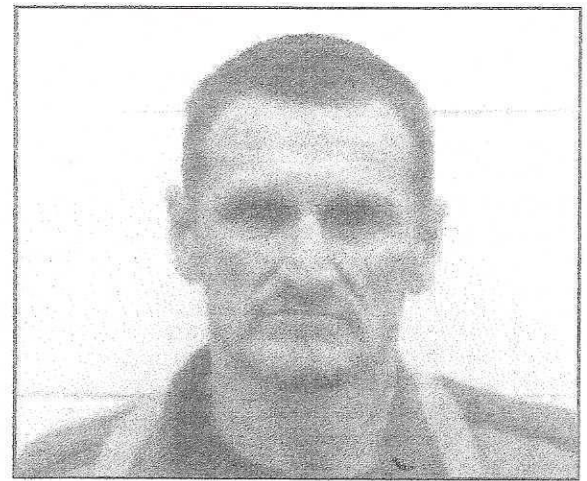

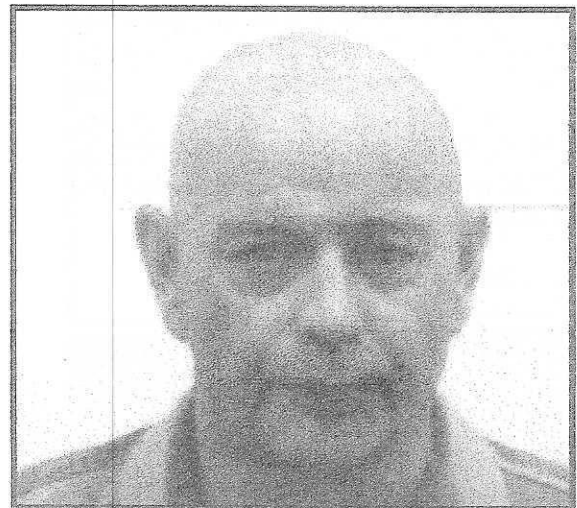

Former Main Street, Lawrenceburg, Inc. Director Indicted for Theft

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of April Judkins, the former director of Main Street, Lawrenceburg Inc. (MSL), a non-profit organization that worked toward economic restoration and revitalization of historic downtown Lawrenceburg.

Main Street, Law-

renceburg, Inc. was also the custodian of the funds of the James D. Vaughan Quartet Festival (JDV). Although JDV and MSL were each governed by separate boards, Judkins maintained their accounts and met with each board separately.

Investigators determined that from November 2015 through December 2018, Judkins stole MSL and

JDV funds totaling \$12,488.72.

Judkins stole this money by issuing herself unauthorized paychecks, unauthorized reimbursements for cell phone bills, extra expense reimbursements, withdrawing cash for personal use, and issuing herself an unauthorized bonus.

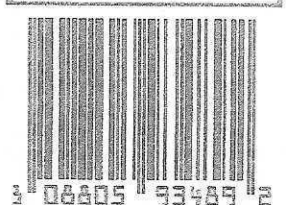

Deputy C. McVay LCSO, responded to Christensen Inlet in reference to recent reports of suspicious activity in the area around the abandoned Christensen Boat warehouse. On arrival, Deputy located a blue Chevy Colorado license DHZ245 parked at the end of the street next to several large concrete blocks and a metal chain blocking access to the property. Jill said she was with a male subject who was walking his dog near the building. Deputy Huskin asked Jill to exit the vehicle and walked her towards his patrol vehicle. Deputy noticed Jill was holding a small metal object in her left hand and Deputy asked to see it. Jill opened her hand and showed him a metal altoids container and said it was mints. Due to his training and experience Deputy know narcotics are frequently carried in metal cans such as this and asked if Deputy could see inside of it. Jill handed him the tin and when Deputy opened it he observed a white plastic bag with what appeared to

be methamphetamine in it and several loose pills. Jill spontaneously stated, "hey, those aren't my mints." Jill was placed in handcuffs and seated in the rear seat of my patrol vehicle and Deputy secured the container inside his vehicle. Deputy Huskin, Sgt. Rogers, and McVay approached the warehouse and located a section of metal

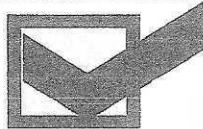

Paul Valencia, 51, Silver Maple Street Lenoir City, was charged with, Domestic Assault, and Aggravated Assault.

Officers with LCPD, were dispatched to Silver Maple St in regards to a physical Domestic. Dispatch advised Officers that the complainant ran over to the neighbors residence across the street and called 911 because Paul Valencia was beating the victim. Upon arrival, Officers could hear a female in distress inside the residence and made entry coming into contact with Paul Valencia. Due to the circumstances, Paul was detained at that time for Officer Safety due to the complainant stating that their was firearms in the home and that her step father was also intoxicated. Paul stated to Officers that he had been arguing with his wife and that it was only verbal and never became physical. Upon speaking with victim, she stated that while her and

her daughter was on the couch, he flipped all three of them over the couch and then got on top of her, covering her nose and mouth with one hand, and using the other to put around her neck. Victim did state that she was unable to breathe and did fear for her life in that instance. She also stated that she had been smacked in the face and on the arm and Officers did observe visible red marks in both locations stated above. Witness statement also coincided with her moms stating that he was choking her and covering her mouth so that she couldn't scream.

Five other children were in the home but were asleep and did not witness the altercation. Paul was determined to be the primary aggressor and was transported to the Loudon Co Jail by Officer Eldridge and will be charged with Aggravated Assault and Simple Assault (Domestic). This did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon Co, TN.

Investigators identified questionable transactions between the MSL and JDV accounts totaling \$57,473.45.

Investigators observed one note about a transfer between these accounts in the December 2014 meeting minutes of the MSL board of directors; however, no other MSL board minutes or documentation mentioned or approved any transfers through the end of Judkins's tenure as MSL Director. Neither the MSL or JDV boards had been made aware of the \$57,473.45 in transfers and payments noted in the investigative report.

As of January 1, 2019, the JDV account balance was \$167.11, and the MSL account balance was \$162.69. Judkins concealed this information from both boards until a new MSL board treasurer obtained bank statements and reported the suspicious payments to other board members in February 2019. April Judkins resigned in February 2019.

Today, the MSL has a new director and board and has unofficially rebranded

itself as Downtown Lawrenceburg. Management and control of JDV has been assumed by private interests.

On January 26, 2023, the Lawrence County Grand Jury indicted April Judkins for one count of theft of property over \$10,000 and two counts of money laundering offenses.

"A board of directors has a duty to ensure it is providing proper oversight of operations and finances," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "The former director was the only person in charge of the recordkeeping of MSL's and JDV's funds. Bank reconciliations were never completed during her tenure, and no review of her work was conducted until early 2019. A lack of oversight can lead to a scheme going undetected for years.
