

Deputy Watson LCSO, observed a gray sedan traveling on Niles Ferry Road. The vehicle was straddling the solid yellow line in the middle of the roadway. 

explaining that this was not allowed. Said happened in Loudon Co.



He was interviewed by the National Park Service as his home and admitted that he was driving the vehicle when the accident occurred. Based on an analysis of the vehicle's air bag module, the National Park Service determined that the vehicle was fully accelerated and traveling at 90 miles per hour just seconds before the accident occurred.

The surviving victim provided a victim impact statement to the court explaining how the accident has affected her life. The deceased victim's family members also provided victim impact statements and were present in court for the sentencing hearing. The deceased victim's father addressed the court on behalf of the family.

The investigation was led by the National Park Service, Investigative Service Branch.
