



According to the report, Investigators with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office Narcotics Unit executed a search warrant of a residence located at 300 Kagley Dr. Lenoir City, TN. Residents present during the execution of the search warrant were as follows: female (Room B) Phillip Bernin (Room C), Nathan Henderson (Room i), Christopher Henderson (Room J).

Upon search of room C Deputy Hawkins recovered various types of drug paraphernalia, including cut straws, pipes, used syringes, tinfoil with burn marks, small boxes and rubber containers, glass jars, which all contained drug residue.

Upon search of room i Investigators Green and Jenkins recovered approximately 2 grams of marijuana and 6 white oval pills identified as Gabapentin located on the nightstand. Investigators also recovered various types of drug paraphernalia, including meth pipes, used syringes, digital scales, empty baggies, and marijuana pipes, which all contained drug residue. Upon search of room J Cpl. Gray and Deputy Dishner located a loaded syringe, a marijuana pipe, and 10 used syringes.

All evidence was recovered and placed into evidence bags and transported to Loudon County Sheriff's Office to be logged. Room i also contained various rounds of ammunition and magazines, which were transported to Loudon County Sheriff's Office for


safekeeping. Phillip Bernin, Nathan Henderson, and Christopher Henderson were taken into custody and transported to Loudon County Jail. The female was left with a copy of the Search Warrant and a list of all items taken from the residence. All the above did occur in Loudon County, TN.

Richard Strauser, 54, North Huff Ferry Road Lenoir City, was charged with Mfg/Del/ Sale or Poss. of Meth, Violation of Probation, Tampering Fabricating with Evidence. Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, Speeding, and Signals for turns.

Chancey Green, 41, Foster Road Lenoir City, was charged with Capias, Violation of Probation, and Tampering/Fabrication of Evidence.

Deputy Harrison LCSO, observed a silver Mazda traveling on interstate 75 southbound signaling its lane change mid-way through the lane change and traveling 75mph in a 70mph zone. Deputy conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle on the 76 southbound exit ramp. Once Deputy made contact with the driver, Richard Strauser, and the passenger Chancey Green, Green appeared visibly ner-

vous and Strauser stated he did not have his license. Deputy had Strauser exit the vehicle, and while doing so he observed a needle in plain view under the driver seat. While writing a warning for the initial traffic violations and speaking with Strauser further, he stated he is on probation and has a history of meth use. Consent to search the vehicle was granted. While removing Green from the vehicle he stated he had a used needle in his front right pocket. After consent searching both occupants, Deputy continued with a consent probable cause search of the vehicle. During his search, Deputy located a small clear baggie with crystal-like residue on the passenger floorboard bit in half and wet. When Deputy asked Green if he ate the narcotics that were in the bag he stated he did. While continuing his search of the vehicle. Deputy located approximately

0.9g of methamphetamine in a half-gallon chocolate milk jug the driver was in possession of during the stop. During the duration of the investigation. the contents of the bag continued to dissolve due to the narcotics sitting in the liquid. Based on the above facts, both subjects were placed in custody. Narcotics investigator C. Jenkins arrived on the scene and assisted with the arrests. Loudon County Dispatch also

advised Chancey Green had an active Lenoir City warrant, and Straucer's license was suspended.

Once on scene at the jail, it was confirmed both subjects had violation of probation warrants out of Loudon County General Sessions. A TruNarc scan was conducted on the substance which resulted in a positive scan for meth and/or fentanyl.



CPL Chance Gray LCSO, was dispatched to Holland Trail about possible theft and vandalism. Upon arrival, Deputy made contact with victim, who stated that she had been in an argument with her baby's father Mr. Bryson Young approximately four days ago. She stated that she left the home to avoid the argument and stayed gone for four days to let things calm down. She advised that she returned home to retrieve things for herself and the children to find items of hers and the children's missing. She stated that she began looking for the items to find that Mr. Young had burnt an H2oGO blowup invadable water toy in the fire pit in the back yard burnt. She stated that her daughter's Chromebook laptop was also missing. She stated that she asked Mr. Young what happened to the laptop to which he stated that he did not know. Mr. Young did advise her that

he burnt the blow-up water toy. I then began speaking with Mr. Young who stated that he did burn the water toy, but he thought that it was just junk in the yard and did not know anything about the laptop. Mr. Young then stated that he burnt the toy due to it having a hole in it. Mr. Young was taken into custody for vandalism. The value of the water toy is 499.00, and the laptop is 80.00 according to Ms. Farmer.. Heroin Found in Traffic Stop

Erik Stewart, 42, Hixson Pike Hixson, was charged with, DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Man/Sell/

Del Resale Sch. I.

Dep. L. Hawkins LCSO, was dispatched to the area of Interstate 75 South in reference to a reckless driver. The caller, had been observing a 2004 Silver Pontiac Grand Prix from inside Knox County into Loudon County. She stated the vehicle was unable to maintain its lane and was fluctuating speed. Deputy was stationary at the 69MM observing traffic when the described vehicle passed him. Deputy

milled out into traffic and was unable to conduct a traffic stop until the 64 MM inside Monroe due to heavy traffic. Dep. Kirkland made contact with the driver, Erik Stuart. He observed the male falling asleep and was opening the Weather App on his phone when asked for his registration. Mr. Stuart was asked to exit the vehicle and consented to S.F.S.T. and he preformed poorly. Deputy then conducted A.R.I.D.E and Mr. Stuart showed indicators of impairment. During testing, Mr. Stuart began to fall asleep multiple times. He was placed into custody at that time and read the Implied Consent form, he refused to provide a sample. Deputy and Dep. Parks conducted a vehicle inventory and located a small baggie with brown power inside it, in the drivers side floorboard. Deputy asked Mr. Stuart what this substance was, he replied "Probably heroin because that's what my friend uses." This bag weighed at .53g and was tested, via TruNarc scan# 1901, by Inv. C. Green. TruNarc testing showed the substance to be Fentanyl. A search of his persons was conducted but no other illegal items were found. James Wrecker Service towed the vehicle and Deputy transported him to The Loudon County, Jail. During his booking, .4g of a brown rock substance was found inside his wallet. All the above did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

consider centralizing its accounting functions under one office. The county already has centralized budgeting and purchasing, and it would minimize duplication of effort if it also centralized accounting.

"We are encouraged that new leadership in Hardeman County is taking these audit findings seriously," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "It's my hope that the new county mayor will work with the county commissioners and the Audit Committee to correct all areas of deficiency, noncompliance, and weakness within the government."

Asked about the manufacturer of the balloon or whether its design was based on stolen intelligence, Paul said the FBI is not in position "at this point to have that information." He said both the FBI Laboratory and OTD are working to determine the source of the balloon components. Additionally, the FBI has no information or physical evidence (at this time) that

contradicts previous statements made by other government agencies.

The Laboratory Division leads the collection, transportation, and subsequent forensic examinations of evidentiary material. It is staffed with subject matter experts, including highly trained evidence response dive teams and hazardous evidence response teams, which contribute to the mission of collecting, analyzing, and sharing timely scientific and technical information within the FBI and with other government and law enforcement agencies.

The OTD is the FBI's provenance for applied technology enabling and enhancing investigations. OTD personnel have been deployed to assist with recovery efforts and initial assessments of technological evidence.
