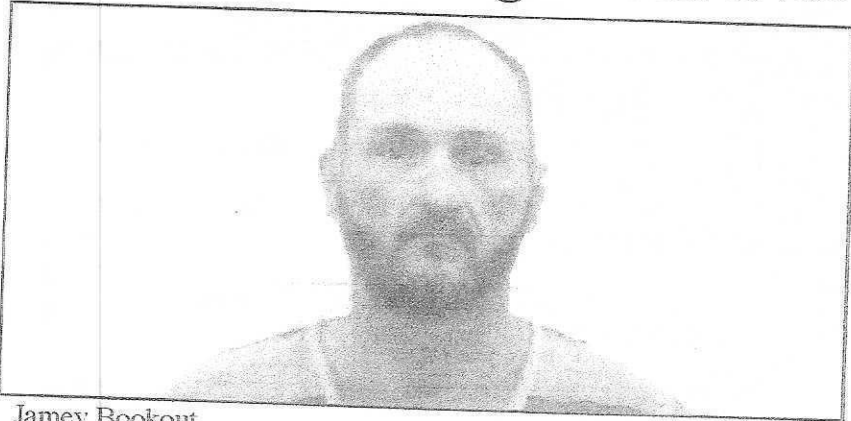

Missing or Murdered Indigenous Persons *FBI supports initiative to close gaps, generate leads at tribal community event in Arizona*

Monica Martinez knew something was wrong when her little brother Hector didn't call.

The siblings had always been close—from childhood on the Salt River Pima Maricopa Indian Community near Phoenix, through Hector's rambunctious teen years, and into his troubled adulthood spent in and out of jail.

"He always made sure he called, no matter what," she said. "He could be out having a blast at a party at three

in the morning, and he would still call me. He wrote to me all the time when he was in jail. So, when he went missing, and we didn't hear from him, that was really hard."

Hector Martinez was 32 years old when he got on a bus 14 years ago in Mesa, Arizona, and disappeared, joining a roster of thousands of American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) individuals who have since been categorized as Missing or Murdered Indigenous Persons (MMIP).

In recent years, federal agencies with legal authority on Native American lands—such as the FBI and the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Indian Affairs—have redoubled efforts to work with local and tribal agencies to solve MMIP cases. Last year, the Department of Justice made addressing the disproportionately high rates of violence that Native Americans experience—and the large number of Indigenous persons who

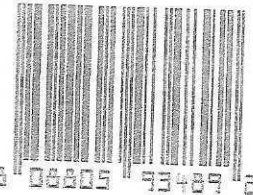

Jamey Bookout, 41, Jackson Ferry Road Greenback, was charged with, Aggravated Assault, and Child Endangerment.

Deputy R. Fleming LCSO, was dispatched to Laura Ln for a domestic. Upon arrival, Deputy made contact with the victim who was very visibly shaken up and crying, and victim boyfriend and witness. During investigation, victim advised Deputy that her husband Mr. Jamey Bookout/Offender who she is separated with, drove to the residence to visit with their three-year-old son. The victim advised that Mr. Bookout bent down to hug their son and he picked him up and ran to the car setting the juvenile on his lap. The victim tried to reach in the driver's side window to pull her son out of the vehicle but

Mr. Bookout stepped on the gas to drive away and she fell to the ground. The victim had visible scratches and marks on her left and right elbow from him driving off while her arms were in the vehicle. Mr. Bookout then had to turn around in a neighbor's driveway to leave the street. As the Offender was driving off the victim had to jump out of the way of the moving vehicle so she wouldn't get hit. Mr. Bookout did this all while still having his son in his lap not secured in a children's car seat. Further in Deputy investigation, He went next door to the neighbor and they confirmed that victim did have to jump out of the way from the accelerating car so she wouldn't get hit. Deputy G. Pendleton, and Deputy L. Hawkins conducted a traffic stop on Mr. Bookout in Lenoir City at the Traditions Barber Shop. He was placed

into custody for Aggravated Domestic Assault and Child Endangerment. Deputy transported Mr. Bookout to the Loudon County Jail with

no further incident. There was a Department of Child Services referral made as well. All the above occurred in Loudon County, TN.

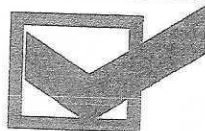

Brandin Gage, 37, Forrester Road Lenoir City, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch, II, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Contraband in Penal Institution.

