### Agg. Trespass

Steiner Sanford, 54, East Lamar Alexandra Parkway, was charged with Aggravated Criminal Trespass, and

Theft of Property.

Deputy Reagan LCSO, responded to Lakeview Road in reference to 2 males on the property that were not supposed to be. While enroute, the complainant stated that Steiner Sanford (Arrestee) has been told on multiple occasions that he is not allowed to be on the property and that if he needs to collect belongings he will need an escort from law enforcement due to being in fear of Sanford. The complainant also stated that he had set up an escort approximately one month ago to which Sanford did not show up for. Before Deputy arrived at the residence, he observed a red Ford F-350 pulling a trailer pass him on Lakeview Rd. After arriving

on scene, Deputy saw that the described vehicle was no longer on scene. Knowing that this vehicle matched the description from the complainant, Deputy Slattery stopped the vehicle for further investigation. Deputy Slattery observed the males before stopping them, throwing objects into the woods on Elm Hill Rd. After further investigation, it was discovered that the objects were a tree stand and a car battery. When Deputy Reagan arrived on scene with Slattery, he spoke with the (passenger) and he stated that he was picked up from Maryville by Steiner Sanford in the above vehicle and was told that they were going to the above address to pick up property. The passenger stat-ed that they arrived and began collecting the belongings and Sanford collected a tree stand from the front porch and a car battery from the driveway. After leaving the residence, the

passenger stated that Sanford told him "we need to get rid of the tree stand and battery" and at that point they stopped and removed the items from the truck. Sanford refused to answer questions. Deputy Slattery went back to the address and spoke with (Victim/Complainant) and after reviewing video from the front

of the house, they observed Sanford taking the belongings and placing them into the trailer. The items combined totaling \$378. Steiner Sanford was placed into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. This did happen in Loudon County, TN.



Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, initiated a traffic stop on a gold in color Honda SUV in the parking lot of 1204 Highway 321 (Bimbos Gas Station) in Lenoir City, TN for a brake light not functioning properly. During the roadside investigation Officer requested K9 Deputy E. Curtis and his partner K9 Loki to respond to his location to conduct an openair sniff of the vehicle. K9 Deputy E. Curtis was able to respond to the location of the traffic stop within a rea-

sonable about of time where he deployed K9 Loki for an open-air sniff of the vehicle. Officer was then informed by K9 Deputy E. Curtis that K9 Loki alerted to a positive odor of narcotics coming from inside of the vehicle. A probable cause search of the vehicle was then conducted. During the subsequent search of the vehicle, Officer located a black back bag in the rear seat of the vehicle. Inside of the backpack was a smaller black bag that contained: Approximately (53 grams) of a crystal-like substance which tested positive for Methamphetamine (Bagged Separately), approximately (2.93 grams) of a gray powder like substance which tested positive for Cocaine (Bagged Separately), approximately (1.56 grams)

of an orange powder like substance which tested positive for Fentanyl and (9) Suboxone Strips. Located near the black backpack in the rear seat of the vehicle was a crown royal bag that contained a black digital scale which had a white powdery substance contained on it and two large bags which contained several smaller bags ("Dime Bags") inside

of them which are commonly used to distribute narcotics. Kayley Marcum who was the passenger was mirandized where she stated the items located in the vehicle belonged to her. the Trustee deposit records revealed that Sikes only deposited \$20,960 in collections.

Christopher Sikes was the only shelter employee authorized to void receipts; and he was only person who could access collections from the safe, prepare shelter collections for deposit, and deliver deposits to the Trustee.

Based upon this investigation, in November 2023, the Hardin County Grand Jury indicted Christopher Justin Sikes for one count of theft of property over \$10,000, one count of forgery over \$10,000, one count of computer crimes over \$2,500, one count of destruction of and tampering with governmental records, and one count of official misconduct.

"Hardin County officials should ensure that one person is not given exclusive control over key financial processes," said Comptroller Mumpower. "Separating financial duties reduces the risk that errors or misappropriations will go undetected.'





(1) (A) Four (4) months from the date of the first publication (or posting, as the case may be) of this notice if the creditor received an actual copy of this notice to creditors at least sixty (60) days before the date that is four (4) months from the date of the first publication (or posting); or

(B) Sixty (60) days from the date the creditor received an actual copy of the notice to creditors if the creditor received the copy of the notice less than sixty (60) days prior to the date that is four (4) months from the date of first publication (or posting) as described in (1) (A); or

(2) Twelve (12) months from the decedent's date of death.




