Future Surge in Diabetes Could Dramatically Impact People Under 20 in U.S.

The number of young people under age 20 with diabetes in the United States is likely to increase more rapidly in future decades, according to a new modeling study published today in Diabetes Care. Researchers forecasted a growing number of people under age 20 newly diagnosed with diabetes during 2017-2060.

This expected upward trend may lead to as many as 220,000 young people having type 2 di-

abetes in 2060 —a nearly 700% increaseand the number of young people with type 1 diabetes could increase by as much as 65% in the next 40 years. Even if the rate of new diabetes diagnoses among young people remains the same over the decades, type 2 diabetes diagnoses could increase nearly 70% and type 1 diabetes diagnoses could increase 3%

Type 1 diabetes remains more common in U.S.

youth, but type 2 diabetes has substantially increased among young people over the last two decades. Given this upward trend, a total of 526,000 young people may have diabetes (including both type 1 and type 2 diabetes) by 2060. Comparatively, 213,000 young people in the United States had diabetes in




Deputy Harrison LCSO. was dispatched to Food City off Highway 72 to speak with a female in regards to a domestic that occurred at Tilley Road in Philadelphia a few hours prior. Once on scene, Deputy met with the complainant/victim, stated her boyfriend William Barr had vandalized her vehicle and threatened to kill her after the two had an argument. Victim stated the argument started over her finding marijuana under the house and confronting Barr about it. When an argument between the two started she attempted to walk out the front door at which point

Barr grabbed her hair to pull her back into the house. She was able to make it to the driver's seat of her vehicle while holding her infant son. Victim stated once she informed Barr she was going to call 911 he reached into the vehicle climbed over her and took the phone away. She then attempted to leave the residence, but Barr took his vehicle and blocked her in the driveway where she could not leave the residence. At this point, she drove back to the front of the residence as Barr got out of his truck and kicked the rear driver's side door, jumped on the roof of her vehicle caved it in, and went inside. Alan Myers, 42, Highway 95 Greenback, was charged with Aggravated Assault.



It's vital that we focus our efforts to ensure all Americans, especially our young people, are the healthiest they can be," said CDC Acting Principal Deputy Director Debra Houry, MD, MPH. "The COVID-19 pandemic underscored how critically important it is to address chronic diseases, like diabetes. This study further highlights the importance of continuing efforts to prevent and manage chronic diseases. not only for our current population but also for generations to come."

In addition to the overall predictions, analyses of these data by race and ethnicity predicted a higher burden of type 2 diabetes for Black, Hispanic/Latino, Asian, Pacific Islander, and American Indian/Alaska Native youth.

"Increases in diabetes—especially among young people—are always worrisome, but these numbers are alarming," said Christopher Holliday, PhD, MPH, MA, FACHE, director of CDC's Division of Diabetes Translation. "This study's startling projections of type 2

diabetes increases show why it is crucial to advance health equity and reduce the widespread disparities that already take a toll on people's health."

There could be several explanations for the rise in type 2 diabetes, including the increasing prevalence of childhood obesity. The presence of diabetes in people of childbearing age might be another important factor, because maternal diabetes increases risk of diabetes in children.


