Christopher Guyton, 37, Bakertown Road Knoxville, was charged with, Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. I & II, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Misuse of Evidence of Registration.

Deputy Harrison LCSO, observed a white Nissan Altima on Pond Creek Road bearing the wrong registration plate. Deputy conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle On Mccrary Street. Upon contact with the driver, Christopher Guyton, he stated he did not have the vehicle registered in his name and the tag on the vehicle belonged to another vehicle. While the passenger was attempting to locate information on the vehicle, Deputy had Guyton exit and step back to the front of his patrol vehicle. While speaking with Guyton, He stated he was currently on probation out of Knox County for possession charges. Based on his probation, Deputy asked if there was anything illegal in the vehicle to which he stated "Not that I know of". Guyton denied a consent search of the vehicle. Deputy removed the front seat passenger, and spoke

with her further. The female stated there was approximately 1 gram of marijuana in her

While waiting for an additional unit to arrive Guyton began to profusely sweat. Once Deputy Curtis arrived, Deputy began a probable cause search of the vehicle. While conducting the search, Loudon County Dispatch advised Guyton had eight active warrants out of Knox County and two out of Roane County:

Located behind the driver seat in a homemade magnetic box, Deputy located 3 black zip pouches along with a scale. Inside the first bag were unused small clear baggies. The second bag contained two separate bags of meth totaling approximately 4.88 grams. The third bag contained 9 bags with approximately 18 grams of heroin. Man Barricades Himself

At 1:05 pm Lenoir City Police received a call of a domestic dispute on Bell Avenue. When they responded they met with a victim who had no life threatening injuries and heard a shot inside the residence. At that time the suspect retreated back into the home and a barricaded himself in and a second shot was heard. At that point a perimeter was set up and more units called in.

Members of the Lenoir City Police Department, Loudon County Sheriff's Department responded and Blount Countv SWAT Unit was contacted to assist. The BCSO responded to the scene and took over the inner perimeter and after some time were able to get the subject to give up. He retreated back into the residence in an aggressive manner and a flash bang grenade was used to subdue the suspect where he was taken into custody.

Former Department Of Energy Contractor tenced To 121 Months For Distributing And Possessing Child Pornography

The Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, United States District Judge for the Eastern District of Tennessee, sentenced David Bryon King, age 57, to serve 121 months in federal prison followed by a lifetime on supervised release for attempted distribution and possessing child pornography. During the time of the offense, King was a contractor working as a fire inspector for the Oak Ridge National Laboratory.

According to the filed plea agreement, King admitted that he distributed child pornography to others in 2022, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2522A(a)(2)(B), and possessed child pornography in 2021 and 2022, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2252A(a)(5) (B). King was identified as

making online payments to individuals believed to be selling child pornography. Agents with the Department of Energy Office of Inspector General interviewed King at his residence. During the interview, King admitted to being in possession of child pornography, specifically on his smartphone. Agents seized the device and obtained a federal search warrant to search the device. Forensic analyses of King's smartphone uncovered images and videos of child pornography and other evidence linking King to the attempted distribution of child pornography.

"Protecting children and holding perpetrators countable is a top priority for the U.S. Attorney's Office and we will continue to work with our law enforcement partners to investigate and prosecute child exploitation cases," said United States Attorney Francis M. Hamil-

"I commend our agents and our partners at the Department of Justice and the U.S. Attorney's Office for investigating and prosecuting such heinous crimes against children," said Teri L. Donaldson, Inspector General for the Department of Ener-"Our investigators will continue doing everything they can to identify and investigate instances of child exploitation within the Department. Crimes against children have absolutely no place anywhere, and we will continue working with the Department of Justice and U.S. Attorney's Offices around the country to investigate and prosecute the offenders."

The case was investigated by the Department of Energy Office of Inspector General.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Jennifer Kolman represented the United States.




