

#### Threats

Matthew Klempa, 49, Jennings Drive North Carolina, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Speeding, and Retaliation of Past Acts.

Deputy Daniel Allen LCSO, stopped a black Nissan Versa on Highway 70 at Smith Valley Rd. Deputy had witnessed the black Versa pass him at a high rate of speed. Deputy confirmed the speed to be 65 MPH in a 45 MPH zone with radar. Upon approaching the vehicle on the passenger side, Deputty found Matthew David Klempa driving the Versa.

eyes and a strong smell of alcoholic beverages coming from his breath. Mr. Klempa was asked to exit the vehicle to perform standardized field sobriety testing. Mr. Klempa asked what would happen if he refused. Deputy explained to him he would have enough evidence to arrest him for driving under the influence at this point. Mr. Klempa agreed to exit the vehicle and perform testing. Mr. Klempa has a lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation. and onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both eyes. As Deputy began the instruction phase for the walk and turn Mr. Klempa had bloodshot test Mr. Klempa stated he

felt Deputy was "messing with him" and he was nervous. Mr. Klempa then stated he had to urinate before any further testing. Deputy told Mr. Klempa they were in a public setting and there was nowhere to urinate. He need to finish the testing. Mr. Klempa then asked what Deputt was going to do if he just went and urinated in the trees. As Mr. Klempa stated this he pointed to a subdivision sign next to the road. more aggressive. Mr. Klempa Deputy informed Mr. Klem-

pa that if he urinated in public he would have to arrest him. Deputy then asked if he was willing to finish the testing. Mr. Klempa stated he would finish the testing once he urinated. Deputy explained to Mr. Klempa that was not an option. He then became aggressive and threatening. Deputy placed Mr. Klempa under arrest for driving under the influence at this time. 



ensure public confidence in the electoral process by providing local points of contact within the Department for the public to report possible federal election law violations.

Federal law protects against such crimes as threatening violence against election officials or staff, intimidating or bribing voters, buying and selling votes, impersonating voters, altering vote tallies, stuffing ballot boxes, and marking ballots for voters against their wishes or without their input. It also contains special protections for the rights of voters, and provides that they can vote free from interference, including intimidation, and other acts designed to prevent or discourage people from voting or voting for the candidate of their choice. The Voting Rights Act protects the right of voters to mark their own ballot or to be assisted by a

person of their choice (where voters need assistance because of disability or inability to read or write in English).

In order to respond to complaints of voting rights concerns and election fraud during the upcoming election, and to ensure that such complaints are directed to the appropriate authorities, AUSA Heavener will be on duty in this District while the polls are open. He can be reached by the public at the following telephone numbers: (423) 823-5009 or (423) 218-6652.

In addition, the FBI will have special agents available in each field office and resident agency throughout the country to receive allegations of election fraud and other election abuses on election day. The local FBI field office can be reached by the public at (865) 544-0751.

Complaints about possible


violations of the federal voting rights laws can be made directly to the Civil Rights Division in Washington, DC by phone at 800-253-3931 or by complaint form at https:// civilrights.justice.gov/.

"Ensuring free and fair elections depends in large part on the assistance of the American electorate," stated United States Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III. "It is important that those who have specific information about voting rights concerns or election fraud make that information available to the Department of Justice."

Please note, however, in the case of a crime of violence or intimidation, please call 911 immediately and before contacting federal authorities. State and local police have primary jurisdiction over polling places, and almost always have faster reaction capacity in an emergency.




