

Dennis Slover, 57, Homeless Lenoir City, was charged with Criminal Impersonation, Driving on Suspended/Revoked License, and Financial

Responsibility. Officer Law LCPD, was on routine patrol when he observed a Tan Dodge Truck (TN Tag 162-BHDH) without registration lights, and after further investigation the tag displayed on the vehicle should have been displayed on a Black Dodge Charger. Upon conducting a traffic stop Officer identified the driver and the passenger, after running the driver through the Criminal Justice Portal the name and date of birth he provided did not match any Tennessee records. 

provide valid proof of insurance upon request. A second records check was conducted to confirm the suspended license status and check for warrants.





Dexter Young, 31, Oak Lane Carryville, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Corporal Christina Wallen LCSO, responded to the area of Sugarlimb Rd at Hotchkiss Valley Rd on the report of a possible domestic assault in progress. Upon my arrival, Deputy contacted the victim/complainant. who stated that she had been struck multiple times with both a closed fist and an open hand in her face while she was driving. Victim did have visible redness and swelling on the right side of her face and right ear. Victim stated that the assailant was her ex-boyfriend, Dexter Young (offender), with whom she had been traveling. Deputy spoke with Young who said that he and victim had been in a verbal altercation in the car the two were traveling in. Young did not have any apparent injuries and denied any assault by victim. Dep-

uty determined that Young was the primary aggressor, and Deputy Ryan Fleming took Young into custody for Domestic Assault. This all did occur in Loudon County,

While searching and inventorying Young's belongings, Deputy located 3 different cell phones in Young's possession. There were 3 sim cards located in a small ring box along with folded pieces of paper in Young's bag. These pieces of paper had several different account numbers, various routing numbers, and multiple names. Also located in Young's possession were several different bank cards that did not belong to Young. Young was advised of his Miranda rights and asked about these items in his possession. Young declined to comment on how he obtained these items, their origin, or their purpose for them being in his possession.



false claim that he had brain cancer. The specific count of conviction involves the use of the church credit card to buy a luxury watch from an expensive retailer in California for \$3,711.

Apps faces a possible sentence of up to 20 years' imprisonment on the wire fraud count, along with significant fines, restitution, and forfeiture of property.

Assistant United States Attorney Steven Neff represents the United States.

The investigation was conducted by the FBI as part of the Smoky Mountains Financial Crimes Task Force.

Members of the public are reminded that an indictment constitutes only charges and that every person is presumed innocent until their guilt has been proven beyond a reasonable doubt.

Brothers Convicted of Methamphetamine Con-

spiracy

A federal jury convicted brothers Julio Garcia, 42, and Juan Garcia, 38, of conspiracy to distribute 500 grams or more of methamphetamine. United States Attorney Kevin G. Ritz announced the guilty verdict.

According to information presented in court, in 2019, investigators with Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) began investigating the drug trafficking activities of the brothers. Julio Garcia was serving a 10-year federal sentence at the time for another drug offense and while in custody he used contraband phones to continue his drug

trafficking activities.

Juan Garcia, who was not in custody, served as a "mid-dle-man." He was tasked with, among other things, accepting payments for shipments of narcotics and depositing the money from those payments into various bank accounts. During this conspiracy, investigators were able to seize two shipments, each containing over 1 kilogram of methamphetamine.

Julio Garcia is scheduled to be sentenced on June 27, 2023, and Juan Garcia is scheduled to be sentenced on June 28, 2023, both before United States District Judge Mark S. Norris. Both men face not less than 10 years imprisonment, not more than life, not more than a \$10,000,000 fine, and not less than five years of supervised release.

This case was investigated by Homeland Security Investigation, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the United States Postal Inspection Service, the Shelby County Sheriff's Office, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, and the Desoto County Sheriff's Department.

This prosecution, as well as the previous investigation into Julio Garcia, is part of an investigation conducted by the Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Force (OC-DETF). OCDETF is a joint federal, state, and local cooperative approach to combat drug trafficking organizations and organized criminal enterprises, targeting national and regional level drug trafficking organizations, and coordinating the necessary law enforcement entities and resources to disrupt or dismantle the targeted criminal organization and seize their assets.






