Yoshawn Rollins, 33, Lake Drive Loudon, was charged with Child Abuse or Neglect/Endangerment.


Officer Mike Williams LCSO, was notified by Loudon Elementary School Teachers of a 3rd grade student who had injuries to his back which could possibly have been caused from being abused at home. The student was complaining of his back being sore and hurting and showed teacher his injuries. She brought him to the clinic where school nurse examined him. Once brought to Deputy attention, he went and examined said injuries himself and discovered that he had two large stripes, red and bluish in color, on his shoulder which extended to the center of his back. Said stripes were consistent with that of a belt injury. Victim also had darker bruising on his lower back just above his buttocks. When Deputy asked what had happened he said that his dad had hit him

with a belt because he had gotten bad marks at school. Victim stated that his dad (Yoshawn Rollins) says that for every bad mark he gets on his school's behavfor chart, then he will get the same amount of hits with a belt. Deputy immediately notified LCSO Detective Capt. Charlie Cosner who advised to do a DCS referral and to keep the victim at school until Investigator Marty Branam responded.

No further questions were asked by this officer, Investigator Branam arrived and the investigation was turned over to him. DCS also responded and along with Investigator Branam went to victims residence to talk with the father. Victim was released to family member upon consent of Investigator Branam, DCS and victim father Yoshawn.







In a complaint filed with the United States District Court in May 2021, the United States and the State of Tennessee alleged that, from October 2014 through December 2016, a former pharmacist and store manager at Walgreens' specialty pharmacy in Kingsport. Tennessee falsified prior authorization requests and supporting clinical records for 65 TennCare enrollees who failed to meet Tenn-Care prior authorization requirements for the DAAs. The complaint further alleged that Walgreens improperly billed TennCare for DAAs dispensed to the TennCare enrollees based on the falsified requests, and that Walgreens knowingly retained the resulting overpayments after the misconduct of its former store

manager came to light.

As part of the settlement, the parties filed a joint stipulation of dismissal with the United States District Court, dismissing the complaint.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee made the announcement.

Assistant U.S. Attorneys Robert C. McConkey, III and Joseph C. Rodriguez represented the United States. Assistant Attorneys General David Rudolph and Tony Hullender represented the State of Tennessee.




