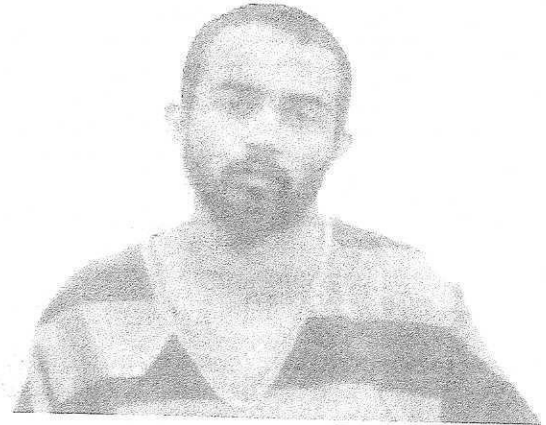

Former Gibson County Recovery Court Coordinator Indicted

Monica Bridges Improperly Paid for Hours Not Worked

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Monica Bridges, who served as the full-time coordinator of the Gibson County Recovery Court from October 2019 until her resignation in September 2022.

The Gibson County Recovery Court allows non-violent offenders with substance abuse issues to

obtain treatment while under close legal and clinical supervision. The investigation began after citizens reported questionable time-reporting practices and other concerns about the court's operations.

Investigators determined that Bridges received at least \$25,425.25 in improper wages and payroll benefits. This includes at least \$20,760.22 in unearned compensa-

tion for 1,156.24 hours she did not work; \$1,665.04 in prorated matching benefits and payments for Medicare and Social Security costs incurred by the county; and \$2,999.99 in supplemental pay that she did not earn.

Bridges was able to conceal the fact that she was not working her full-time hours by using the former General Sessions Judge's signa-

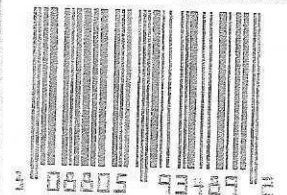

Jacob Sharp, 29, Depew Drive Loudon, was charged with DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Officer Padgett LPD, observed a blue Ford Escape tag number(413BFFS) run the red light at Hwy 72 @ Steekee Road almost hitting the front end of his marked Patrol vehicle. Officer then activated his Emergency equipment on the Patrol vehicle and attempted to stop the vehicle just passed Steekee road on Hwy 72 East, the vehicle then continued on driving for at or about 100 yards at a very low speed then finally turned left onto Pear Tree Lane and came to a stop. 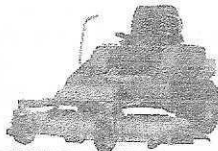
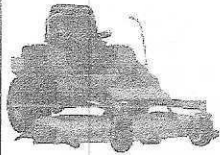

Darrien Farley, 24, E Lee Highway Loudon, was charged with Aggravated Cruelty to Animals, and Aggravated Assault.

Deputies with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office responded to E Lee Hwy in response to an armed person. When Deputies arrived they were approached by the victims owners of the property. Victim 1 informed Deputies that his son Darrien Farley was in the basement armed with a knife and a Maul.

Victim 1 stated that he and victim 2 heard two very loud bangs and when they went to see what the noise was they noticed a very large streak of blood across the kitchen towards the basement door and

blood on the basement door handle.

Luis Almanza, 29, Vale Street Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault, and Reckless Endangerment x2.

Officer Ingram LPD, was dispatched to Vale St. for an open 911 line with a woman crying on the line. Upon arrival Officer made contact with victim who was crying and upset. She advised me she wanted her boyfriend Luis Almanza to leave the residence after a physical altercation. She advised these sequence of events: Her, her boyfriend Luis, and their 2 young children were on their way to Walmart when they began arguing about money problems, he began driving the vehicle recklessly and grabbed her by her hair causing her scalp to bleed. They went back to the residence and she asked Luis numerous times to leave the

residence and he refused. Officer found him sitting in the front seat of her black Chevy HHR in the driveway. All he advised was that they had been arguing about money and they went back to the residence.

Her 2 children are 1 (Girl) and 3 (Boy). Mr. Almanza was placed into custody for Domestic Assault and 2 counts of Reckless Endangerment. He was transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident, however, when he arrived to the jail an altercation ensued because he did not want to strip down for the correctional officers. Officer did call for EMS to check on Mr. Almanza after their interaction and he refused medical treatment. LCSD has a separate report for the altercation. The events of the original call did occur in the city of Loudon.

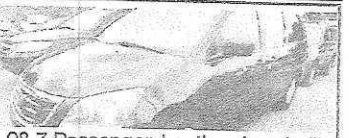

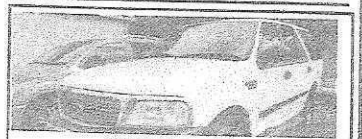

 ture stamp on her timesheets to make it appear as if he had reviewed and approved them.

Investigators also question the purchase of 155 gift cards, valued at \$25 each, by the Recovery Court. These gift cards were intended to incentivize participants and reward them upon graduation from the program. However, due to a lack of documentation, investigators could not substantiate that all the gift cards were used for their intended purpose.

Bridges admitted to investigators that she was overpaid for not working full-time hours, and that she used gift cards to make personal purchases, but claimed it was not intentional.

The investigation also notes the Recovery Court's former clinical treatment director improperly referred participants to a business she personally owned in order to receive outpatient treatment. Participants told investigators that they

were led to believe that the treatment director's business was their only option. The former clinical director resigned on August 31, 2022.

Based upon this investigation, in May 2023, the Gibson County Grand Jury indicted Monica Bridges on one count of theft of property over \$10,000, one count of official misconduct, one count of forgery over \$10,000, and one count of criminal simulation over \$10,000.

"The management of the Recovery Court must ensure it provides adequate oversight over its payroll operations, gift card use, and conflict of interest practices," said Comptroller Mumpower. "Additionally, signature stamps should always be kept in a secure location, and there must be clear policies about their use to reduce the risk of unauthorized activity." 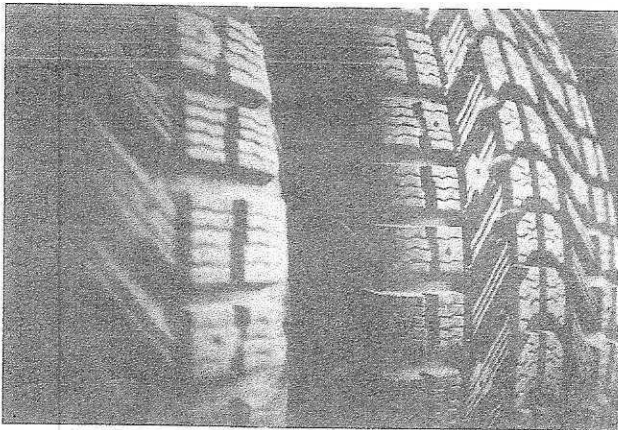