Officer Law LCPD, was on routine patrol when the officer observed a Black Nissan Altima (TN Tag BCP-9345) exited the Krystals parking lot and turn right onto Highway 321, Officer was familiar with the vehicle and was aware the owner of the vehicle was suspended. Officer then conducted a traffic stop at Benjamin Drive and identified the driver to be Brandin Gage. Officer was familiar with the female and was aware she had a suspended driver's license due to two prior traffic stops. Officer then placed Ms. Gage under arrest and transported her to the Loudon County Jail. Deputy Starnes with the LCSO did a non-evasive

search of Ms. Gage's person and located approximately 50 grams of a white crystal-like substance believed to be Methamphetamine. Ms. Gage did have in possession approximately 50 grams of Methamphetamine while in the custody of the Lenoir City Police Department. All the above occurred in Lenoir City, TN.

Deputy Starnes LCSO, made contact with inmate Brandin Gage in the Sallyport. Deputy asked Inmate Gage if she had anything illegal in her possession or on her person before we stepped into the pat down area. Inmate Gage said no. Once in the pat down area Deputy asked her again if she had anything in her pockets or on her that the Deputy needed to know before she conducted the search. Inmate Gage then stated she had money in her underwear. Deputy then conducted a pat down search and had her step into

change out room for a non invasive strip search. At that time Deputy noticed her pull out a bag with a white crystal substance as well as a small bag of brown paper squares and a receipt with cash folded up. Deputy then handed over the contraband to SGT McCall in order to complete the process. SGT McCall then secured the contraband and contacted narcotics investigator LT Ezell. LT Ezell responded to the jail and retrieved said contraband for

testing and weight. TruNarc Scan 2116 tested positive for 37.7 grams of methamphetamine, scan 2117 tested positive for 5.3 grams of methamphetamine, scan 2118 tested positive for 0.3 grams of cocaine, and the soaked paper squares was LSD. Deputy is charging Brandin Marie Gage with T.C.A. 39-16-201 Contraband in a Penal Institution. This did occur within the Loudon County Detention Center, Loudon County, TN.

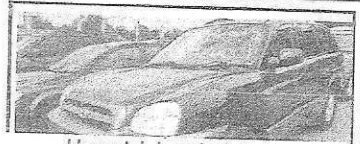

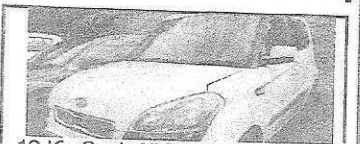

are reported missing—a priority.

For Monica Martinez, that was all far-off background noise until a victim specialist from the FBI's Phoenix Field Office called her this spring. The Bureau was holding a Missing Person Identification Project (MPIP) event with local agencies and the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs). The victim specialist, Maricela Savalas, wanted to know if Martinez and her family could attend. It would be a chance for the Martinez family to meet directly with federal and local investigators in their community to get updates on cases or provide leads. It would also let them meet with local advocates and service providers.

Federal law requires victims of crimes like murder, child and adult sexual abuse, kidnapping, and violent felony assaults receive resources and support. For the FBI, that role belongs to the Victim Services Division (VSD) and its victim specialists.

The Identification Project grew out of a recognition that there are large gaps in data about MMIP for agencies to work with, according to FBI Phoenix Victim

Specialist Kathleen Lawler, who developed the project in 2022. She has held events in the White Mountain Apache and San Carlos Apache tribal communities east of Phoenix. She said the victim-centered, coordinated events aim to gather accurate data so everyone can work off the same information. Families can create police reports, meet investigators, and provide DNA samples that could help their cases. The events also reassure families of victims that they haven't been forgotten.

"Most importantly, families who have felt like no one cares—who have felt unseen and unheard—have been able to have a voice," Lawler said.

The most recent event was held March 1 in a former high school on the Salt River Pima Maricopa Indian Community's tribal lands to make it accessible to as many people as possible. People were already waiting at the door when the four-hour open house began. Savalas organized the event. She said that while the FBI doesn't have the authority to investigate missing persons cases like Hector's, it frequently hears from families asking for updates about missing relatives.



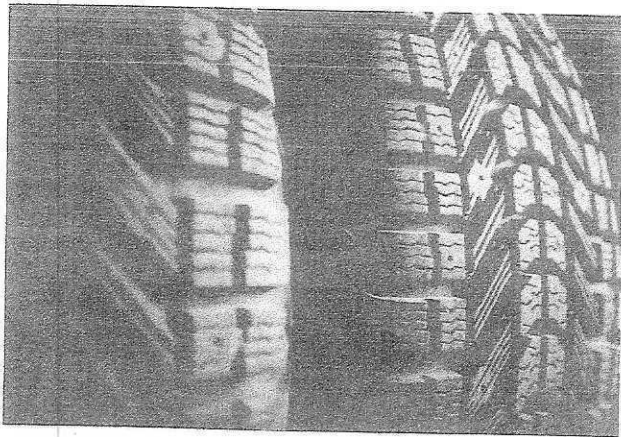
