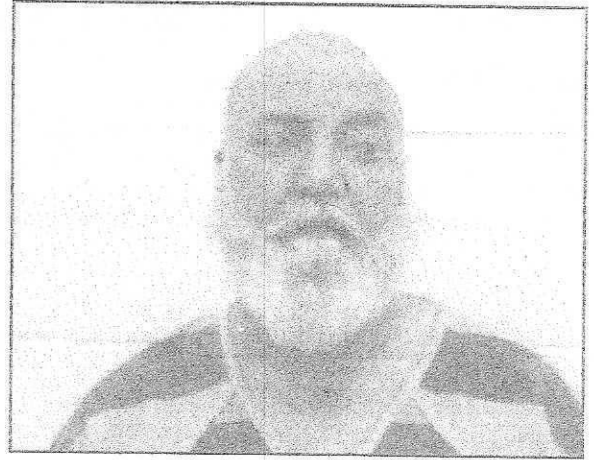

Andrew Stephen Couch Sentencing To 60 Years For Production Of Child Pornography

Andrew Stephen Couch, 37, currently of Knoxville, Tennessee, was sentenced to 720 months' imprisonment by the Honorable Katherine A. Crytzer, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Knoxville.

As part of the plea agreement filed with the court, Couch agreed to plead guilty to an indictment charging him with

two counts of production of child pornography in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2251(a). After his release from imprisonment, he will be on lifetime supervised release. Couch will be required to register with state sex offender registries and comply with special sex offender conditions during his supervised release.

According to the filed plea agreement, in December 2019, after

receiving a report that Couch was distributing child pornography, a search warrant was conducted at Couch's home. Couch's cellular phone was seized and forensically examined. Located on the cellular phone were multiple videos of child pornography produced by Couch wherein he was engaged in sexually explicit acts with

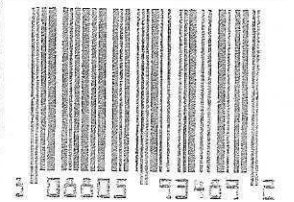

Seth Byrd, 22, Hurst Circle Lenoir City, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Misuse of Evidence of Registration, and Driving Unregistered Vehicle.

Investigator Green LCSO, was conducting surveillance at N. Clear Branch Road in attempt to locate Kali Russell, which had active warrants for theft of property, burglary, and vandalism out of Loudon County. Investigator observed a white Dodge 1500 occupied by Seth Byrd (Driver) and Kali Russell (Passenger) leave the residence.

The Investigator followed behind and was able to conduct a traffic stop at Piney

Hills Park after Mr. Byrd began driving at an extremely high rate of speed upon noticing his vehicle. Upon registration check of the vehicle, the registration displayed was not on file. Seth exited the vehicle and began walking away. Investigator ordered Mr. Byrd back to his vehicle and detained him for officer safety. Investigator requested consent to conduct a search of his person in which he stated he had some "dope" in his pocket.

Investigator asked Mr. Byrd to specify, in which he stated he believed he had Cocaine in his right pants pocket. Investigator recovered the narcotics, which was approximately 1.14 grams of a crystal-like substance which did test positive for

Methamphetamine. TruNarc Scan#2064. Kali Russell was taken into custody for the active warrants. It was determined Seth Byrd did commit the offenses of Possession of Meth, Misuse of Registra-

tion Plates, and Driving an unregistered vehicle.

Both subjects were transported to Loudon County Jail without incident.

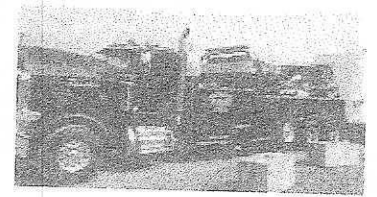

Christopher Guyton, 37, Bakertown Road Knoxville, was charged with, Man/Sell/Del/Re-sale Sch. I & II, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Misuse of Evidence of Registration.

