Deputy A. Gann LCSO, was driving through the parking lot of the Sunoco gas station on West Lee Highway across from the Sunrise Inn in Philadelphia when Deputy observed an odor of marijuana coming from a black Volkswagen parked at the gas station. Deputy made contact with the driver of the

vehicle, Mr. Michael Cook, to conduct an investigation into the smell of marijuana. Mr. Cook informed me marijuana was on his person as well as inside his vehicle. At this time, a male who was the passenger of the vehicle, came outside of the store and Deputy made contact with him. Both Mr. Cook and the passenger gave consent to search them and the car and stated they were aware of the marijuana inside the car. Deputy Parks arrived on the scene and assisted me in searching the vehicle as well as a search of both Mr. Cook and passenger. During the search of Mr. Cook, Mr. Cook attempted to pull his pocket knife out of his pocket in a fast manner placing Deputy J. Parks in fear of serious bodily injury. Deputy Parks quickly detained Mr. Cook due to his actions. After finishing the search of Mr. Cook, 1.2 grams of a clear crystal-like substance, believed to be methamphetamine was found on Mr. Cook's person. During a search of the vehicle Mr. Cook was driving, 7.0 grams of a green leafy substance, believed

to be marijuana was found in the vehicle. A loaded firearm was found in the vehicle in the driver seat floorboard. After being transported to the Loudon County Jail, a blue pipe with a white powdery residue inside of it was found on Mr. Cook's person during the search inside the Loudon County Jail. A narcotics Investigator was called and tested the clear crystal-like substance which tested positive for methamphetamine.

Kristopher Prierce,28, Steekee Road Loudon, was charged with Aggravated Assault, and Driving on Revoked License.

Deputy Jackson LCSO, responded to Highway 11 E on a report of vandalism. Upon arrival, Deputy was met by the victim, who was visibly shaken. Deputy asked the victim to tell him what happened, and she began to describe that Kristopher Pierce, the offender, was arguing with his mother at Children's Hospital. After they left Children's, the victim returned to her mother's address, and Mr. Pierce left to pick up his car. She stated that he returned around 8 pm after she asked him to retrieve some belongings from his car. She further stated that their initial interaction was peaceful, however, it became heated and Mr. Pierce grabbed a metal pipe. He punched the radio breaking the screen, hit her car multiple times and according to the victim, attempted to strike her with the

pipe, but she moved and was pushed to the ground. She described a downward motion when Deputy asked how he attempted to hit her. She told Deputy that she believes he would have hit her with the pipe, and he told her earlier in the altercation that he would beat her with it. Deputy spoke with the victim's mother, and she described similar events; the victim and offender were outside, and Mr. Pierce picked up a metal pipe and struck the victim's car, and pushed her to the ground. Mr. Pierce was gone from the scene on Deputies arrival. The victim was explained her options, as far as, pursuing charges for vandalism and obtaining an Order of Protection. However, due to the totality of the circumstances, Mr. Pierce attempted to use a weapon to hit the victim, and his actions placed her in imminent fear of bodily injury; Deputy is charging him with Aggravated Assault (Domestic). This occurred in Loudon County, TN.
