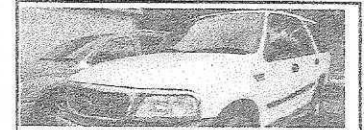

instances, investigators discovered the former treasurer often requested the second signatory to sign blank fire department checks.

In January 2023, the Marshall County Grand Jury indicted Fred Haley on 90 counts of theft of property under \$1,000, four counts of forgery, and one count of theft of property over \$10,000.

"This case is not unique in that the former treasurer was allowed control over receiving collections and making deposits. He also made disbursements, without anyone else reviewing or reconciling the bank statements," said Comptroller Mumpower. "Fire department officials must provide proper oversight to reduce the risk of fraud."

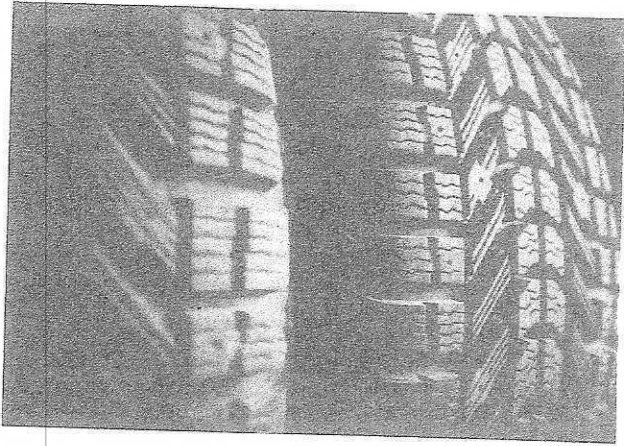

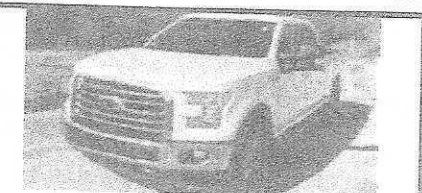

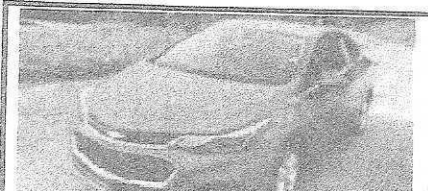