Deputy Harrison LCSO, observed a white Nissan Altima on Pond Creek Road bearing the wrong registration plate. Deputy conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle On Mcrary Street. Upon contact with the driver, Christopher Guyton, he stated he did not have the vehicle registered in his name and the tag on the vehicle belonged to another vehicle. While the passenger was attempting to locate information on the vehicle, Deputy had Guyton exit and step back to the front of his patrol vehicle. While speaking with Guyton, He stated he was currently on probation out of Knox County for possession charges. Based on his probation, Deputy asked if there was anything illegal in the vehicle to which he stated "Not that I know of". Guyton denied a consent search of the vehicle. Deputy removed the front seat passenger, and spoke

with her further. The female stated there was approximately 1 gram of marijuana in her purse.

While waiting for an additional unit to arrive Guyton began to profusely sweat. Once Deputy Curtis arrived, Deputy began a probable cause search of the vehicle. While conducting the search, Loudon County Dispatch advised Guyton had eight active warrants out of Knox County and two out of Roane County.

Located behind the driver seat in a homemade magnetic box, Deputy located 3 black zip pouches along with a scale. Inside the first bag were unused small clear baggies. The second bag contained two separate bags of meth totaling approximately 4.88 grams. The third bag contained 9 bags with approximately 18 grams of heroin. Inside a green tactical bag belonging to the driver, Deputy located 3 fentanyl test strips typically used to test narcotics. Liquid Narcan and nasal Narcan were also found in the vehicle.

Both subjects were read Mi-

randa and questioned about the narcotics at which point Guyton claimed possession of the meth and heroin.

Inside the female Purse Deputy located approximately \$2207 folded up in mixed denominations. Coupled with the large amount of narcotics in the vehicle individually bagged for resale, the currency is consistent with the sale and delivery of narcotics.

Narcotics investigator Green arrived and spoke with the passenger. When the female was

asked about the currency in her purse she stated Guyton asked her to hold on to it for him earlier in the day and denied her ownership of the money. Based on the above facts, Guyton was placed in custody for active warrants and narcotics.

The female was released on the scene. Malones arrived and towed the vehicle. Narcotics later conducted TruNarc tests on the substances resulting in positive tests for meth and heroin. This did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

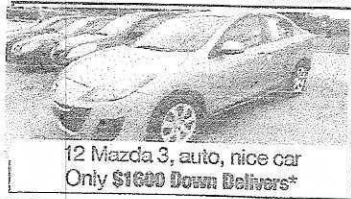

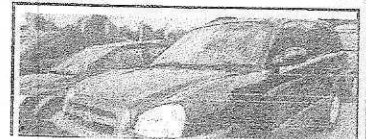

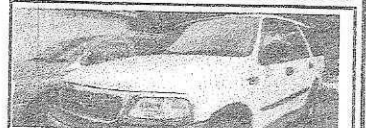

a four-and-a-half-year-old female who was visiting Couch's home. Also on the cellular phone were thousands of other images and videos of child pornography of unidentified children.

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the Knoxville Police Department, Internet Crimes Against Children Unit and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Homeland Security Investigations.

Assistant United States Attorney Jennifer Kolman represented the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood (PSC), a nationwide initiative launched in May 2006, by the Department of Justice to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse. Led by the United States Attorney's Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, PSC marshals federal, state, and local resources to locate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals who sexually exploit children, and to identify and rescue victims. 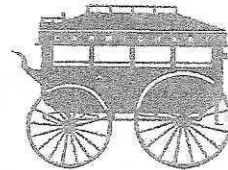
Jacob Hicks, 53, Houston Street Lenoir City, was charged with Public Intoxication.

Man Barricades Himself In

At 1:05 pm Lenoir City Police received a call of a domestic dispute on Bell Avenue. When they responded they met with a victim who had no life threatening injuries and heard a shot inside the residence. At that time the suspect retreated back into the home and a barricaded himself in and a second shot was heard. At that point a perimeter was set up and more units called in.

Members of the Lenoir City Police Department, Loudon County Sheriff's Department responded and Blount County SWAT Unit was contacted to assist. The BCSO responded to the scene and took over the inner perimeter and after some time were able to get the subject to give up. He retreated back into the residence in an aggressive manner and a flash bang grenade was used to subdue the suspect where he was taken into custody.

