
While speaking with DANIELS he stated that the two of them were on their way back from Pigeon Forge, TN. While writing my citation, DANIELS gave verbal consent to conduct a search of the entire vehicle. Prior to Officer search of the vehicle KIRKSEY advised Deputy Sartin of the Loudon Coun-

ty Sheriff's Office that she had aluminum foil under her floor mat that she had used to smoke fentanyl with earlier.

A search of the vehicle revealed the foil that KIRK-SEY advised officers about. Officer then conducted a search of DANIELS person where Oficer located a plastic bag containing (141) Blue M30 Percocet Pills in

his front right pocket. While under arrest both DANIELS and KIRKSEY were mirandized where they stated that they had just purchased the pills at a location in the Knoxville area.

Both DANIELS and KIRKSEY admitted that the Blue M30 Pills that they had purchased were pressed fentanyl pills.



Preston Mills, 20, Hendricks Loop Madisonville. was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic, and Open Container.

Sgt. Rogers LCSO, observed a flat bed Dodge Ram truck failing to maintain it's lane while on Fork Creek Rd. At one point the vehicle was completely in the oncoming lane of travel. Once the driver corrected the vehicle it traveled into the oncoming lane 3 more times between Calloway and Steekee Creek Rd, the driver also violently jerked the truck back when it nearly ran off the roadway. According to the report, Officer Parmer LCPD, was dispatched to Town Creek Village Apartments, Cory Drive, in regards to a suspicious vehicle. The complainant, a resident at the apartment complex, advised Central Dispatch that approximately an hour ago, a male knocked on his door, asking to speak with a female named Anna.

The ID picture matched the


subject which we were out with and when ran through Central Dispatch, Mr. Aguilera came back with a VOP out of Loudon County Criminal Court (2019-CR278).






