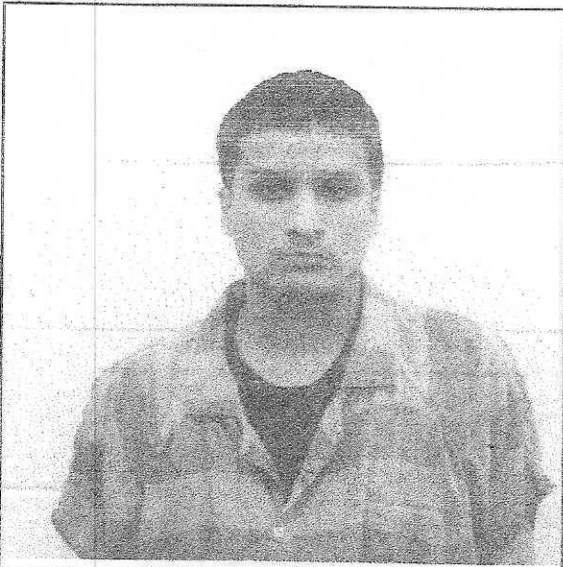

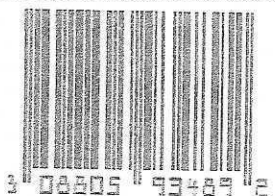

### Drugs

Brandy Baker, 45, Browder Hollow Road Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession.

Jonathan Morgan, 34, Browder Hollow Road Lenoir City, was charged with, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, Man/Sell/Del/Re-sale Sch. I, and Contraband in a Penal Institution.

Sgt. Espinoza LCPD, was notified of two suspicious individuals in the Landmark Storage structure. Upon entrance, Officer observed a white male and female later identified as Jonathan Morgan and Brandy Baker. Mrs. Baker was resting in the passenger seat of a white F-150 (TN110BKBL) while Mr. Morgan was inside storage unit #33C. Officer explained the reason for his arrival and through the encounter Officer asked both subjects if

they had any type of identification in which BAKER and MORGAN presented two TN ID's. Officer asked central dispatch to verify both subjects for active warrants while he continued his investigation. Throughout the field interview BAKER gave verbal consent to examine his person as well as the F-150. During the search of BAKERS person, Officer uncovered approximately two grams of a crystal-like substance believed to be Methamphetamine, and approximately one gram of a gray powdery substance believed to be Heroin. In addition, during the vehicle search, Officer also encountered seventeen Klonopin pills. The drugs were found inside BAKER'S purse which was placed on the passenger seat of the pickup truck. Furthermore, MORGAN was questioned if there

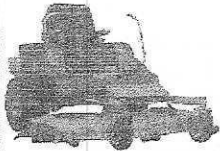

All the above occurred in Lenoir City, TN.

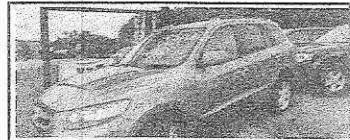

were any additional narcotics within the storage building. Shortly after, MORGAN informed us there were more narcotics inside the storage area. Thus, MORGAN gave verbal consent to search unit #33C. Subsequently, Officer retrieved an additional five grams of the same crystal-like substance believed to be Methamphetamine. Ultimately, Brandy Baker and Jonathan Morgan were placed into custody and moved to the Loudon County Jail with no

occurrence. Deputy Holmes LCSO, was informed LCPD, Sgt. C. Espinoza , was bringing 1 male and 1 female into the sally port of the facility. Upon arrival to the sally port Deputy asked arrestee Jonathan Morgan, 2 times, that if he had any drugs or illegal contraband on him, to let Deputy know before we entered the facility. Inmate Morgan told him that he did not have anything on him. While Deputy was conducting a frisk search he located 3 syringes in his left inside jacket pocket. Upon closer investigation Deputy noticed a cloudy liquid substance in 2 of the syringes. Deputy then asked Morgan what the substance was to which he stated, "Fentanyl". Deputy charged Jonathan Morgan with 39-16-201 contraband in penal institution. This did occur within the Loudon County Detention Facility, Loudon County, TN.
