Jody Fawley, 55, Brittany Lane Lenoir City, was charged with, Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic. Poss. Of Drug Para, and Mfg/ Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth.

Sgt. Rogers LCSO. observed a dark older model Ford truck in the right turn lane on Hwy 70 at the intersection of Hwy 321. While at the intersection the driver then traveled from the farright lane to the far-left lane and turned left onto Hwy 321. Deputy initiated a traffic stop in the area of Williams Ferry Rd and Echo Hollow

Rd. While exiting his vehicle Deputy noted the driver was being very suspicious by fully turning around in his seat attempting to see me approach. Deputy then gave the driver verbal commands to exit his vehicle and walk back towards the patrol unit. The driver, Mr. Jody Fawley did so, but kept his distance and stated Deputy could not pat him down. ing a silver pill container that held 4.0 grams of meth. Mr. Fawley stated the meth was his friend's and that he was taking it to him. Deputy also recovered a narcotics scale in Mr. Fawley's shirt pocket. Mr. Fawley was transported to the Loudon County Jail and charged with Manufacture of Meth, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic.



Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was conducting a patrol in the area of Highway 321 near Interstate 75 in Lenoir City, TN. During patrol duties Officer observed

a gray in color Nissan sedan traveling south on Highway 321. While observing the vehicle Officer noticed that the driver was not wearing a seatbelt while operating the motor vehicle on a public roadway. As the Officer was approaching the Nissan sedan in his marked police cruiser to attempt a traffic stop the Nissan sedan made an abrupt turn from standstill traffic on Highway 321 to the parking lot of Buddy's BBO in Lenoir City where the Officer then conducted a traffic stop.

Upon the Officer approach to the vehicle, he noticed a strong odor of raw marijuana emitting from the inside of the vehicle. The Officer was then able to make contact with the only occupant of the vehicle, Mauricio Kanneh, who was the driver and registered owner. While speaking with KANNEH in regards to the traffic stop the Officer noticed that he was sweating profusely and was visibly shaking in all of his extremities.

KANNEH stated during the traffic stop that he was currently on state probation out of Anderson County, TN for a marijuana charge where he stated that he was caught with a half-pound of marijuana. Officer then asked KANNEH to step out of the vehicle to speak with him about a citation. During that time an assisting officer arrived on scene where the Officer explained to KANNEH that he noticed a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the inside of his vehicle and that a probable cause search would be conducted of the entire vehicle.
