FBI Takes 30x30 Pledge to Recruit More Women Agents, Police

Effort expected to advance diversity, strengthen partnerships, and enhance operational success

Two female special agents from the FBI Houston Division perform tactical skills training in a stairwell.

The FBI has joined a push to recruit more female sworn law enforcement officers and to empower them professionally.

In its commitment to the 30x30 Initia-

tive, the FBI and other participating law enforcement agencies have pledged to:

Increase representation of women in recruiting classes to at least 30% by 2030;

Promote agency culture and standards that set up female officers for success; and

Share progress, successes, and challenges with others in the 30x30 network.

"The FBI is com-

mitted to ensuring our work environment supports the recruitment, development, and advancement of our female sworn officers," said FBI Director Christopher Wray about the FBI's decision to take the 30x30 Pledge. "This important commitment reflects our continued dedication to bringing

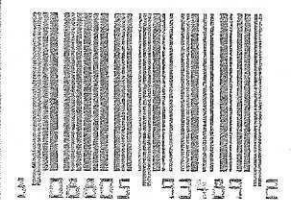

Wreck

Christopher Treece, 30, IROQUIOUS ROAD Oak Ridge, was charged with DUI, and Simple Possession x2.

Deputy A. Gann LCSO, was dispatched to the area of Hwy 95 and National Campground for a wreck-no injury. Upon arrival, across the street of 22008 Hwy 95, Deputy noticed a vehicle in the ditch with the headlights pointing toward the road. As Deputy approached the vehicle,

Deputy witnessed Mr. Christopher Treece (offender) kneeling down between his open door frame and the ground, passed out. Deputy woke Mr. Treece up and asked if he was okay. Mr. Treece denied medical treatment and stated he was fine. Deputy asked Mr. Treece what caused him to wreck his vehicle to which he stated he passed out at he wheel due to working long hours and fell asleep. During this conversation, Deputy noticed Mr. Treece could not carry a full sentence with me. Deputy then asked Mr. Treece if he was under the influence of any drugs or alcohol to

which he replied by stating "No.". Mr. Treece did consent to the Standardized Field Sobriety Test to which he performed very poorly. At this time, Mr. Treece was taken into custody for driving under the influence. Mr. Treece then told me he was in possession of some methamphetamine and heroin. Mr. Treece was read his Miranda rights at this time for any further investigative questions. Mr. Treece told deputies that it could be located in the driver-side door panel. After a search in that area, .5 grams of a white, crystal like substance believed to be methamphetamine along with .6 grams of a brown substance believed to heroin was found and taken as evidence. Mr. Treece was read the implied consent law to which he consent to give blood. Mr. Treece was transported to the Fort Loudoun Emergency Room to complete his Blood Alcohol Kit. Mr. Treece was then transported to the Loudoun County Jail without incident. This did occur in Loudoun County, Tn.

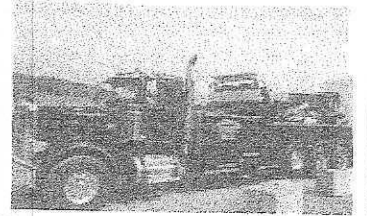

Pursuit

Early Monday morning the Tennessee Highway Patrol attempted a traffic stop on a grey Nissan Titan just inside Knox County. The vehicle refused to stop and fled into Loudon County in the area of Beals Chapel Road in Lenoir City.

Several LCSO units joined THP in the pursuit in an attempt to get the vehicle stopped. Deputy Shane Gaumer successfully used spike strips to immobilize the vehicle. Once

the vehicle was stopped the driver fled on foot but was taken into custody by Deputy Michael Stanley and the THP after a foot pursuit.

The Tennessee Highway Patrol is investigating the incident and the driver, Stacy Parker, out of Georgia, is being at the Loudon County Detention Facility.

Dominic Ray, 35, Greendale Drive St. Louis, was charged with Simple Possession x2.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, responded to the area of Highway 321 at the intersection of Creekwood Park Blvd in Lenoir City, TN to assist Sgt. B. Rayfield with a two-vehicle wreck that occurred in his presence. While on scene Officer made contact with one of the drivers involved in the accident who was identified as, Dominic Ray, of St. Louis, MO. While speaking with RAY in regards to the wreck Officer noticed a strong odor of

marijuana coming from his person and from the inside of his vehicle. When asked about the odor of marijuana, RAY, stated that he had a couple marijuana blunts that were already rolled inside of the vehicle. A probable cause search of RAY'S entire vehicle was conducted. During the subsequent search of the vehicle, Officer located one marijuana blunt inside of the female passengers purse which was located in the passenger's side floorboard of the vehicle. The female was identified. Officer also located a black fanny pack in the driver's seat of the vehicle during the search that con-

tained a small bag containing (5) colorful chalky-like pills believed to be MDMA (Ecstasy) along with two rolled marijuana blunts (3.00 grams). Officer also recovered a CANIK TP9sfx 9mm handgun from the same fanny pack. RAY stated that the

handgun belonged to him. RAY was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail. Passenger was issued a citation for simple possession of SCH VI (Marijuana) with a court date of May 17th, 2023, at Loudon County General Sessions Court

more women into our special agent cadre, FBI police, and the FBI's leadership ranks. We are honored to join more than 260 of our policing partners in making this commitment."

Law enforcement agencies from across the United States—and a handful from Canada—have also taken the pledge. Private sector and academic organizations are also taking part in the wider 30x30 effort. The National Association of Women Law Enforcement Executives and the New York University School of Law's Policing Project are sponsoring the initiative.

"The Department of Justice joined this effort in September 2022 to help fulfill the executive order on advancing effective, accountable policing and

criminal justice practices to enhance public trust and public safety," explained Kisha Winston, a supervisory special agent in the FBI's Office of Diversity and Inclusion. "That directive called for strengthening federal law enforcement recruitment, hiring, promotions, and retention practices with a focus on promoting an inclusive, diverse, and expert law enforcement workforce." She added that making law enforcement agencies better mirror the communities they serve will enhance public safety.

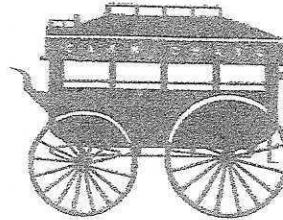