Former Department Of Energy Contractor Sentenced To 121 Months For Distributing And Possessing Child Pornography

The Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, United States District Judge for the Eastern District of Tennessee, sentenced David Bryon King, age 57, to serve 121 months in federal prison followed by a lifetime on supervised release for attempted distribution and possessing child pornography. During the time of the offense, King was a contractor working as a fire inspector for the Oak Ridge National Laboratory.

According to the filed plea agreement, King admitted that he distributed child pornography to others in 2022, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2522A(a)(2)(B), and possessed child pornography in 2021 and 2022, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2252A(a)(5)(B). King was identified as

making online payments to individuals believed to be selling child pornography. Agents with the Department of Energy Office of Inspector General interviewed King at his residence. During the interview, King admitted to being in possession of child pornography, specifically on his smartphone. Agents seized the device and obtained a federal search warrant to search the device. Forensic analyses of King's smartphone uncovered images and videos of child pornography and other evidence linking King to the attempted distribution of child pornography.

"Protecting children and holding perpetrators accountable is a top priority for the U.S. Attorney's Office and we will continue to work with our law enforcement partners to investigate and prosecute child exploitation cases," said United States Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III.

"I commend our agents and our partners at the Department of Justice and the U.S. Attorney's Office for investigating and prosecuting such heinous crimes against children," said Teri L. Donaldson, Inspector General for the Department of Energy. "Our investigators will continue doing everything they can to identify and investigate instances of child exploitation within the Department. Crimes against children have absolutely no place anywhere, and we will continue working with the Department of Justice and U.S. Attorney's Offices around the country to investigate and prosecute the offenders."

The case was investigated by the Department of Energy Office of Inspector General.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Jennifer Kolman represented the United States.

(2) (B) Sixty (60) days from the date the creditor received an actual copy of the notice to creditors if the creditor received the copy of the notice less than sixty (60) days prior to the date that is four (4) months from the date of first publication (or posting) as described in (1) (A); or

(3) Twelve (12) months from the decedent's date of death.

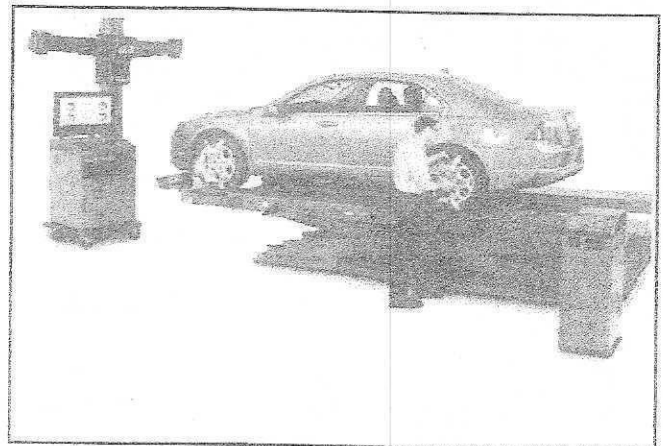
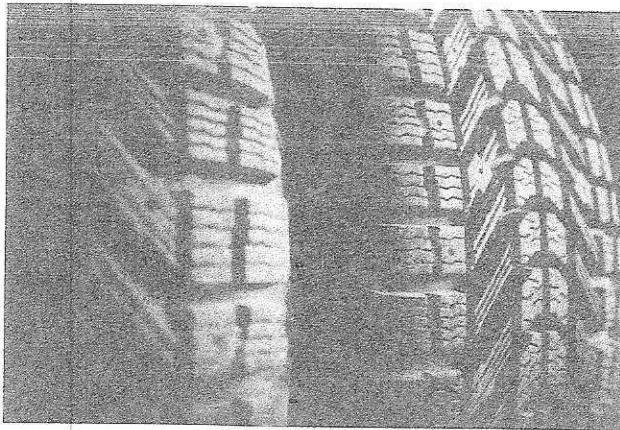
