



carrying on with their lawful activities. While speaking to Mr. Price it appeared he was causing a public annovance to all the parties inside the establishment.


Mr. Price was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

were any additional narcotics within the storage building. Shortly after, MORGAN informed us there were more narcotics inside the storage area. Thus, MORGAN gave verbal consent to search unit #33C. Subsequently, Officer retrieved an additional five grams of the same crystal-like substance believed to be Methamphetamine. Ultimately, Brandy Baker and Jonathan Morgan were placed into custody and moved to the Loudon County Jail with no




